

MINUTES OF 60TH ANNUAL GENERAL BODY 2021 MEETING OF EQUESTRIAN
FEDERATION OF INDIA HELD ON 27TH MAR 2022 AT DEFENCE SERVICES
OFFICERS' INSTITUTE, DHAULA KUAN, NEW DELHI

1. The 60th Annual General Body Meeting 2021 of Equestrian Federation of India was held on 27th Mar 2022 at Defence Services Officers' Institute, Dhaula Kuan, New Delhi. The meeting was attended by 119 members.
2. Dr SY Quraishi, learned Observer appointed by the Hon'ble High Court, Delhi was also present at the AGM 2021.
3. In terms of provisions as contained in Para 7 of Article 017, Chapter VI, EFI Statutes, the Secretary General informed the house that Mr Harish Khokhar, Vice President (Finance) shall chair the meeting as per EC's decision taken during meeting held on 24 Mar 2022. The house approved the proposal. The Secretary General requested the nominated chair to address the house.
4. **Opening address by the nominated Chair:-** Mr Harish Khokhar, the nominated Chair greeted and welcomed everyone for taking time out from their busy schedule to come and attend the 60th Annual General Body Meeting 2021 of the Federation. He requested all members to adhere with the agenda points and maintain decorum of the house. He further requested that whatever observation/queries the members may have, will be addressed after finishing the agendas. He clarified that there is a every possibility during the course of presentation that members might find their questions have already been answered. Thereafter, he handed over the proceedings to the Secretary General.
5. **Tribute to Col Gulam Mohammad Khan, VSM (Retd) – 1946-2021 on his demise:-** - The house observed a two minutes silence to offer their respect to the departed soul of Col Gulam Mohammad Khan, VSM (Retd) who passed away on 01 May 2021. A monumental loss for the sporting fraternity, as he was a leading light of Equestrian Sport. He was a member of the gold medal winning 'Three Day Event' Team at the 1982 Asian Games in Delhi and also an Individual Silver medal recipient for Eventing at the 1982 Asian Games. At the next Asian Games, in Seoul in 1986, he was a member of the Dressage and the Eventing Teams, wherein he secured bronze medals in both teams and gaining the highest place for any Indian rider. He was adjudged National Champion (Best Rider) in National Equestrian Championship in 1981, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1988. He was a National Coach and also served as an international FEI judge in Eventing, Show Jumping and Dressage. In 1984 he was bestowed with India's prestigious Arjuna Award, for his outstanding performance in Equestrian Sports. His contribution to Equestrian Sports would be cherished forever. He would be remembered as a sporting hero of the country. Our thoughts and prayers are with his family during this difficult time and we pray for his soul to rest in peace.

The Secretary General also informed the house that the suggestion made by the Inquiry Committee will be acted upon in due course of time as decided by EC.

The Secretary General clarified that the EC of EFI is of the opinion that since Rajasthan Equestrian Association (REA) had filed a Writ Petition in Hon'ble High Court of Delhi on the subject matter, the Inquiry Committee's report will be handed over to the Hon'ble Court if asked for and based on his/her decision it may or may not be put up on EFI Website. However, all



disciplinary actions pertaining to the incident have been taken by EFI.

<p>6.14 Hiring of PR Agency. The Secretary General informed the house that EFI was raised in 1967 when the sport was not very popular and little public awareness was available. However, the EC decided to hire an agency to educate the environment in all facets of Equestrian Sport. The Secretary General further informed the house that based on the approval of EC, the EFI has hired Fortuna Public Relations Private Limited for providing the public relations support towards equestrian activities for a period of one year starting from 01 Oct 2021 to 30 Sep 2022 @ INR 2,00,000/- (Rs two lakh only) + GST (or any other taxes as may get levied) per month. This includes the cost of PR. Fortuna PR will drive conventional PR & Digital activities from Delhi. This fee will also cover activities in Mumbai, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Ahmadabad, Bangalore and Chennai where Fortuna PR has offices. 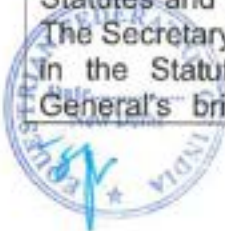

meeting held on 24 Mar 2022. The Secretary General requested the house to go through the amendments and all their questions/suggestion shall be answered. The Secretary General explained the format of the same flashed on the screen.

Col SS Ahlawat clarified that draft was put on website for comments from the environment.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod and Col AK Yadav asked if it is part of the agenda. The Secretary General clarified it is being covered in Secretary General's briefing.

Mr Kevic Setalvad while appreciating the efforts put in by Executive Committee in carrying out the amendments objected to the amendments of Statutes. He further stated that a few other members present in the house feel the same way. He said he was very happy to see codes of conduct of all categories since it was much required. The Secretary General requested Mr Kevic Setalvad that his point shall be put to note in the house. His views on the code of conduct that be taken at the end which the Chairman too had requested in his opening address. Mr Kevic Setalvad said this is his personal opinion on the issue and he is not with any party or individuals present.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod of Rajasthan Equestrian Association (REA) questioned that why this is being slipped in?

Col Rajesh Pattu said that he had written to the Federation that the Secretary General's report should also be accompanied with the AGM Notice and he received a reply from EFI that since it is a voluminous document and shall run into many pages it cannot be done.

Col AK Yadav said that he is objecting the amendments of Statutes.

Col SS Solanki, Maj Gen Sameer Lanba, Mr Kirat Nagra, Mr Abhishek Chopra and many others said we should continue with proposed amendments.

The Secretary General requested Col AK Yadav and few others to please analyze the amendments and their questions shall be answered.



Col SS Solanki clarified that we should go through it and the house can take a call at the end with permission of Chair.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod suggested that matter is sub-judice and should not be taken up.

Mr Amitjeet Singh said that like Nepal case is sub-judice even this should not be taken up.

At this juncture majority of the members suggested to move on with the amendments of Statutes of EFI.

The Secretary General also informed the house that EC Members have also amended the Election Bye Laws as per the Sports Code and waiver received from MYAS thereof.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod said that EFI has been getting waiver since last 15 years and suggested that the NF should make State Association.

The house overruled the objections raised by Mr RS Dundlod, Col Rajesh Pattu, Mr Kevic Setalvad and Mr Amitjeet Singh Narang of REA on amendments of Statutes and Elections Bye Laws.

AGENDA – III

AUDITED STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

7. **Passing of Audited Statement of Accounts for the Financial Year 2020-21.** The Secretary General flashed the audited statement of accounts (Income & expdr) for the Financial Year 2020-21 as per AGM Notice before the house. The Secretary General requested the house to propose for passing and another member to second it.

Col Rajesh Pattu raised a question that Federation received fee for NOC from outside agency and wanted to know which is this Agency? Joint Secretary replied that the NF issues NOC to Athletes who pay the NOC fee. Col Rajesh Pattu tried to intervene by saying that he is aware. Joint Secretary requested Col Rajesh Pattu that since he has asked a question, he should let him reply. Col SS Solanki also suggested to Col Rajesh Pattu to let the Joint Secretary answer his question. Joint Secretary clarified that there are many Stables in West Asian Countries who sponsor Indian Riders to participate in FEI

The accounts were passed after being proposed and seconded by Maj Gen Sameer Lanba, VSM and Lt Col KDS Malik respectively.

Endurance events. These Stables are applying for NOC and they are the outside Agency.

Col Rajesh Pattu came to the podium since his mike was not working.

Maj Ashish Malik objected that he cannot ask question like that and we should carry on with the agenda which was supported by many members.

Joint Secretary clarified to the house that he is asking question as to which is the outside agency from where NOC fee has been received. He clarified that these are stables which support Indian athletes to participate in FEI CEI events in middle east countries.

Col Sarpartap Singh asked Joint Secretary that he had said these are stables. Joint Secretary clarified that clubs are called stables in these countries.

Col Rajesh Pattu again raised the same question that why is EFI taking money from Indian Riders for participation at international competition and represent India.

Joint Secretary replied that it is a policy decision taken in 2008 when Col Sarpartap Singh was Secy Gen, Col Rajesh Pattu was Joint Secy (Tech) and Mr RS Dundlod was Member West. The fee initially was 150 dollars which was revised in 2014 during AGM to 250 USD per NOC.

Col Rajesh Pattu alleged that this is the only Federation in the Country which is charging Rider for participating for their country.

Joint Secretary clarified to Col Rajesh Pattu that these individuals are not participating for the county but in individual capacity as per FEI norms and these competitions are not representing India.

Some members of the house requested Col Rajesh Pattu and Mr RS Dundlod to sit down and not to repeat the same question in order to save time.

Mr Dundlod said that he wants to know that since most of the groom working in middle east are from Rajasthan, 90% of NOC fee received by EFI is paid by these Shaikh's stables, who make them participate in FEI CEI's. He said that he has photos of these grooms who write India on their T-Shirts, hold Indian flags and are participating in championships.

Mr Dundlod said that his next question was that he wanted to know if they do not represent India then why



are they exhibiting that they are representing India. He said he is now talking about Endurance. You have made such strict rule of Endurance that for upgradation you have to start with 40 to 60 to 80 to 120 Km where do we have the requisite number of competitions in India? He questioned that if he pays 500 dollars and he too can participate in such competitions.

Joint secretary replied that to represent India, any individual/team has to be selected by selection Committee and EC. Mr RS Dundload and Col Rajesh Pattu tried to interrupt, Joint Secretary requested them to please let him finish. He further said that this point was also clarified to them in the last AGM and is being done again at the cost of repetitions. He further stated that any Individual/team representing India has to be selected by Selection Committee and EC of FEI.

He clarified that these individuals are not cleared by National Federation, Executive Committee and Selection Committee and hence not representing India. They are participating under Indian flag in individual capacity which is as per FEI rules and regulations. He repeated that they are not representing India.

Joint Secretary interrupted him and said that he is most welcome to give suggestions but he should not make allegations on the Federation's decisions/functioning.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod said that what he was asking is not an allegation but what is happening on ground at these events.

Most of the members of the house requested Mr RS Dundload and Col Rajesh Pattu, Col Ashok Kumar Yadav not to waste time of the house by raising same question repeatedly.

Joint Secretary clarified that Federation shall take his suggestion and may consider them on its merit.

Mr Gaurav Joshi informed the house that as a matter of fact, members present who were raising such irrational questions, do not know FEI Rules & regulations. He said that as per rules of FEI, it is mandatory to participate in 4 rides, 2 rides below 70km and 2 rides below 90km. Everyone who is participating in FEI 1 star whether in India or abroad, have to meet the QR. Not meeting the QR, a rider cannot participate in 1 star. Secondly, like we have in India, for Endurance National Championships and all India open, so the rider who are participating in these events are doing so for horses upgradation. He clarified that they are not representing



India in international competitions. The house applauded his reply.

Mr Deepak Singh of Friends Equestrian Indigenous Sports Society, Noida clarified the issue of NOC fee charged by EFI. He introduced himself as a national shooter and informed the house that many Federations are charging fee for various purposes from athletes so the contention of Mr Dundload and Col Rajesh Pattu are incorrect. In shooting Federation, he said that they participate in Individual capacity in an international tournament wherein they are not representing India but in their personal capacity so as to promote the sport and gain international experience. He confirmed, they pay a fee as stipulated by their Federation and participate in other countries in international events as individuals.

The house applauded the answer.

Mr Raghuendra Singh Dundload wanted to comment but most of the members present objected to his statement and requested Secy General to move on to the next agenda.

AGENDA – IV

PROPOSED BUDGET: 2021-22

8. **Approval of Proposed Annual Expenditure for Financial Year 2021-22.** The Secretary General flashed the proposed expenditure for the year 2021-22 before the house which is attached at Appendix P.

Mr Dundload, Col Rajesh Pattu, Mr Amitjeet Singh Narang of REA tried to obstruct the proceedings. The Chair requested them to please maintain the decorum of the house and reconfirmed their questions will be taken at the end.

Col Rajesh Pattu raised the issue of a letter written by Dr ND Batra on NOC fee charged by EFI. The Chairman replied that his question has been addressed adequately by Mr Deepak Singh and Joint Secretary.

The proposed budget for FY 2021-22 were passed after being proposed and seconded by Maj Gen Sameer Lanba, VSM and Lt Col KDS Malik respectively.

AGENDA - VIPOINTS RECEIVED FROM MEMBERS

10. The Secy Gen informed the house that few mails were received from members which was put to EC in terms of EFI statues during meeting held on 24 Mar 2022. The EC after their due deliberation, decided that they do not need to put them as agenda point and shall be replied through mail. They have been replied accordingly.

11. Chairman requested the house to take up one question at a time for the benefit of all present.

12. **Mr Sandeep Sharma** stated that the Federation has made code of conducts for all and it was his personal request to form similar Code for EFI Secretariat who are required to be sensitive to the requirement of parents whose children are in Equestrian sports.

Chairman replied that since we are small federation, members should try to meet the office bearer and clarify their specific requirements which will be taken care if rules permit. He said the suggestion of Mr Sharma is however noted.

13. **Col Rajesh Pattu** raises another point pertaining to Nepal. He said he is aware that Secy Gen in his report has said case is sub- judice. He said he saw a video on PTV.org and we will not talk about it he agreed. But how can EFI give membership to the clubs, the matter is in court. He suggested that only State Associations should have voting rights as per NSDCI-2011 then why is the Federation granting membership to clubs/individuals.

Chairman asked him to please repeat this question. Col Rajesh Pattu asked his question again.

Secretary General clarified that the court has not stopped the functioning of EFI and MYAS has accorded EFI waiver which was flashed for information of the house.

14. **Mr. Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod** raised an observation that Secretary General intervened and requested him that since his association has filed a few



cases against the Federation, it will be prudent to reply once the cases are settled. Mr Amitjeet Singh of Rajasthan Equestrian Association said that in the last AGM Nepal team question was raised by him. Now why the inquiry report has not been put up on website of EFI as he felt that the report should be put up on website so that everybody can see it.

Most of the members objected to it.

His 2nd point was amendments to Statutes were made to comply with sports code and then why is the EFI granting membership to individuals/clubs.

Mr Amitjeet Singh of Rajasthan Equestrian Association said if federation continues to have clubs as their members how can the State Association achieve growth at grass root level.

Joint Secretary replied that his first question was pertaining to Inquiry report which the National Federation shall consider in due course and his point is noted.

Joint Secretary clarified the second question that granting membership to clubs and individual is as per provision in NSCDI-2011. He requested Mr Amitjeet Singh to please read the sports code and he will get his answer. He further clarified regarding their voting rights waiver has been given by the Ministry and that is how voting rights have been given to clubs / institution.

Mr Amitjeet Singh of Rajasthan Equestrian Association said he has read the sports code Clubs should be members of states and states only of NF.

Joint Secretary replied that what he was suggesting is more pertinent to main stream sports but for equestrian it is not possible which is the reason waiver has been granted by Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

Mr Amitjeet Singh of Rajasthan Equestrian Association said waiver is not permanent.

Joint Secretary clarified that yes, it is not permanent but once the States have 50% District Associations the parameters will change.

15. **Col AK Yadav** said that after Secretary General report observation of members will be answered. He raised some anomalies in conduct of an Endurance event at Jaipur. Secondly, he said that Rajasthan government has introduced jobs & cash incentive for national medal winner. He saw a result sheets of that event and noticed



timings was wrongly entered. He claimed that he has been judging Endurance events for last 20 years and young judges like Mr Ajay Nancy, Mr Nirav Patil, Mr Gaurav Joshi & Col CS Sohal have been appointed to judge event and he has not been given opportunity. He alleged these young judges do not have practical knowledge and are not capable to judge.

Secretary General replied to him that his mail was replied upon as per EFI Statutes on the direction of EC. Secretary General requested him to forward his specific points to EFI. Col Ashok Kumar Yadav started shouting and Secretary General asked him to please calm down.

16. **HC Suresh Kumar** said that he is a member of Athletes Commission and has represented India in ITPF competitions on five occasions. He informed the house that he is doing everything to promote the sports and his son is also trying to do the same. His son represented Nepal team in the world cup qualifier held last year in India. He made a mistake. He accepted it but some members present in this house have been publishing the issue in News / Media to accomplish their personal agendas only. What is their personal interest he questioned. Why are they doing this? The house appreciated his statement. He clarified that his son has accepted the EFI's punishment rendered to the athletes. Now do these members want these riders to be hanged? He gave an example that a fire in others house is good but when there is fire in your own house then one gets to know the consequence and does not feel good. He further stated that before this incident no one bothered about Tent Pegging. Tent Pegging was not a sought after/popular discipline. Now that this discipline has one Arjuna Award and is growing and everyone is talking about it. He requested that some members with vested interest who are not interested in the growth and development of the discipline/EFI are trying to bring the discipline down and also portray the federation in a bad light. He suggested there was a need to build Tent Pegging Riders. In last many years he has been encouraging Tent Pegging Riders. He said he, in order to improve the status of Tent Pegging, in the last NEC provided refreshments to athletes and all support an athlete needs in an event. In doing so some members are now trying to find faults. He suggested these members should organise events and he will support them too. He further stated that they don't organise events for promotion and growth of Tent Pegging and OC's who do, these negative people try to bring them down. He said he did not understand why are these people in sports and suggested them to join politics.



The house applauded the statement.

HC Suresh Kumar further stated that they organised sponsorship to promote riders. He said he regularly on receipt of request from athletes gets their work done with EFI as a member of Athletes Commission. He stated that in discharging his duties if he has made any mistake, he accepts it. apologies for it. He requested the house to commute the punishment given to riders in Nepal case please.

Col AK Yadav stood up to suggest that this is exactly what he was trying to request the Chairman.

The **Chairman** informed Col Yadav that his point is noted.

Col AK Yadav claimed that the technical guidelines of 2016 pertaining to Endurance were prepared by him but because of intricacies of the discipline, he wanted to suggest changes which was objected by some members who suggested this matter to be taken by him with EFI separately.

Mr Gaurav Joshi said that we should move on as there are other disciplines and all discussions should not be focused on one discipline only.

The house agreed.

The **Chairman** requested Col AK Yadav that his mail was received and decided upon by EC and replied. In case he has more points, he should forward them to the federation and a reasoned decision shall be taken.

This was supported by most members of house.

17. **Mr Kevic Setalvad** said this is the 5th AGM he was attending and speaking for the first time. Mr Kevic Setalvad said that he wished to raise two points. One is pertaining to inquiry report and the second issue is regarding Show Jumping selection trial. He said that there is a fine common thread which runs between the two. He further informed the house that there are two members of inquiry committee present and I am not speaking on their behalf or on behalf of the inquiry committee. He clarified he is doing so in his personal capacity as member of EFI. He stated that there were important points in the report which has been acted upon but the report is not declassified which is against the principles of natural justice since based on the report, sanctions have been handed out, should it not be



discussed? He alleged that he is not aware if report was discussed at the time of issuance of Show Cause Notice as per the story which is doing rounds. He confirmed that he is not at anyone's side and is doing his own bidding. His only request for the purposes of transparency and wondered as to what is so secret about the report? He felt in order to understand since he knows the contents of the report which have been circulated and are in public domain. He alleged that there are some wrong doings including the people in power, not because there is a personal grudge, he has against anyone but because the manner in which the Federation has been functioning. He claimed the entire report has to be accepted and the athletes who have not been found guilty before the committee have been punished. His only question was why this report is not being made public? He also read out Para 3 of email replied to Col Rakesh Nair erstwhile Chairman of Inquiry Committee vide EFI email dated 26 Mar 2022.

"The decision on the report alongwith other relevant info and further course of actions is the discretion of EC of EFI. Hence, you are requested to please do not act in any way which shall be contrary to the interest of EFI".

The **Chairman** replied that his point is well taken and well noted. He further clarified that the report was tabled in Executive Committee and discussed in detail by the EC. He confirmed that there are few correspondences which states that the EC had acted upon the report, but it was not the report alone on which the EC members took a decision. He further stated that the decision of EC was unanimous after much deliberation. It was not a one man show and decision was taken by a body. It was not made public because the matter is sub-judice and will be placed in the court.

Mr Kevic Setalvad stated that his request as member of EFI not as a party in preparing the report to please disclose it, and not because he is suggesting it but it will send a message that the EFI is taking steps towards transparency and all these things which are put up on the screen, which he opposed, shall confirm procedures are followed. He suggested that there is nothing to hide and added once you take a step and move towards transparency, the Organisation is on the verge of redemption. He further stated that 60 years of this Federation's existence, our Federation, his son's Federation, should not function as old boys Club.



Secretary General assured him that the Federation is transparent and shall take steps on the matter as per law.

Mr Kevic Setalvad again suggested to disclose the report.

Secretary General said that sir, you were part of the committee and the committee submitted its report, the EC took a decision in a transparent manner in line with principles of natural justice, please let them do their job. Since you were part of the committee you are making comments on the report in an open forum and challenging the decision is incorrect.

Mr Kevic Setalvad confirmed that the report is in public domain.

Chairman questioned as to how it is in public domain which means it is not in the manner it should have been done. He said that the Federation too wanted the report to be made public and the EC decided that it will be put up in Court first and then take action.

Mr Kevic Setalvad wanted an assurance from the Chair

The Chairman requested him to ask his second question.

Mr Kevic Setalvad wanted a confirmation that he assumed that the Chairman is assuring him that it will be made public.

The Chairman confirmed that no it shall be submitted to the Court and based on their direction we shall make it public. Then he requested Mr Kevic Setalvad for his second question please.

Mr Kevic Setalvad brought out that after 3rd trial, the parameters were changed 10 days before the 4th Trial by making 4th & 5th trials for Show Jumping mandatory. Then it was cancelled. His point is why did it happen at the first place and secondly why was it withdrawn. He claimed both the decisions were opaque and unclear as to what was mandatory, participation was mandatory or qualifying was mandatory. He informed that some of the Show Jumping athletes had written to Federation but a detailed response was not received. He confirmed a one line response was received which he claimed to be illegal again. He asked the house who was responsible for the



decision and what was the rationale behind the decision since he had written a long letter.

The **Chairman** replied that he had answered his questions himself.

Mr Kirat Nagra clarified that both the issues raised are about transparency and about desired lack of reasoned decision making. He stated that a decision was taken and the end result may be same. He said what he (refer to **Mr Kevic Setalvad**) was requesting was that the EC should not take arbitrary decision.

Mr Kevic Setalvad requested for answers and was not ready to accept the reply as "noted".

The **Chairman** informed everyone it was a collective decision of EC.

Mr Kevic Setalvad said that EC is taking many decisions and suggested the functioning of EC should be more transparent.

Secretary General requested **Mr Kevic Setalvad** please do not repeat his point, since his suggestion has been noted. He further requested him that he can forward his points on email which shall be put up to EC for discussion and due deliberation. Accordingly, a reasoned decision will be given by the EC.

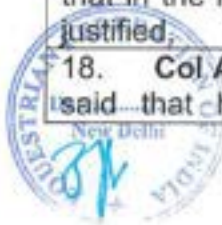
Maj Ashish Malik suggested that these are personal points which should be taken up with Federation through email and not in this house which is unnecessarily wasting time of members.

The **Secretary General** requested **Mr Kevic Setalvad** to please forward his personal points on the email and they shall be replied too. He informed him regarding mails received from members who had requested that their points to be included as agenda points 4/5 days before AGM which were taken up in the EC meeting and decision taken by EC was in line with EFI Statutes.

Most of the members suggested to move to next issue and not address personal issues.

Mr Kevic Setalvad said to sum up he suggested that in the minutes of EC, all decision of EC should be justified.

18. **Col AK Yadav**, on the Secretary General's report said that he had raised in the AGM 2019 some



observations on payment to lawyers. He alleged that he was told a fee was paid to Mr Rajiv Dutta by the Federation which is not the case.

Col AK Yadav alleged that he brought up the matter that Col RK Swain had committed financial irregularities when he was Joint Secretary. The financial report was still passed in the house. He claimed that he was told by Lt Col MM Rahman that he shall forward him the details and now after 2 ½ years he has not heard of it.

Secretary General requested Col AK Yadav to forward his observations on mail and it will be put up to EC and replied to.

Col AK Yadav wanted to give few suggestions on Technical Guidelines of Endurance discipline.

Joint Secretary requested him to please forward his suggestions to EFI and Technical Committee will take a reasoned decision on the same. He informed him that the Technical Committee consist of Vice President (Tech), Member Discipline and Secretary General.

Col AK Yadav informed the house that he had spoken with Col Jagat Singh yesterday who he claimed didn't know about the penalties stipulated for time faults for Endurance.

Joint Secretary suggested that there is no logic in raising issues like this. Joint Secretary clarified to him the procedure and again requested him to forward the points to EFI for consideration of Technical Committee and assured him that his point is noted.

19. **Col Sarpartap Singh** raised the Nepal World Cup Qualifier issue and requested the house that it is his humble request to commute the suspension period of four Indian riders who participated for Nepal.

20. **Hav Gautam Atta** requested the house that the rider in Nepal case should be pardoned as anyone can commit a mistake and requested the house they should be permitted to play.

21. **Dr KCS Reddy** informed the house that it is well known the riders come up to a level after a lot of hard training and reach the National stage. He suggested that punishing them for two years is very severe since after two years they will have no chance at the games. He requested that their punishment to be commuted.

22. **Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod** added that he supports the views of HC Suresh Kumar and would like to translate in Hindi what that gentleman (referring to Mr



(Kevic Setalvad) had said in English for better understanding of some member present that report is in public domain, which he had read in the morning. In his opinion, in the report HC Suresh ji the Athletes have not been blamed, he alleged guilty are those who let them play. In the last AGM where he had brought up this point Mr Ahmad Afsar had denied to the house that any such thing had happened and Col SS Solanki had also stated it was a well organised event.

Col SS Solanki, objected to his statement since he was not part of the World Cup Qualifier in any capacity. He called upon Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod not to make false statements which are incorrect.

At this juncture, some members got into verbal arguments and others tried to stop them.

HC Suresh Kumar requested the house to request few members to stop playing politics and work towards growth and development of the sport.

23. The **Secretary General** informed that house that pursuant to long standing request of following sports code in view of waiver received from MYAS and EFI's commitment to amend the Statutes, the EC has recommended changes to the Statutes to align them with National Sports Policy 2011. The Secretary General informed the Chair and hon'ble house that the draft of such amendment was posted on EFI Website for public comments and now reinformed the members pursuant to item No II of the agenda notice. The representative of Rajasthan State Association and couple others, raised concerns on the amendment not being specifically listed in the agenda notice, but failed to show such requirement in the existing EFI Statutes. After the regular agenda were completed, the Chair permitted to table the amendment to EFI Statutes, Election Bye Laws, EFI Policy for recognition of State/UT Equestrian Association & Guidelines for Institution/Club members to vote before the AGM. Except few members (Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod, Mr Kevic Setalvad, Col Rajesh Pattu, Col Sarpartap Singh, Mr Rajiv Dutta, Col AK Yadav, Mrs Pooja Gahlot & Mr Manoj Jalan), all other members present voted in favour of the amendments tabled, condoning any lacuna highlighted by few dissenting members of Rajasthan State Association and others earlier and the chair accepted the motion as approved (In favour – 111 & Not in favour – 08).

The motion was passed by the house.



Mr Kevic Setalvad requested Dr SY Quraishi the hon'ble Observer appointed by Delhi High Court to take a note of it and act upon it as he deemed fit.

Secretary General requested Mr Kevic Setalvad that the house has heard him.

Mr Kevic Setalvad replied that he was addressing the Hon'ble Observer

24. **Maj Anant Rajpurohit**, suggest DHS should be exempted from the EFI's Technical Guidelines 2021. The Secretary General informed him that a similar suggestion was discussed in the EC meeting held on 24 Mar 2022 and was not accepted by the EC.

25. **Lt Gen MKS Yadav, SM, DGST** informed the house that he is a member of EFI and had been listening to everyone for some time. He said that through the slide show during the presentation to the house he noticed the amount of work done by EFI. He said they have put in lot of efforts after due deliberation but their efforts are not appreciated. In this Federation, he brought out that everyone knows everyone inside out. Some members of Federation said that EFI was not following NSDCI-2011, who themselves are not following the sports code in their respective state and are questioning the Federation for same. He was surprised to see when the Federation changes the Statutes in line with the Code, then they threatened to go to Court, and prevent it from happening. Tent Pegging Qualifier was conducted and something was not right. This was investigated so that it does not happen again. It was made an issue in the previous AGM and Federation ordered investigation. Now the members who were part of the investigation are making statements and leaking the contents. In our country if there is any committee who has put up their report has never spoken in the parliament that their suggestions in their report should be accepted in totality. The Executive Committee formed a committee to investigate, they investigated and submitted their report to the Executive Committee. There is a President, Vice Presidents and members, whatever decision has been taken by EC should be accepted. Now, Executive Committee based on investigation report have taken a decision as per all those members who were earlier suggesting action should be taken are now saying riders to be exonerated. He requested to let the Executive Committee function, let EFI function. He understood that some members have their personal agenda and they are not interested in the sport. He confirmed he has no agenda. He was a rider once. He said he is very passionate about the sport which is why he is attending the AGM. He requested the house to consider what HC



Suresh Kumar's request to work for the growth and development of the sport. He further requested to please stop playing politics and he during the proceeding noticed that not one person has said a positive note on the functioning of the Federation rather they are making all efforts to pull down the Federation. This Federation has spent so much time and efforts in making rules and regulations, import of Horses, trying for exemption of import duty, trying to send our horse-rider combination to go to Europe via 3rd country, despite these some members are complaining. Please keep personal agendas aside as there are ways available to raise your concerns. Some members are working as per their own convenience. He requested the house to let EFI function efficiently, give your point which will be considered. He appreciated efforts of the Federation and he assured the present system of governance is the best. He felt ashamed the way some senior member of Federation, behaved in front of Hon'ble Dr SY Quraishi, appointed by Delhi High Court who had to listen to so much negativity. He said we are sportsmen and let us work together for the growth and development of the sport. If anything is wrong legally, it will be checked and action taken accordingly. Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod has filed a case that EFI needs to change its Statutes & Bye Laws now when the Federation does it he alleges it can't be done. Please take one stand, this is your Federation.

The house unanimously applauded at the address of Lt Gen MKS Yadav, SM, DGST.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod said that his stand is only on the Sports Code to be implemented.

Mr Gaurav Joshi said his question is related to last AGM minutes; Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod had said that Rajasthan Equestrian Association (REA) is applying with State Govt for exemption. He asked Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod to confirm if they have received the exemption. If not, then he felt REA is not a recognised State body of Rajasthan and of EFI. He questioned the REA to inform the house about the steps they have taken.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod replied that sports is a state subject.

Secretary General corrected Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod and request him to refer to Sports Code which states to be contrary.



Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod requested to reply to Mr Gaurav Joshi.

Mr Gaurav Joshi brought out that in the AGM of EFI held on 21 Mar 2021, Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod had said: -

"He further went on to clarify that the Rajasthan State Association was following the Rajasthan Sports Code which mandated 06 District Associations as members and had also extended provisional membership to a few and regularisation of the same had been delayed due to the COVID 19. State Associations cannot follow the NSDCI – 2011 in reference to the 50% District Associations and a representation had been made to the Ministry for relaxation in this regard"

"To this Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod replied that like the National Federation, the State Association had also applied to the Ministry for exemption on this particular clause".

Mr Gaurav Joshi argued that if they have not received a waiver from State Govt why are they not being derecognised from EFI.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod confirmed that this issue was raised in the last AGM. Sports Code says 50% Districts whereas Rajasthan Code says six districts.

Mr Gaurav Joshi asked him to confirm if he has an official reply from their state.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod confirmed to the house that there are 50% District Association in Rajasthan and his State fully in compliance to laid down provision of NSDCI-2011 and suggested Mr Gaurav Joshi that the matter is over. Mr Gaurav Joshi informed the house that as per registrar only two new districts have been added hence from seven Rajasthan Equestrian Association has now nine District Associations which does not meet the requirement stipulated in Sports Code.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod started shouting at Mr Gaurav Joshi.

Secretary General requested Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod to calm down and maintain the decorum of the house.



Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod requested to please keep Mr Gaurav Joshi under control and alleged that this is the reason why he got beaten in Gujarat.

Mr Gaurav Joshi raised an objection on the statement of Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod.

Joint Secretary corrected Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod that it is a wrong statement he has made and requested him not to make defamatory statements.

Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod apologised to the house and suggested that if the EFI has suspended the athlete who took to violence in Endurance event in Ahmadabad, why was Mr Gaurav Joshi not suspended.

Secretary General clarified that the matter was put to DRDC and based on their reasoned decision, action was taken by EC. Mr Gaurav Joshi felt humiliated and was not ready to accept the comment made by Mr Raghuvendra Singh Dundlod in the house against him.

26. There being no more points/observation, the Secretary General requested the chair for closing address.

27. **Closing Address.** The nominated Chair said on behalf of the Federation he thanked all members for their time, patience and suggestion as always.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF COMMITTEE ON THE UTILISATION OF
SPONSORSHIP BY EFI

1. The right to raise funds through sponsorship/donation/CSR shall be exclusively of EFI.
2. All EFI events including RELs will be under the ambit of EFI's sponsorship policy.
3. The publicity to be provided to the sponsors of EFI's events will be done by EFI for which suitable direction will be issued to the OC. The EFI's decision will be final and binding on the OC.
4. The sponsorship generated to be expended proportionately based on the amount received from a sponsor on the following :-

Athletes/Horses

- (a) Stabling charges at the OC to be paid by Federation for EFI approved events to the OC at the rate of :

If the OC provides an area wherein the participants will built their own temp shed, charges levied will be max Rs 500/- per horse to take care of electricity, water and cleaning charges thereof.

OR

If the OC provides a temp stable constructed by them for duration of a event or a permanent stable, the charges levied will be max Rs 2500/- per horse.

- (b) Vet expenditure incurred by athlete/owner/stakeholders to enable participation in the equestrian event upto a max amount of Rs 5000/- per horse per event may be disbursed. This shall be done only for EFI approved events.

- (c) A financial assistance for conduct of events can be provided to the OC by Federation across the board except for RELs :-

(i)	Eventing	-	Rs 1.5 lakh	} These rates are subject to renewal from time to time at the discretion of EFI
(ii)	Show Jumping	-	Rs 1lakh	
(iii)	Dressage	-	Rs 50,000/-	
(iv)	Tent Pegging	-	Rs 1 lakh	
(v)	Endurance	-	Rs 1 lakh	

- (d) Training of athletes/officials/support staff :

- (i) Coaching Camps for all categories of JNEC & Seniors for the Olympic Disciplines and training /exposure abroad.



- (ii) Conduct of Clinics for officials for International /National level and for National level coaches.
- (iii) Conduct of clinic for athletes.
- (iv) Accreditation of trainers, Grooms and ferriers.
- (v) Expenditure on account of officials for EFI approved events.

5. The OC shall be treated as venue partner of EFI and can raise funds through their own inhouse sponsors with prior approval of EFI wherein funds may be used by OC for purposes not stated above.

6. It is at the discretion of EFI to use the funds generated through sponsorship/donation/ CSR for the growth and development of Equestrian Sports as it deem fit.

INTRODUCTION

Equestrian Federation of India (EFI) is the sole authority of governing equestrian sports in India.

EFI is a recognized body of Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) and is the sole authority for conducting in INDIA all National and International Equestrian disciplines recognized by them.

The federation is a registered body under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and recognized by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS), Sports Authority of India (SAI), Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI). Since 1967 the development of equestrian sport in India has been guided and promoted by the country's governing body, the Equestrian Federation of India founded by a group of people driven by a mutual passion for horses and equestrian sport.

VISION & MISSION & OBJECTIVES OF EFI

- To achieve a high standard of equestrianism in the country by improving the standard of Indian riders through infrastructure development, proper planning of EFI calendar to conduct various regional/national/international competitions as per FEI/EFI rules and organise coaching camps for athletes of various disciplines, clinics/seminars/courses for various officials to establish a robust frame work of athletes, officials , organising committees and other support staffs at grass root level to produce top class athletes to represent the country at international level.
- To establish the Equestrian Federation of India as one of the most reliable medals winning National Sports Federation of the country by winning maximum medals possible at Asian Games, World Equestrian Games and Olympic Games.
- Overall Objectives of EFI include:
 - To encourage and develop Equestrian sport in Olympic/FEI disciplines and Equestrian sport peculiar to India and Asian region and improve the standard of performance of Indian riders in various international events.
 - To promote interest in riding, breeding of required type of horses, their training, every day care, veterinary, control and medication.
 - To establish and publish rules and regulations for conduct of National Events and events peculiar to Asia region. All events in general will be governed by FEI/EFI rules.
 - To allot, approve programmes for equestrian competition held under the aegis of EFI in India and exercise control over their technical organization and actual conduct.
 - To encourage holding of competitions, provide technical know-how and promote highest standard of organization.



- o To organize coaching camps, clinics in judging, course designing, technical delegate, steward and veterinary control of all equestrian disciplines approved and recognized by FEI/EFI.
- o To organize training and appoint adequate number of judges, course designers, technical delegates, stewards and veterinarians in various equestrian disciplines in order to get them empanelled with FEI.
- o To promote understanding and co-operation between various State/Union Territory associations/Institutions/Clubs/Units, its members, and give them support and strengthen their authority, prestige and improve equestrian standards throughout the country.
- o To assist Organizing Committee of local Horse Shows by extending technical know-how, in terms of appointment of judges, etc.
- o To print, publish and sell periodicals, books or leaflets to promote equestrian sport in order to keep all its members updated on all aspects.
- o To arrange representation of the EFI in International bodies, Asian bodies and in such other bodies as is considered necessary and to participate in their meetings and proceedings.
- o To acquire and dispose off property, movable and immovable in the best interest of the federation.
- o To undertake, create and execute any trust, which may lawfully be undertaken by the Federation.
- o To borrow or raise money for the purposes for which the Federation has been constituted.
- o To render financial assistance, as and when possible, to its members to further the objects of the Federation.
- o To liaise and co-operate with Government and other organisation, private bodies and clubs for the promotion and development of any one or more of the objectives of the Federation.

- o Generally, to do all acts necessary and expedient for the promotion of any of the above objectives or any other objectives which are ancillary and/or incidental to the above objectives or to any one of them that will further the general purposes of the Federation.

In its capacity as the custodian of the Sport of Equestrian in India it is the responsibility of the EFI to generate and utilise the generated funds and revenues and property of the EFI only for the purpose and objectives of the EFI as stated above and as per the EFI Statutes and to ensure guarding such interest against any abuse and maintain transparency in its association process.

POLICY STATEMENT

Sponsorship and advertising agreements may be entered into if they are consistent with the values, purpose of equestrian sport and the objectives of the Equestrian Federation of India vis a vis its Constitution and Statutes and derive benefits for the sport and those participating in it.

This policy is designed to maintain confidence in the sport's activities by ensuring commercial sponsorship and advertising arrangements are undertaken in an open, transparent, fair and responsible manner.

SCOPE & APPLICABILITY

This policy applies to:

- Equestrian Federation of India
- All 3rd party natural and legal persons and entities whether involved or not with the sport of equestrian
- All Members of Equestrian Federation of India
- EFI Committees and bodies
- Interested and Potential Partners of EFI
- Formalised Partners & Sponsors of EFI
- The policy does not apply to donations or grants.

All sponsorship and advertising arrangements made or renewed from _____ 2021 must comply with the requirements of the policy,



unless it is not possible contractually, in which case, such arrangements must be made compliant as soon as practicable



INTEGRAL GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The principles of sponsorship and advertising integral to EFI management are:

- Integrity of EFI and its associated members and committees
- Alignment with EFI priorities
- Appropriate acknowledgement
- Appropriate activity
- Appropriate association
- Appropriate authorization
- Ethical behavior and fair dealing
- Open and effective competition
- Effective management and reporting

EFI Roles and Responsibilities

Roles and responsibilities are assigned on the basis of the value and sensitivity of the sponsorship or advertising proposal.

The responsibility of the Sponsorship Committee consisting of Chairman-Vice President (Adm), Secy Gen and Treasurer of EFI includes:

- To consider all sponsorship and advertising proposals against the requirements of this policy and procedures.
- Gain the agreement of the Sponsorship Committee for any proposal considered acceptable in terms of this policy, prior to its acceptance.
- Document all processes locally and register all incoming sponsorships valued at more than INR _____
- Document instances where the potential sponsor or advertiser is a friend, relative or business associate and declare this conflict of interest¹ to the others involved.

¹The definition of conflict of interest is to be followed as per article 158 of general regulations of FEI.



- Seek endorsement of the sponsorship by the Sponsorship Committee of EFI, if
 - it involves naming rights, or
 - is the first of their kind for the sport; or
 - involves significant events; or Sponsorship and Advertising

DEFINITIONS & TEMRINOLOGY

Sponsorship and advertising are often confused. They are different activities, which can be differentiated by the following:

- **Control** - in advertising there is considerable control over the content, timing and positioning of advertisements. In comparison, sponsors have less control over the management and conduct of the sponsored activity or event.
- **Function** - advertising is used to elicit a positive response and to create consumer preference. Sponsorship indirectly contributes to company, brand or product awareness.
- **Message** - the advertising message is explicit, informative and persuasive. The sponsorship message is indirect, and is designed to improve image or build identity.

1.1 Sponsorship

Sponsorship is a commercial arrangement involving the right to associate the name, products or services of a sponsor with EFI events, activities, athletes, associations etc in return for negotiated benefits in cash or kind.

Incoming sponsorship refers to cash and/or in kind that is received by the EFI and its recognized associations, entities, members in exchange for an agreed benefit and form of recognition for a business or other body.

1.2 Advertising

This is the direct promotion of a company through space or airtime purchased from EFI or the sport for that specific purpose. This includes advertising, such as on event location, notice boards, equipment,

Publications and Internet sites, corporate-sponsored materials or corporate- sponsored contests and incentives and inclusion of material in newsletters. Advertising may be incoming, e.g. where a local business pays to advertise in the EFI newsletter, or outgoing, e.g. where the EFI pays to



place an advertisement in a newspaper, magazine or the like.

1.3 Naming rights

This is a form of sponsorship where a major sponsor, in addition to the rights and benefits of sponsorship, has negotiated the right to have the name of the sponsor added as a prefix to the EFI event name or facility etc.

1.4 Donation or Gift

These forms of support impose no obligations on the receiver and offer little or no return to the donor. Tax deductions can also be claimed under Section 80 Income Tax Act. A donation or a gift is not a sponsorship as it has no service orientation.

1.5 Endorsement

This means the support, approval or recommendation of a product or service, to the potential exclusion of others.

1.6 Fundraising

This means activities to raise funds, by the EFI for the sole benefit of sport or EFI activities or purposes.

1.7 Grant

This is money or goods provided by a government or other agency to a recipient, with the understanding there will be a defined outcome. A grant is not a sponsorship.

1.8 Product endorsement

This is a sponsorship or advertising arrangement that involves the EFI acting on behalf of a company to sell, recommend or endorse a company's products or services.

PRINCIPLES AND PROCEDURES

a. Alignment with EFI priorities

Sponsorship and advertising must not detract from the strategic goals of

the EFI and must demonstrate consistency with the principles of this policy and align with the priorities of EFI.

b. Appropriate acknowledgement

Appropriate acknowledgement is a condition of all sponsorship agreements. The form of acknowledgement to be given to a sponsor should be documented in the sponsorship agreement.

Where the contribution of the sponsor to events or assets is minor compared to the level of EFI funding invested, the recognition afforded to the sponsor should be in proportion.

When the EFI are providing sponsorship they should ensure that the sponsored organisation provides public acknowledgement of that support. The prominence of that acknowledgement should be in proportion to the value of the sponsorship provided.

Display/Usage of EFI IP's, logos and marks:

Whenever the EFI IP's, logos and marks is displayed as part of a joint acknowledgement or promotion, the emblem or logo must be of similar or greater size to that used by the commercial partner as per guidelines ***Annexure1 (EFI IP USAGE GUIDELINES) of the Brand Protection Guidelines as well as have been reproduced as Annexure 1 hereof.***

c. Appropriate activity

Sponsorship and advertising must maintain or enhance the public profile of the sport.

➤ **Unacceptable sponsorship or advertising activity:**

- Sponsorship or advertising in which the involvement of a commercial sponsor or advertiser could reasonably be seen to diminish the profile of the sport and EFI.
- Sponsorship or advertising conflicting with the core business of the EFI (i.e. provision of equestrian based services).
- Sponsorship or advertising that is not consistent with the equity policies of the sport of equestrian.
- Any outgoing sponsorship that conflicts with events and initiatives of EFI.
- Participation in any venture that compromises the sport and its participants and/or their parents'/guardians' privacy, including



providing personal information about athletes, parents/guardians, staff or other members of the sports community to any organisation not authorised to access this information.

➤ **Permissible sponsorship recognition:**

- Public notices, via newspaper, radio, television or any other form of public media.
- Appropriate editorial material, simple acknowledgment or a by-line or foreword from the sponsor in EFL enews or the like.
- Plaques, pictures or other notices at events or at the place of business of the sponsor.
- Lists of sponsors in newsletters and the Annual Report.
- A letter of appreciation to the sponsor.
- The name or logo of a commercial partner on sport signs or uniforms.
- A sign indicating the name and/or logo of the sponsor, for the duration of a sponsored activity, or for an agreed period of time. The location, prominence and design of such a sign must be tasteful and respectful of the cultural values the sport.
- Naming rights of events, equipment, materials or facilities, subject to appropriate approval.
- Attendance of a representative(s) of the sponsor at sport functions and the opportunity to make an address or present awards at such functions.
- Acknowledgement in speeches.

d. Appropriate association

Sponsorship and advertising agreements must only be negotiated with organisations whose public image, products or services are compatible with the ethos, values and purpose of the sport and EFL. By accepting or giving sponsorship or advertising, the EFL is sharing its reputation with that of the sponsor or advertiser.

➤ **Unacceptable sponsor or advertiser organisations:**

- Produce products that may be potentially harmful to the health of participants, such as tobacco or alcohol.

- * Have a public reputation that conflicts with the values of the sport and EFI, such as those associated with questionable corporate practices or those associated with discriminatory attitudes (e.g. racist or sexist attitudes).

➤ **Unacceptable sponsorships and advertisements:**

- Are contrary to the ethos, values and purpose of the sport and EFI.
- Are discriminatory, obscene, or degrading.
- Incite people to commit illegal acts or violate sport rules.
- Promote or condone alcohol consumption or drink driving by young people.
- Portray violence, undue aggression and menacing or horrific elements likely to disturb children and young people.
- Are otherwise objectionable or offensive.

➤ **Other considerations -**

Care should also be taken before accepting sponsorship and advertising from any person or organisation that is:

- A competitor to an existing sponsor, if it is contrary to an agreement with the existing sponsor, or likely to jeopardise the existing sponsorship.
- A competitor to an existing provider.
- A friend, relative or business associate of a EFI committee member. In such cases, the decision-maker must declare the conflict of interest and, if practical, withdraw from the decision-making process and pass the decision to another person. If it is not practical to withdraw, the conflict of interest must be declared to the others involved.

e. Appropriate authorisation

Sponsorship and advertising must follow the authorisation and management processes required by this policy and its procedures. Sponsorship and advertising activities within EFI can only be undertaken with the agreement of the Sponsorship Committee, following consultation with them on the proposal.

Sponsorship Committee must, through the EFI's Secretariat forward a sponsorship and advertising proposals for assessment and endorsement, when the proposal:

- Is in excess of INR _____ (net); or
- Has the potential to be controversial; or
- Involves naming rights; or
- Are the first of their kind for the sport; or
- Involves a national or international level event; or
- Has a state-wide implication; or
- Involves outgoing sponsorship in excess of INR _____

f. **Ethical Behaviour and Fair Dealing**

To ensure the sports/athletes confidence in sponsorship and advertising processes, all involved must act ethically and fairly.

Sponsorship Committee members must:

- Ensure their private interests do not conflict with their sport committee duties.
- Not accept or seek gifts or other favours.
- Not entertain approaches from sponsors or sponsorship recipients that might be interpreted as attempts to influence any selection process.
- Maintain confidentiality in their dealings
- Maintain high standards of accountability
- Apply systems and procedures that ensure an equitable, efficient and effective approach to sponsorship and advertising.
- Comply with all relevant laws and regulations including but not limited to:
 - i. Advertising Standards Council of India's Code for Self-Regulation ("ASCI Code")
 - ii. Consumer Protection Act, 2019
 - iii. Central Consumer Protection Authority Guidelines, 2020
 - iv. The Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 1955
 - v. Cable Television Networks (Amendment) Rules, 2006
 - vi. Press Council of India Act, 1978



- vii. Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act, 2003.
- viii. FEI Code of Ethics and applicable statutes and the laws of the sport of Equestrian applicable to the EFI.

If there are any doubts about the ethics of a sponsorship or advertising proposal, the test is whether or not the arrangement would withstand critical EFI and public scrutiny. Relations with corporate sponsors need to be conducted in a transparent manner and be able to withstand EFI's scrutiny so as to preserve sport trust.

➤ **Provision of goods in-kind -**

Instead of money, some sponsors or advertisers prefer to provide goods or services, otherwise known as in-kind items. This may include air/train tickets, travel, equipment, press, radio and television coverage, as well as food, beverages and other consumer goods. This practice is acceptable provided:

- Parties agree on a fair and justifiable value for the items.
- The value of the items is included in the total value of the sponsorship or advertising agreement.
- Benefits are for the organization and not the individuals organising the sponsorship or advertising.
- Processes are properly documented and managed.
- Accountability is maintained.

f. Open and Effective Competition

- Sponsorship or advertising opportunities should usually be publicised so as to be fair to all potential sponsors or advertisers, and to ensure that a reasonable price is obtained and sport confidence in the process is promoted.
- To avoid any allegations of impropriety, sponsorship and advertising agreements must be developed in a transparent, open and accountable manner.
- When seeking sponsorship or advertising, competitive processes should be used.
- Where an unsolicited offer of sponsorship or advertising is received, the EFI may wish to use a competitive process where there are other providers of similar products or services in the market place. This could be achieved by calling for expressions of interest or sending a letter to known competitors. It is important to protect the



commercially valuable ideas and strategies of the organisation or individual that proposed the original offer. Commercially sensitive information should be protected, because it is the property of the initiator of the proposal.

g. Effective Management and Reporting

Sponsorship and advertising arrangements should be confirmed by a written agreement, reported and recorded as required and evaluated annually, as well as prior to renewal.

- **Agreements** -Sponsorship and advertising agreements should clearly state the rights and benefits being offered, agreed payment terms, the obligations on each party and be signed by the General Manager. For arrangements of low value or complexity a letter, receipt or local document may be used.
- **Reporting** -The Chairman of Sponsorship Committee must be notified of all incoming sponsorships valued over INR _____. This includes sponsorships in-kind, involving goods or services that should be valued according to an estimate of the price the sponsor would usually charge for them. In such cases the sponsor can be asked to provide an estimate of the value as it relates to in-kind or provision of goods and services for the purposes of the sponsorship.
- **Recording** -Records of all sponsorship and advertising agreements should be kept locally, and reported on monthly via Secretary General of Committee meetings and associated minutes.
- **Evaluation** -Sponsorship and advertising agreements should be evaluated annually, for their effectiveness in achieving outcomes for the sport and the sponsor alike. This process will help the sport in their event and activity planning process for the upcoming year from a sponsorship perspective.

ENFORCEMENT

a. Against 3rd Parties

- While this Policy is meant to be directive in nature, it is not exhaustive of the circumstances that may arise.
- EFI prefers direct personal contact to bring infringing situations to an end by 'speaking to the business in question, explaining why the specific situation is problematic and seeking cooperation in solving the issue. In more serious cases, where there is a clear intention to take a free ride on the goodwill vested in the event and the public excitement surrounding it, EFI may need to engage in judicial body/ court proceedings under applicable Indian Law to halt an infringing situation and to claim financial compensation for the damages



suffered.

b. In the event of infringements by EFI Members

- Enforcement and remedial measures provided for in the EFI Constitution may be adhered to by the EFI including action by General Assembly for **removal, suspension, termination** basis a report of the **Dispute Resolution & Disciplinary Committee or even further onto certain civil-criminal proceedings thereafter.**
- The committee will, after calling for all relevant records and facts and after giving reasonable opportunity to the parties, will render its reasoned decision within a maximum period of **sixty days**.
- If a party continues to be aggrieved, it shall be open to that party to file an **appeal** against the committee's decision before the Executive Committee within a period of **thirty days** from the date of the aforesaid decision.
- The decision of the Executive Committee, thereafter, will be final and binding on the parties.

INTRODUCTION

Equestrian Federation of India (EFI) is the sole authority of governing equestrian disciplines in India. The EFI is a registered body under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and recognized by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS), Sports Authority of India (SAI), Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) as the sole National Sports Federation for equestrian disciplines in India. Since 1967 the development of equestrian sport in India has been guided and promoted by the country's governing body, the Equestrian Federation of India founded by a group of people driven by a mutual passion for horses and equestrian sport.



OBJECTIVE OF THE GUIDELINES: IMPORTANCE OF BRAND PROTECTION

EFI being the NSF for the sport of Equestrian disciplines in India, EFI has all the commercial rights to exploit its Intellectual Properties and for Equestrian disciplines events as Sanctioned by the EFI or by the FEI held within the territory of India.

EFI is obliged to take action against any unauthorised reproduction of its marks in a commercial context. If EFI did not follow up on any infringements of its trademarks and copyrighted works, it would risk losing its legal right and title to such works, thereby endangering the foundation of its commercial programme.

Protection of Rights Holder's Rights

Due to the substantial cost of staging equestrian events, EFI would not be able to organise the same without the significant support of its Commercial Affiliates and partners. They make vital financial contributions to ensure that events can be staged and revenues generated for the requirement of various programmes necessary for development of Equestrian can be met with.

In return for this vital support, EFI rights holders are guaranteed an association with the EFI, especially through the right to use the EFI IP's (e.g. the Official Emblem and the Official Marks etc) in their promotions and advertising. EFI's Commercial Affiliates will only invest in the EFI programmes, competitions, events etc if they are provided with this exclusivity for the use of the marks and for any other kind of association to the event.

If anyone could use the EFI IP's for free and create an association with the EFI there would be no reason to become a Commercial Affiliate and as a result EFI would be unable to secure the funding necessary to stage the event. Therefore, EFI is obliged to act when non-affiliated entities do not respect

EFI's intellectual property and conduct activities that commercially associate with the EFI. This would mean that EFI could not appoint any Commercial Affiliates and would therefore not receive the revenue required to maintain the high standards expected and to meet the Vision and Objectives of the EFI.

Association Principles

The EFI is committed developing the sport of equestrian in India and with that aim associating with partners through formal agreements to exploit EFI IP's keeping in mind the below principals:



- Integrity of Equestrian India and its Committees
- Alignment with Federation priorities
- Appropriate acknowledgement
- Appropriate activity
- Appropriate association
- Appropriate authorisation
- Ethical behaviour and fair dealing
- Open and effective competition
- Effective management and reporting
- Roles and responsibilities are assigned on the basis of the value and sensitivity of the sponsorship
- or advertising proposal



Therefore, investing time and resources to protect the brand and Intellectual Properties of EFI is of paramount importance to EFI in order to secure the revenue streams which fund EFI's equestrian and social development initiatives including but not limited to its men's, women's and youth competitions, events and any related projects.

SCOPE& APPLICABILITY OF THESE GUIDELINES

These Guidelines sets out and outlines the master do's and don'ts vis a vie the EFI Intellectual Properties with an aim at protecting the revenue streams for the development of the Sport of Equestrian in India and apply to the public in general and include without limitation:

- All Individual Members, State/Union Territories Associations, Institutions, Clubs and Units Members of the EFI
- All 3rd party natural persons and legal entities associated with the EFI
- All Stakeholders of Equestrian, related entities, committees, State Equestrian Federations in India Equestrian in India, associated Equestrian Committees in the country; and
- Regional or local sub-committees of all such Equestrian Committees and Organising Committees

TARGETING SOME PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES OF AMBUSH MARKETING & COUNTERFEITING

Ambush marketing can be defined as prohibited marketing activities which try to take advantage of the huge interest and profile of an event by creating a commercial association and/or seeking promotional exposure without the authorisation of IP Owner/Official Rights Holder/Event Organiser and such other official rights holder.

Such prohibited marketing activities can be of a direct or indirect nature.

A direct association is established when a brand tries to link itself directly to the event, be it through advertising or promotions such as ticket giveaways, use of the tournament designations, etc. An indirect association aims to achieve an association with the event without making a direct link, often implementing creative campaigns aimed at achieving a link to the event.

Marketing activities by non-sponsor companies that seek to take advantage of the huge public interest in the event through physical on-site presence can also be categorised as prohibited.

The common denominator of such prohibited marketing activities is that they primarily seek free advertising.

The reason that EFI considers prohibited marketing as a priority in its brand protection work is that it puts EFI's commercial programme directly at risk by trying to devalue official sponsorship.

Companies engaging in prohibited marketing fail to appreciate that the EFI programs are a result of EFI efforts to develop and promote the tournaments, events and programs, something which would not be possible without the financial support of EFI's Commercial

Affiliates. Ambush marketers try to take advantage of the goodwill and positive image generated by the EFI without contributing to its organisation.

Counterfeiting - EFI commercial programs also encompass a licensing programme which gives a wide range of licensees the opportunity to produce Official Licensed Products bearing EFI IP's. However, there are also companies that seek to produce items featuring EFI IP's without purchasing the required licence. Such products are defined as counterfeit products.

On gaining awareness EFI is obliged to take corresponding action, including any legal measures at its disposal, to bring the activity to a halt.

HOW TO CELEBRATE THE SPORT WITHOUT CREATING UNAUTHORISED ASSOCIATION - FAIR PLAY



There are legitimated ways to celebrate the sport without using the Official EFI IP's or creating an unauthorised commercial association with the EFI. Activities that create an undue commercial association are not permitted and are subject to legal measures. Such undue commercial association is established when a company, entity, person etc makes it appear as if it is associated with EFI – for example, by using the Official EFI IP or in another way creating an impression that it is a EFI Rights Holder i.e. : a sponsor or licensee. To avoid promotional activities infringing EFI IP's or other commercial rights we suggest seeking independent Legal advice.

EXAMPLES Of USE

(Non Exhaustive)

To assist third Parties to avoid any unauthorised commercial association with the EFI below are a few non exhaustive examples of the Do's and Don't's. The examples attempt at covering all forms of print and digital media including but not limited to print, tv, web, mobile, games, apps and social media.

MEDIAL	DO'S& Don'ts (Indicative)
Print & Digital Media – Editorial	Event / Play Reporting as part of legitimate editorial and news. Not to use EFI IP's as a integral/repeated/stand lone basis in the layout.
Commercial Use	May not be used in proximity to Company logo or in conjunction with words such as "brought o you by..."," presented by....", "sponsored by" Etc.
Social Media	
Posting images of EFI IP	Reasonable and not excessive posting of EFI IP's so as to create impression of association by fans and followers without any commercial intent
Retweeting or Sharing	Reasonable and not excessive retweeting and sharing of EFI IP's so as to create impression of association by fans and followers without any commercial intent
Hashtags	Usage of EFI IPs in Hashtags is permissible without any Commercial intent
Mobile/Internet Services	Use of content and EFI IP's is strictly not permitted with any commercial intent. Editorial/General Descriptive news is permissible without creating an impression of association with EFI and also such platforms shall not use the EFI IP's so as to suggest

	endorsement by EFI such use of EFI logo,s words marks etc.
Domain Names/URL/Hyperlink	Use of EFI IP's in Domain names, hyperlinks, URL is not permitted without granted rights.
Websites (Look and Feel)	EFI IP's are not permitted to be used as a part of the overall layout and look and feel of entity websites as it may create an impression of association and endorsement by EFI.
Blogs	Official IP used in editorial blogs, reporting or commenting on EFI events and competitions without any commercial content or advertising is generally acceptable as not creating any commercial association



Business Adverts	Use in Commercial advertisements by non-associates in NOT Permissible
Business Names	EFI IP's cannot be a part of unauthorised Business Names
Instore Decorations	In Store Decoration with generic Equestrian mentions and collaterals are permissible as it does not create an association or impression of endorsement of EFI however EFI IP's shall not be incorporated
Merchandise	Merchandise with generic Equestrian mentions and branding are permissible as it does not create an association or impression of endorsement of EFI however EFI IP's shall not be incorporated
Competitions/lotteries/games	NOT Permissible
Ticket promotions	Use of EFI tickets for promotions etc unless permitted by EFI is NOT Permissible
Match schedules	Editorial and Non Commercial Reproduction of EFI Event Schedule is permissible if it is not for commercial use

The above table comprises of non-exhaustive list of examples and are only meant for indicative illustrations. Any actual infringement is subject to scrutiny and assessment by EFI in the interest of EFI Brand Protection.



COMMUNICATION, ENFORCEMENT & SURVEILLANCE

COMMUNICATION

- First and foremost, EFI tries to increase awareness regarding the Official Marks that enjoy legal protection as well as on the restrictions that apply in relation to commercial association with the EFI
- Upon detection of an infringing situation, EFI's brand protection team assesses the most effective way of quickly bringing the situation to an end, without having to resort to disproportionate enforcement actions.

SURVEILLANCE

- This refers to EFI team carrying out physical checks all across event locations to easily identify and effectively deal with marketing activities that focus on the physical presence of non-sponsor companies in and around event sites against prohibited marketing activities around the stadium, unauthorised traders, counterfeit goods and ticket touts and
- EFI published request to ask that local businesses commit to fair play with regard to EFI and its Commercial Affiliates in their activities that seek to profit from the high number of visitors without engaging in prohibited marketing.

ENFORCEMENT

- EFI prefers direct personal contact to bring infringing situations to an end by speaking to the business in question, explaining why the specific situation is problematic and seeking cooperation in solving the issue.
- In more serious cases, where there is a clear intention to take a free ride on the goodwill vested in the event and the public excitement surrounding it, EFI may need to engage in court proceedings to halt an infringing situation and to claim financial compensation for the damages suffered.

CONTACT INFORMATION & HOW TO GET INVOLVED& ASSOCIATED

As per the Constitution of the EFI, the EFI has a right to raise funds, sponsorship, license fee, capitation fee etc. from interested parties who wish to be associated with the EFI. In general, there are various opportunities for entities or individuals to benefit from and get involved with EFI other than by way of Sponsorship or Licensing such as:

FUNDS DISBURSMENT GUIDELINES (DISBURSEMENT GUIDELINES)



INTRODUCTION

Equestrian Federation of India (EFI) is the sole authority of governing equestrian disciplines in India. The EFI is a registered body under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and recognized by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS), Sports Authority of India (SAI), Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) as the sole National Sports Federation for equestrian disciplines in India. Since 1967 the development of equestrian sport in India has been guided and promoted by the country's governing body, the Equestrian Federation of India founded by a group of people driven by a mutual passion for horses and equestrian sport.

OBJECTIVES OF THE EFI

These Guidelines sets out and outlines guidelines to be followed by the EFI and its authorised representatives with regard to the disbursement and allocation of **revenues, funds, inward amounts received by EFI by way of Sponsorships, donations, CSR (Funds)** with an aim at furthering the following objectives of the EFI as per the EFI Constitution for the development of the Sport of Equestrian in India:

- To achieve a high standard of equestrianism in the country by improving the standard of Indian riders through infrastructure development, proper planning of EFI calendar to conduct various regional/national/international competitions as per FEI/EFI rules and organise coaching camps for athletes of various disciplines, clinics/seminars/courses for various officials to establish a robust frame work of athletes, officials , organising committees and other support staffs at grass root level to produce top class athletes to represent the country at international level.
- To establish the Equestrian Federation of India as one of the most reliable medals winning National Sports Federation of the country by winning maximum medals possible at Asian Games, World Equestrian Games and Olympic Games.
- Overall Objectives of EFI include:
 - To encourage and develop Equestrian sport in Olympic/FEI disciplines and Equestrian sport peculiar to India and Asian region and improve the standard of performance of Indian riders in various international events.
 - To promote interest in riding, breeding of required type of horses, their training, every day care, veterinary, control and medication.



- o To establish and publish rules and regulations for conduct of National Events and events peculiar to Asia region. All events in general will be governed by FEI/EFI rules.
- o To allot, approve programmes for equestrian competition held under the aegis of EFI in India and exercise control over their technical organization and actual conduct.
- o To encourage holding of competitions, provide technical know-how and promote highest standard of organization.
- o To organize coaching camps, clinics in judging, course designing, technical delegate, steward and veterinary control of all equestrian disciplines approved and recognized by FEI/EFI.
- o To organize training and appoint adequate number of judges, course designers, technical delegates, stewards and veterinarians in various equestrian disciplines in order to get them empanelled with FEI.
- o To promote understanding and co-operation between various State/Union Territory associations/Institutions/Clubs/Units, its members, and give them support and strengthen their authority, prestige and improve equestrian standards throughout the country.
- o To assist Organizing Committee of local Horse Shows by extending technical know-how, in terms of appointment of judges, etc.
- o To print, publish and sell periodicals, books or leaflets to promote equestrian sport in order to keep all its members updated on all aspects.
- o To arrange representation of the EFI in International bodies, Asian bodies and in such other bodies as is considered necessary and to participate in their meetings and proceedings.
- o To acquire and dispose off property, movable and immovable in the best interest of the federation.
- o To undertake, create and execute any trust, which may lawfully be undertaken by the Federation.
- o To borrow or raise money for the purposes for which the Federation has been constituted.
- o To render financial assistance, as and when possible, to its members to further the objects of the Federation.



- o To liaise and cooperate with Government and other organisation, private bodies and clubs for the promotion and development of any one or more of the objectives of the Federation.
- o Generally, to do all acts necessary and expedient for the promotion of any of the above objectives or any other objectives which are ancillary and/or incidental to the above objectives or to any one of them that will further the general purposes of the Federation.

RAISING OF FUNDS

In its capacity as the custodian of the Sport of Equestrian in India it is the exclusive responsibility of the EFI solely to **generate and utilise, allocate** the generated Funds and revenues and property of the EFI only for the purpose and objectives of the EFI as stated above and as per the EFI Statutes and Branding Guidelines and Policies as issued/amended by the EFI from time to time and to ensure guarding such interest against any abuse and maintain transparency in its association process.

FUNDS UTILISATION GUIDELINES

For the purposes of guiding its representative and authorised partners below are the basic guidelines as approved and issued by the EFI with regards to the usage of the Funds and revenues as generated by the EFI by way of Sponsorships by leveraging the EFI brand, CSR and Donations:

1 . At the outset:

a. Other than EFI itself any entity desirous of acquiring EFI rights to host and organise EFI events including REL's (Regional Equestrian Leagues) shall not organise or execute any such event without the due approval/permission by EFI and fully in compliance with EFI guidelines and terms.

The right to grant such permissions and right to raise funds through EFI sponsorships/donation/CSR shall be exclusively of EFI.

2. Therefore all and any EFI events including RELs (Regional Equestrian Leagues) whether organised directly by EFI or via independent organisers as approved by EFI (OC) will be under the ambit of and subject to EFI's Brand Guidelines and Sponsorship Policies and shall be conducted in accordance with the terms an guideline of approval and permission granted by EFI.

3. As the custodian and owner of the EFI Brand and apex Equestrian body in India therefore for the publicity and visibility required to be provided to the sponsors of EFI's events suitable direction will be issued to the OC's by EFI. The EFI's decision and instructions will be final and binding on the OC.

4. The Funds so generated shall be expended and allocated proportionately based on the amount received from a sponsors on the following

Athletes/Horses



(a) Stabling charges at the OC's venue to be paid by EFI for EFI approved events to the OC at the rate of :

If the OC provides an area wherein the participants will build their own temporary shed, charges levied will be max Rs 500/- per horse to take care of electricity, water and cleaning charges thereof.

OR

If the OC provides a temporary stable constructed by them for duration of such event or a permanent stable, the charges levied will be max Rs 2500/- per horse.

(b) Vet expenditure incurred by athlete/owner/stakeholders to enable participation in only such EFI approved event upto a max amount of Rs 5000/- per horse per event may be disbursed subject to audit of bills issued by a govt approved agency only. This shall be done only for EFI approved events.

(c) A financial assistance for conduct of EFI approved events can be provided to the OC by EFI across the board:-

Eventing	INR 1,50,000 (Indian Rupees One Lac Fifty Thousand Only)
Show Jumping	INR 1,00,000 (Indian Rupees One Lac Only)
Dressage	INR 50,000(Indian Rupees Fifty Thousand Only)
Tent Pegging	INR 1,00,000(Indian Rupees One Lac Only)
Endurance	INR 1,00,000(Indian Rupees One Lac Only)

(e) REL - Incentive for REL shall be provided as per REL guidelines issued for each year as approved by EC of EFI.

(f) Training of athletes/officials/support staff :

(i) Coaching Camps for all categories of JNEC & Seniors for the Olympic Disciplines and training /exposure abroad.

(ii) Conduct of Clinics for officials for International /National level and for National level coaches.

(iii) Conduct of clinic for athletes.

(iv) Clinics (Online/Physical) for Accreditation of trainers, Grooms and ferriers with EFI.

(v) Expenditure on account of officials for EFI approved events.

5. The OC shall have the right to generate its own direct and independent sponsorships for the EFI events which shall be done with prior written approval of EFI and in accordance with the master guidelines and terms of approval provided by the EFI ("OC Direct Sponsors"), The OC in order to seek each such approval of the EFI shall declare the amount of sponsorship agreed to be received from the "OC



Direct Sponsors" (s) and the planned expenditure against such receipts from such sponsors.

6. The obligations to provide visibility and inventory space to the "OC Direct Sponsors" shall be that solely of the OC who shall offer and close on such deliverables within the OC's allocation as assigned to it by the EFI and shall be subject to approval of EFI.

7. The OC and EFI shall be independent entities in a principal to principal relationship and no approval granted shall authorise the OC to make or enter into any commitments for or on behalf of EFI and bind the EFI into fulfilling any obligations towards any OC Direct Sponsor or any other 3rd entity.

8. IT shall be the sole discretion of EFI to use the funds generated through sponsorship/donation/ CSR for the growth and development of Equestrian Sports as it may deem fit from time to time.

FUNDS UTILISATION APPROVAL PROCESS

- The responsibility of authorising such utilisation of the Funds generated by way of EFI Sponsorships, Donations/CSR shall lie with Sponsorship Committee subject to approval of EC.
- Written proposal/approval shall be sought for allocation of relevant Funds in accordance with EFI statutes shall be presented to EC of EFI by Sponsorship Committee.
- On receipt of such proposal Sponsorship Committee shall revert with its queries written and signed approval/refusal no later than 30 days.
- In the event of any default on following the above process and unauthorised utilisation of Funds. The concerned representatives shall be subject to Disciplinary action which shall not limit the right of the EFI to enforce civil and/ criminal legal action against the defaulter.

These Disbursement Guidelines shall come into force from 27 Mar 2022 and any other matters related to disbursement of EFI Funds defined under these Guidelines not covered under/provided for in these Disbursement Guidelines shall be solely addressed by EC through Sponsorship Committee and the EC's decision shall be final.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR EVENT ALLOTMENT

1. All events being conducted under the aegis of EFI are categorized as "EFI events" for which an OC can bid to offer their facilities to EFI wherein the infrastructure and requisite administrative support for conduct of event will be mandatorily provided by the OC. The EFI reserves the right to cancel or relocate the event with or without reasons.
2. The EFI expects all institutional/ club/unit members requesting for hosting an event to keep in mind that the WELFARE OF THE HORSE MUST BE PARAMOUNT and must never be subordinated to competitive and commercial influences.
 - (a) Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
 - (b) Every effort must be made to ensure that the horses receive proper attention before, during and after the competitions. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries and treatment.
 - (c) It is therefore important that the people involving in organizing the events must go through all requirements for the competition, keeping in view the technical guidelines and accordingly prepare for the show.
 - (d) The OC will adhere to FEI code of conduct on welfare of horses.
3. A corpus money of following amounts mentioned against the type of event including trials is to be deposited along with the bid (Bid without 100% corpus money will not be considered for event allotment):-

(a) Regional Event	-	Rs 2 Lac (Non Refundable)
(b) NEC of any discipline	-	Rs 1 Lac (Refundable)
(c) JNEC	-	Rs 2 Lac (Refundable)
(d) International Event	-	Rs 2 Lac (Non Refundable)
(e) FEI World Challenge (i) Dressage	-	Rs 50000/- (Refundable)
(ii) Show Jumping	-	Rs 1 Lac (Refundable)
(f) FEI Jumping Children's Classics	-	Rs 50000/- (Refundable)
4. All entry fees for events mentioned at Para 2 above alongwith entry forms will be forwarded to this Federation in original within 7 days of completion of the show. The rates of entry will be as given below:-

5. A Technical Evaluator (TE) at the discretion of EFI may be detailed to carry tech evaluation of the venue prior to the event. In case the OC fails to meet the tech and adm requirements for conduct of the event, the TE is auth to recommend cancellation of the bid to EFI and thereafter this NF's decision will be final and binding on all parties.
6. OC will ensure that all riders and horses participating in the horse show, are registered with the EFI and holding valid EFI Rider ID/EFI Horse Passport as applicable. A list of riders/horses who have not got the same renewed is available on the EFI website to be checked by the OC and entries accepted accordingly.
7. It is the responsibility of the OC to check the horses are entered in the correct grade only. Latest grading list will be obtained from EFI office two week prior to commencement of the event.
8. OC will ensure use of safety cups and electronic timers for all events.
9. The OC will also ensure that the EFI flag, medals, rosettes, timer, safety cups, EFI Show Jumping Set as per their requirement are collected from the EFI secretariat 2 weeks prior to commencement of National events. The flag and surplus medals/rosettes will be returned to Federation office within 4 days on completion of the show.
10. OC will be responsible for publicity of the event in consultation with EFI's PR Agencies and Secy Gen by releasing Media briefs for electronic and print media which shall be forwarded to this NF within 24 hrs of same appearing in respective medium as mentioned below:-
 - (a) Local dailies
 - (b) National dailies
 - (c) National Journals
 - (d) Social Media's like Facebook, Twitters etc.
11. (a) The OC shall forward each day the following to facilitate EFI's PR Agency to provide publicity:-
 - (i) 2-3 High resolution photos of event with name of Rider and astride participating in the event.
 - (ii) 2-3 High resolution photos of all medal winners with officials alongwith their names.
 - (iii) Any other information required by EFI for publicity through its PR Agency like video clips etc.
- (b) The OC will ensure that soft copy of manuscript results duly signed by jury alongwith result in excel sheet and photograph of each category of event incl photograph of winners to be emailed within 24 hours of completion of each category of event.



12. Live Telecast

(a) The OC shall provide requisite support in all facets to 1PlaySportsIndia for live telecast of events. The events to be live telecasted shall be done at the directions of EFI.

(b) The OC shall provide an MC for said purposes

13. The OC will appoint a person as a contact person to interact with the Federation on all issues connected with the Show. It is recommended that the contact person be also the Show Secretary and is available with the Organizing Centre one month prior to the Show and till completion of events. The directions issued by the EFI will be complied with by OC and show secretary failing which strict disciplinary action will be initiated.

14. Original result sheets duly signed by the jury alongwith photograph of complete event in a CD and other supporting documents for all events will be dispatched to the Federation office within 4 days of completion of show.

15. Veterinary facilities must be made available 24 hours in the camp, during the conduct of events at the show ground and is provided as per FEI/EFI guidelines.

16. First Aid and 2 x Ambulance with Doctor must be available during the conduct of events and for the duration of competition at the camp site

17. OC will ensure to place a stall of EFI souvenirs near the show ground/spectators stand for easy access of interested persons for complete duration of the event.

18. The Ground Jury, Technical Delegate, Course Designer & Veterinary Commission for all National and International events will be detailed by the EFI. The EFI in consultation with PGJ shall take decisions related to tech/Adm conduct of the event which shall be mandatorily followed by all athletes/coaches/stakeholders/OC etc.

19. The Federation will bear the expenditure of official detailed by this NSF as per details given below:-

(a) The travel expenses to and fro (as applicable), boarding, lodging & local transport for the TE who is detailed by EFI for technical evaluation of the show will be borne by the federation (as per para 4 above).

(b) Airfare (to & from), local transport, boarding & lodging for all FEI/EFI officials including EFI Rep and Foreign Judges if required, for the show.

(c) The EFI will provide remuneration to all National level and above civilian/Retd officials @ Rs 2500/- per day for the duration detailed/utilized for conduct of EFI/FEI events and will be paid on the culmination of the event.

(d) For all Regional Events, the OC shall obtain approval of EFI prior to their detailment for the event and their expenditure will be undertaken by the OC.

20. The OC will conduct all Tent Pegging disciplines as per EFI /ITPF rules.



21. The Bid Evaluation Committee will scrutinize all bids received and recommend allotment of events to the organizer. The decision of the EFI will be final and this NF reserves the right to reject a bid with or without reasons. In such cases, the advance of the corpus money may be refunded.

22 In case of any coaching camp is required to be conducted prior to the Show, the OC will make all arrangements for it as directed by EFI. Instruction for same will be issued separately by EFI.

Sponsorship Policy

23. (a) The OC shall abide by EFI sponsorship policy in totality and without representation. The EFI reserves exclusive rights to raise funds through sponsorship/donations/ Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) for conduct of events under its name wherein an OC through existing Bid procedure may be permitted to conduct an event on behalf of EFI at any of their venues. The OC shall mandatorily provide all support to the EFI's sponsorer during conduct of the event to provide publicity as required by EFI .

(b) The OC can generate own sponsorships which shall be done with prior approval of EFI without any legal obligation for EFI. The OC in this case needs to declare the amount received and planned expenditure for which approval of EFI is required. All inhouse venue partner's sponsorer shall not be provided any placement for publicity in line with EFI's sponsorer but through OC's placements only subject to approval of EFI.

24 In case of any dispute/ clarity, the OC will only approach the Secy Gen and the decision given by EFI will be final and binding.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR EVENT ALLOTMENT

1. All events being conducted under the aegis of EFI are categorized as "EFI events" for which an OC can bid as a venue partner of EFI wherein the infrastructure and requisite administrative support for conduct of event will be mandatorily provided by the OC. The EFI reserves the right to cancel or relocate the event with or without reasons.
2. A corpus money amounting to Rs 50000/- (Refundable) for the event will be deposited along with the bid (Bid without 100% corpus money will not be considered for event allotment).
3. A Technical Evaluator (TE) at the discretion of EFI may be detailed to carry tech evaluation of the venue prior to the event. In case the OC fails to meet the tech and adm requirements for conduct of the event, the TE is auth to recommend cancellation of the bid.
4. In case the OC fails to meet the technical & administrative requirement for conduct of the show, the EFI Rep will recommend cancellation of the show. The Federation reserves the right to cancel the event with or without reasons. In event of such cancellation, the organizer will forfeit their corpus money.
5. It is the responsibility of the OC to ensure that Junior, Children-I and Children II participate in their age group only.
6. The OC will also ensure use of safety cups and electronic timers for all Show Jumping and Tent Pegging events respectively.
7. The OC will appoint a person as a contact person to interact with the Federation on all issues connected with the REL event. It is recommended that the contact person is also the Show Secretary and is available with the OC one month prior to the Show and till completion of events.
8. The OC will ensure that soft copy of manuscript results duly signed by jury and EFI Rep alongwith result in excel sheet is emailed within 24 hours of completion of each category of event.
9. Original result sheets alongwith photograph of complete event in a CD and other supporting documents duly signed by the jury and EFI Rep for all events will be dispatched by post to the Federation office within 2 days of completion of show.
10. Veterinary facilities must be made available 24 hours in the camp and during the conduct of events at the show ground.
11. The OC will ensure welfare of horse as given in Note 1& 2 of Appendix F and FEI code of conduct on the subject.
12. First aid & Ambulance with Doctor must be available during the conduct of events and camp.



13. The Ground Jury and other officials for all events will be detailed from EFI empanelled official list and as per terms of Para 5 of REL Guidelines.
14. The travel expenses to and fro (as applicable), boarding, lodging & local transport for the all officials, EFI Rep and TE (if detailed as per para 2 above) who are nominated by EFI to check the smooth conduct of the show, will be mandatorily borne by the organizer.
15. The OC will provide remuneration to all National level and above civilian/Retd officials and EFI Rep @ Rs 2500/- per day for the duration detailed/utilized for conduct of events and will be paid before the culmination of the event. The same will be communicated to this NF prior to completion of the event.
16. The OC of Tent Pegging will conduct all Tent Pegging disciplines as per EFI rules.
17. The BID to host an REL will forward to EFI as per para 15 of REL guidelines.
18. The OC shall forward each day the following to facilitate EFI's PR Agency for publicity:-
- (i) 2-3 High resolution photos of event with name of Rider and astride participating in the event.
 - (ii) 2-3 High resolution photos of all medal winners with officials alongwith their names.
 - (iii) Any other information required by EFI for publicity through its PR Agency like video clips etc.

Sponsorship Policy

19. (a) The OC shall abide by EFI sponsorship policy in totality and without representation. The EFI reserves exclusive rights to raise funds through sponsorship/donations/ Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) for conduct of events under its name wherein an OC through existing Bid procedure may be permitted to conduct an event on behalf of EFI at any of their venues. The OC shall mandatorily provide all support to the EFI's sponsorer during conduct of the event to provide publicity as required by EFI.
- (b) The OC can generate own sponsorships which shall be done with prior approval of EFI without any legal obligation for EFI. The OC in this case needs to declare the amount received and planned expenditure for which approval of EFI is required. All inhouse venue partner's sponsorer shall not be provided any placement for publicity in line with EFI's sponsorer but through OC's placements only subject to approval of EFI..
20. In case of any dispute/ clarity, the OC will only approach the Secy Gen and the decision given by EFI will be final and binding.

REGIONAL EQUESTRIAN LEAGUE (REL) GUIDELINES: 2022
TENT PEGGING FOR SENIORS AND SHOW JUMPING & DRESSAGE FOR JNEC

Introduction

1. The Equestrian Sports unlike other sports does not have Distt / State level championship due to lack of infrastructure, as a result of which many a time naïve horse-rider combinations have participated in National championships thereby diluting the sanctity of the National Level competition. REL concept has been developed to offer more opportunities to riders to participate in various competitions within the region and qualify themselves to compete at National level.

Objective

2. (a) Promote Equestrian sports at Regional Level by empowering Regional Members and regions.
- (b) Promote more organizing centre & venues to hold equestrian events.
- (c) Popularize the sports throughout the country.
- (d) Offer more competitions to horse-rider in their own region thereby reducing the burden of transportation cost.
- (e) Select riders worthy of participation at National level.

Concept

3. To achieve the above objectives, holding of Equestrian competitions at regional level is proposed on the lines of World Challenge Jumping (WCJ) for which the country will be divided into following zones: -

- (a) North Zone (J&K, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Union Territories of Chandigarh and Delhi).
 - (b) East Zone (West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and Orissa).
 - (c) West Zone (Maharashtra, Goa, Gujarat, and Rajasthan).
 - (d) South Zone (Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telengana and Puducherry).
 - (e) Central Zone (UP, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Uttrakhand).
 - (f) North East Zone (Assam, Manipur, Nagaland, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Tripura, Meghalaya and Mizoram).
4. Jury/Officials shall be detailed as given below for each REL to ensure that the desired levels are not diluted:-
- (a) A min of two Jury/Official as per EFI National list will be proposed by OC and approved by NF.
 - (b) EFI Rep will be detailed by NF. The EFI rep will forward a detailed report on the conduct of REL within 72 hrs of completion of the REL.



5. Course plan for Show Jumping will be provided by EFI as given in Appx A to D of these guidelines. The course plan for Show Jumping will be reviewed every year by an FEI approved Course Designer. EFI Technical Guidelines will be followed for conduct of the event.
6. The Dressage test for various categories is as given in Appx E to H. EFI technical guidelines will be followed for conduct of the event.
7. For Tent Pegging event, EFI technical guidelines will be followed.
8. The MER as per Appendix 'I' will be followed and rider must achieve 02 MERs to be eligible to participate in NEC/ JNEC.
9. To qualify for the Nationals, rider may participate in any number of competitions being held at various venues all over the country to achieve the desired MER. Individual has to obtain their MERs to participate in Individual, Team and Side Events at the NEC/JNEC. Riders holding valid Indian passport only will be permitted to participate in RELs. Other may be permitted as HC entry only for which prior approval of EFI will be obtained by the rider.
10. RELs will be conducted only for the following categories: -
 - (a) **Seniors:** Only for Tent Pegging.
 - (b) **Young Rider, Junior, Children I & Children II :** Only for Show Jumping and Dressage
11. Expenditure on account of travel (to & from event location), local transportation, accommodation & hospitality of officials including EFI Rep shall be borne by the organizers.
12. Organizers to use their own infrastructure. It is mandatory for OC's to conduct REL within the precincts of their own location as registered with EFI.
13. It is mandatory for the organizers to conduct vet inspection of horse before start of REL Events in view of welfare of horse.
14. **Period of RELs:-**
 - (a) RELs for JNEC will start from the 1st of January every year with the last REL conducted 30 days before the commencement of JNEC.
 - (b) RELs for Tent Pegging will start immediately after NEC Tent Pegging and last REL will be conducted 30 days before the commencement of next NEC Tent Pegging.
15. **Results.** The OC will ensure that scanned copy of results duly signed by jury and EFI Rep alongwith result in excel sheet is emailed within 24 hours of completion of each category of event. Original result sheets alongwith all supporting documents will be dispatched by post to the Federation office within 2 days of completion of show.

Incentive

16. Incentive will be given by EFI to a club once in a calendar year. Rs 50,000/- will be given if participation of over 25 riders and Rs 25,000/- to be given for less than 25 riders.



Procedure

17. Interested OC's may forward their Bids to EFI as per format Attached as Appendix 'J' duly recommended by their respective Regional Member and approved by Vice President (Sports Development). The same will then be submitted to EFI for inclusion in EFI REL Calendar atleast 30 days prior to conduct of REL. The refundable corpus money will also be forwarded alongwith bid form.

18. The Regional member prior to recommending the conduct of REL will ascertain that the venue is fit to conduct the REL by the bidding OC and will mention same on the covering letter to Vice President (Sports Development). It is mandatory for each OC to conduct one REL every three months as per period of RELs at Para 14 above otherwise no further REL's shall be allocated by EFI. The gap between each REL should be 30 days.

19. On allotment of the event, the same will be included in the EFI REL Calendar which will facilitate all horse-rider to plan their move to various venues and participate to achieve MER to qualify for respective NEC.

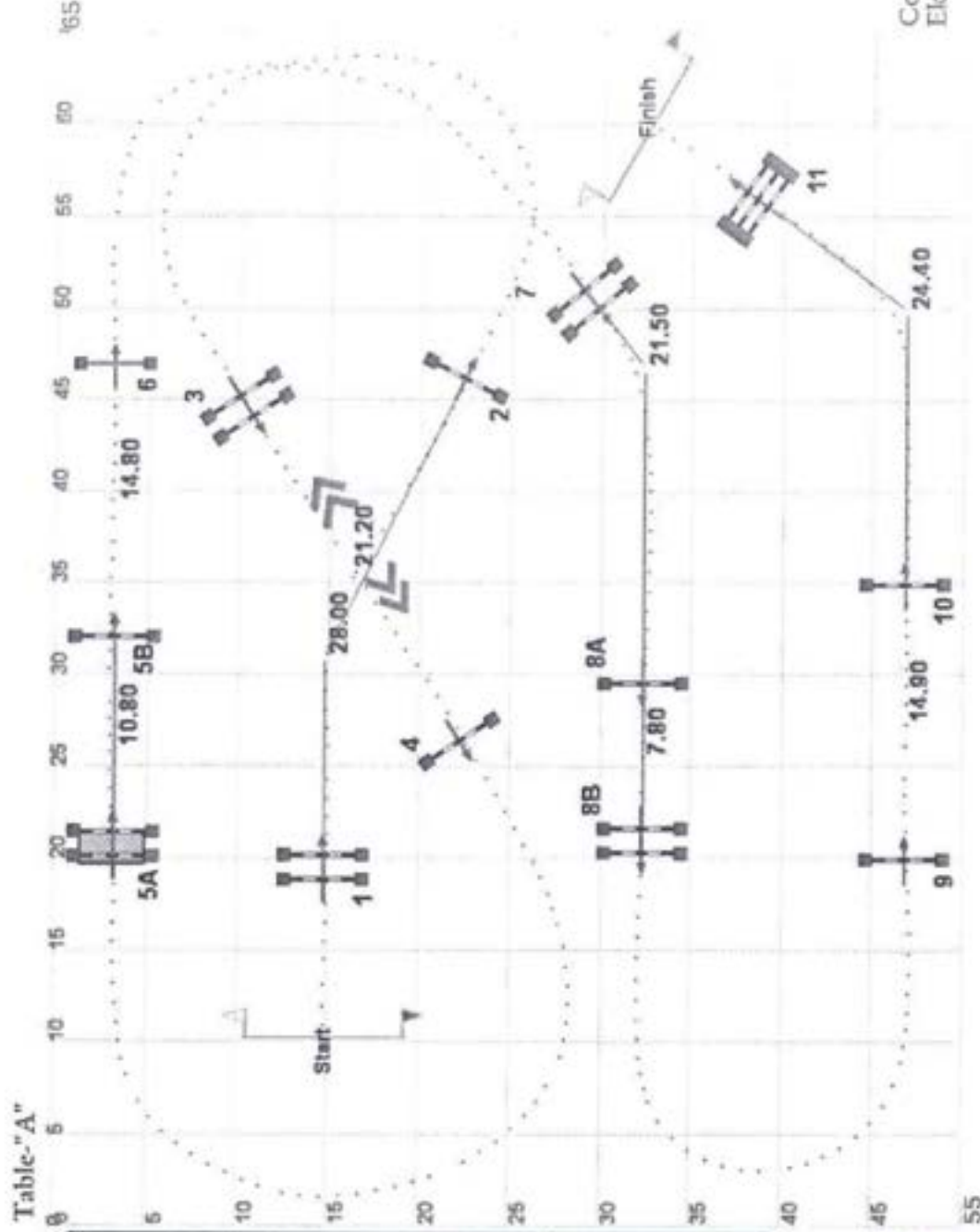
20. Organizers will have to deposit a refundable security of Rs 50,000/- alongwith bid form atleast 30 days prior to conduct of REL which will be refunded with incentive mentioned in Para 16 on successful completion of event. In case of non compliance of event as per EFI guidelines, the security deposit will be forfeited.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR EVENT ALLOTMENT

1. All events being conducted under the aegis of EFI are categorized as "EFI events" for which an OC can bid as a venue partner of EFI wherein the infrastructure and requisite administrative support for conduct of event will be mandatorily provided by the OC. The EFI reserves the right to cancel or relocate the event with or without reasons.
2. A corpus money amounting to Rs 50000/- (Refundable) for the event will be deposited along with the bid (Bid without 100% corpus money will not be considered for event allotment).
3. A Technical Evaluator (TE) at the discretion of EFI may be detailed to carry tech evaluation of the venue prior to the event. In case the OC fails to meet the tech and adm requirements for conduct of the event, the TE is auth to recommend cancellation of the bid.
4. In case the OC fails to meet the technical & administrative requirement for conduct of the show, the EFI Rep will recommend cancellation of the show. The Federation reserves the right to cancel the event with or without reasons. In event of such cancellation, the organizer will forfeit their corpus money.
5. It is the responsibility of the OC to ensure that Junior, Children-I and Children II participate in their age group only.
6. The OC will also ensure use of safety cups and electronic timers for all Show Jumping and Tent Pegging events respectively.
7. The OC will appoint a person as a contact person to interact with the Federation on all issues connected with the REL event. It is recommended that the contact person is also the Show Secretary and is available with the OC one month prior to the Show and till completion of events.
8. The OC will ensure that soft copy of manuscript results duly signed by jury and EFI Rep alongwith result in excel sheet is emailed within 24 hours of completion of each category of event.
9. Original result sheets alongwith photograph of complete event in a CD and other supporting documents duly signed by the jury and EFI Rep for all events will be dispatched by post to the Federation office within 2 days of completion of show.
10. Veterinary facilities must be made available 24 hours in the camp and during the conduct of events at the show ground.
11. The OC will ensure welfare of horse as given in Note 1& 2 of Appendix F and FEI code of conduct on the subject.
12. First aid & Ambulance with Doctor must be available during the conduct of events and camp.
13. The Ground Jury and other officials for all events will be detailed from EFI empanelled official list and as per terms of Para 5 of REL Guidelines.
14. The travel expenses to and fro (as applicable), boarding, lodging & local transport for the all officials, EFI Rep and TE (if detailed as per para 2 above) who are nominated by EFI to check the smooth conduct of the show, will be mandatorily borne by the organizer.



15. The OC will provide remuneration to all National level and above civilian/Retd officials and EFI Rep @ Rs 2500/- per day for the duration detailed/utilized for conduct of events and will be paid before the culmination of the event. The same will be communicated to this NF prior to completion of the event.

16. The OC of Tent Pegging will conduct all Tent Pegging disciplines as per EFI rules.

17. The BID to host an REL will forward to EFI as per para 15 of REL guidelines.

18. The OC shall forward each day the following to facilitate EFI's PR Agency for publicity:-

(i) 2-3 High resolution photos of event with name of Rider and astride participating in the event.

(ii) 2-3 High resolution photos of all medal winners with officials alongwith their names.

(iii) Any other information required by EFI for publicity through its PR Agency like video clips etc.

Sponsorship Policy

19. (a) The OC shall abide by EFI sponsorship policy in totality and without representation. The EFI reserves exclusive rights to raise funds through sponsorship/donations/ Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) for conduct of events under its name wherein an OC through existing Bid procedure may be permitted to conduct an event on behalf of EFI at any of their venues. The OC shall mandatorily provide all support to the EFI's sponsorer during conduct of the event to provide publicity as required by EFI.

(b) The OC can generate own sponsorships which shall be done with prior approval of EFI without any legal obligation for EFI. The OC in this case needs to declare the amount received and planned expenditure for which approval of EFI is required. All inhouse venue partner's sponsorer shall not be provided any placement for publicity in line with EFI's sponsorer but through OC's placements only subject to approval of EFI..

20. In case of any dispute/ clarity, the OC will only approach the Secy Gen and the decision given by EFI will be final and binding.

EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI)
GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

1. All Equestrian Federation of India (EFI) Members and all persons required to comply with the EFI Code of Conduct including functionaries of EFI, Officials, Coaches, Participants, Parents, Guardians and Spectators must meet the following requirements in regard to their behaviour in any way relating to the sport of equestrian (including without limitation during or in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EFI, and as part of any role held within EFI or any of its affiliates): -

- (a) Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in equestrian (including all participants, officials and administrators) regardless of gender, ability, sexual orientation, age, cultural background or religion.
- (b) Be aware of and abide by the Fédération Équestre Internationale (FEI) Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse.
- (c) Be fair, considerate, honest and act appropriately in all dealings.
- (d) Be professional in, and accept responsibility for, your actions.
- (e) When providing a service, seek to provide quality service.
- (f) Be aware of, and comply with EFI's standards, rules, regulations, by-laws and policies.
- (g) Avoid any conduct using privileged information to gain a personal or commercial advantage.
- (h) Respect the spirit of the rules of the sport (including, without limitation, national and international guidelines which govern Equestrian Sport, the member associations and the affiliated clubs) and fair play, and behave accordingly.
- (j) Not use your involvement with EFI, its member associations or affiliated clubs to promote your own beliefs, behaviours or practices where these are inconsistent with those of EFI.
- (k) Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with persons under the age of 18 years, as your words and actions are an example.
- (l) Refrain from any form of harassment, bullying, abuse, violence, intimidation or vilification of others, including via the use of social media.
- (m) Refrain from any behaviour that may bring EFI, its member associations, its affiliated clubs or the sport of equestrian into disrepute.
- (n) Not engage in conduct that is (in EFI's reasonable opinion) unethical, unbecoming or likely to cause harm to the reputation of EFI, its member associations or affiliated clubs or the sport of equestrian.



- (o) When providing an environment for the conduct of an activity, seek to provide a safe environment.

- (p) Comply with all relevant Indian laws (State), including anti-discrimination, occupational health and safety and child protection laws.
- (q) Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.
- (r) Be a positive role model.
- (s) Contribute to a safe sporting environment and respectful culture which is accepting of individual differences, and behave accordingly.
- (t) Use appropriately the facilities and equipment made available for events, administration, coaching and training.
- (u) Understand the consequences if you breach EFI's standards, rules, regulations and policies.
- (v) Condemn the use of violence or abuse in any form, whether it is by other spectators, participants, coaches, officials, volunteers or athletes.
- (w) Do not consume or be affected by alcohol or other substances such that it impairs your judgement or the safety of yourself or others.
- (x) Do not take, consume or be affected by illicit substances.



EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI)

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR FUNCTIONARIES, MEMBERS, OFFICIALS AND ORGANISERS

1. In addition to the EFI General Code of Conduct, all EFI Members and persons acting as functionaries, members, officials and organisers of EFI or its affiliates, must meet the following requirements regarding their conduct and behaviour in any way relating to the sport of equestrian (including without limitation during or in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EFI, and as part of any role as an functionaries, members, officials and organisers):-

- (a) Seek to resolve conflicts fairly and promptly through established procedures.
- (b) Be aware of and abide by the principles of the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse.
- (c) Act impartially.
- (d) Be aware of and comply with EFI's standards, rules, regulations, by-laws and policies.
- (e) Be professional in all actions. Language, presentation, manner and punctuality should reflect high standards.
- (f) Do not accept or participate in any form of bribery or corruption.
- (g) Accept responsibility for all actions taken.
- (h) Be aware of their legal responsibilities.
- (j) Be aware of the legal rights of others.
- (k) If unsure of the applicable rules or procedures that should be followed, seek further advice prior to proceeding.
- (l) Document all relevant complaints and the manner in which they were handled.
- (m) Never use their position or role to avoid responsibility or to unjustly prevent an individual from exercising their rights.
- (n) Seek to preserve and protect the standing and reputation of EFI and its affiliates.



EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI)

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARTICIPANTS

1. In addition to the EFI General Code of Conduct, participants must meet the following requirements regarding their conduct and behaviour during or in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EFI or its affiliates: -

- (a) Be aware of and abide by the principles of the EFI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse.
- (b) Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others, including fellow participants, coaches, officials, volunteers and spectators.
- (c) Do not act inappropriately or aggressively.
- (d) Display and foster respect for officials, opponents, coaches, administrators, parents and spectators.
- (e) Respect the talent, potential and development of fellow participants.
- (f) Be frank and honest with your coach concerning illness and injury and your ability to train fully in accordance with relevant requirements.
- (g) Avoid inappropriate intimate relationships with your coach.
- (h) Conduct yourself in a responsible and appropriate manner relating to language, temper and punctuality. Be courteous, kind and set a good example in dress and behaviour.
- (j) Maintain high personal behaviour standards at all times.
- (k) Abide by the rules and respect the decision of officials.
- (l) Make any appeals through the formal process and respect the final decision.
- (m) Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training.
- (n) Work equally hard for yourself and your team.
- (o) Cooperate with coaches and staff in development of programs.



EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI)

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

1. In addition to the EFI General Code of Conduct, parents/guardians of participants must meet the following requirements regarding their conduct and behaviour during or in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EFI or one of its affiliates:-

- (a) Remember that your child participates in sport for their own enjoyment and development, not yours.
- (b) Focus on your child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- (c) Never ridicule or abuse your child or other participants.
- (d) Show appreciation and respect for the performance and skilful performance by all participants.
- (e) Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility, especially when dealing with or in the vicinity of persons under the age of 18 years, as your words and actions are an example.
- (f) Encourage your child to participate always according to the rules.
- (g) Ensure appropriate levels of parent / guardian supervision of your child while they are participating in any activity held or sanctioned by EFI or one of its affiliates.
- (h) Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- (j) Do not physically or verbally abuse or harass anyone associated with the sport (including any participant, coach, umpire, officials and functionaries of EFI).
- (k) Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- (l) Be courteous in communications with administrators, officials, coaches and participants, and teach your child to do the same.



EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI)

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

1. Spectators at any activity held or sanctioned by EFI must meet the following requirements regarding their conduct and behaviour during any such activity or event:

- (a) Respect the decisions of officials and encourage others to do the same.
- (b) Never ridicule or abuse a participant.
- (c) Show appreciation and respect for the performance and skills of all participants.
- (d) Do not use violence, harassment or abuse in any form (including without limitation, do not use foul language, sledge or harass participants, coaches, officials or other spectators).
- (e) Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.



EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA (EFI)

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR COACHES

1. In addition to the EFI General Code of Conduct, EFI Coaches must meet the following requirements and behaviour in any way relating to the sport of equestrian (including without limitation during or in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EFI, or as part of any coaching role appointed by EFI or one of its affiliates): -

- (a) Place the safety and welfare of the athletes/participants above all else.
- (b) Be aware of and abide by the principles of the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse.
- (c) Operate within the rules.
- (d) Act with integrity and objectivity, and accept responsibility for your decisions and actions.
- (e) Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and experience of the horse and the athlete.
- (f) Be a positive role model.
- (g) Accept responsibility for all actions taken.
- (h) Respect the talent and commitment of each athlete and their horse and seek to develop their potential.
- (i) Treat each athlete and horse as a unique individual.
- (j) Respect fellow coaches and their students and encourage athletes to do likewise.
- (k) Learn as much as possible about the sport, and keep up to date with developments.
- (l) Ensure that the time spent with you is positive and self-enhancing for the athlete.
- (m) Never deceive or mislead the athlete.
- (n) Be dignified and controlled and teach athletes to be likewise.
- (o) Actively discourage the use of drugs prohibited by the WADA/NADA, EFI and the FEI.
- (p) Discourage the use of cruel or injurious training methods and set a good example with your own training methods.
- (q) Teach the athlete that the rules of the sport are mutual agreements which no one should evade or break. It is the duty of the coach to know and abide by EFI and the FEI rules and to encourage compliance in spirit and in deed.



- (r) Respect the decisions of officials and encourage athletes to do likewise.
- (s) All students are entitled to and deserve equal time in group lessons.
- (t) Follow the advice of medical and veterinary practitioners when dealing with injured athletes and horses.
- (u) When coaching young athletes make only reasonable demands on their time, energy and enthusiasm.
- (v) Always consider the maturity level of any young athlete.
- (w) Avoid inappropriate intimate relationships with athletes/participants. Do not engage in any form of personal abuse towards your athletes.
- (x) Do not engage in any form of harassment in relation to your athletes.
- (y) Any physical contact with your athletes should be:
 - (i) Appropriate to the situation;
 - (ii) Necessary for the athlete's skill development.

Working Group Recommendations

Appendix H - FEI Officials' Code of Conduct

As an FEI Official I undertake to respect all FEI Rules and Regulations at all times, and in particular the FEI Code of Ethics and Conflict of Interest Policy and the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse.

I am aware that I am a representative of the FEI while officiating at any FEI Event (hereinafter the "Event/s"). I am also conscious of my role as an authority and of the associated obligation to have adequate knowledge of the principles of equestrian sport and the relevant FEI Rules and Regulations, and to apply them at all times in a fair and consistent way.

I will fulfill all FEI requirements (including maintaining the necessary qualification) relevant to each Event to which I am appointed.

While I am officiating:

- I will act in an appropriate and respectful manner towards humans and animals, paying constant attention to their safety and I will carry out all duties in a professional manner.
- I will refrain from consuming alcohol and I will not use any substances and/or medications that would impair my judgement.
- I will not compete at the Event.
- I will be willing to answer the questions of stakeholders (including but not limited to Athletes, Owners and Trainers, Organisers, Grooms and my colleagues). I will take the time to politely and objectively explain my decisions where possible.
- I will be familiar with all the relevant FEI Rules and Regulations and will be well prepared for every Event.
- I will cooperate with the Organiser of the Event and with my colleagues.
- I will be punctual and dress appropriately.



I commit to avoid any actual or perceived conflict of interest. A conflict of interest is defined as any personal, professional or financial relationship, including relationships of family members that could influence or be perceived to influence objectivity when representing or conducting business or other dealings for or on behalf of the FEI.

I will maintain a neutral, independent and fair position towards Athletes, Owners, Trainers, Grooms, Organisers, other Officials and stakeholders. Financial and/or personal interests will never influence my officiating duties and I will spare no effort to avoid any such perception.

I will not engage in nationalistic judging.

Activities that lead or may lead to a conflict of interest when officiating at an FEI Event include but are not limited to:

- Acting as a Chef d'Equipe or being responsible /co-responsible for selecting teams and/or individuals or training Athletes within a NF present at the Event, if the teams and/or individuals participate in a competition falling within the level and age group of the authority of the Official.
- Being the Owner/part-Owner of a Horse taking part in a competition that I am officiating at.
- Being in a situation of financial dependence or gaining financial profit from participating Owners, Athletes, Trainers or Organisers (excluding any payment(s) permitted under the FEI Rules and Regulations, such as per diems). The same rule applies with regard to National Federations or other organisations involved in the Event, if the dependence exceeds a regular employment. Employees of participating National Federations cannot act as President of the Ground Jury, President of the Appeal Committee, Chief Steward, Veterinary Delegates, or Course Designer at Official International Events, International Championships and Games.
- Having a close personal relationship with an Athlete competing in a competition that I am officiating at.
- Having recently treated a Horse competing in a Competition that I am officiating at.

On becoming aware of a potential Conflict of Interest I undertake to promptly notify the FEI HQ (or where the conflict only arises and/or is identified on-site, the President of the Ground Jury) of any of the above or other possible conflicts of interest or circumstances that may be perceived as such.



Conflicts must be avoided whenever practicable. However, conflicts may be linked to experience and expertise that is necessary to qualify Officials. The specific balance between conflict and expertise is regulated by the General Regulations and the relevant Sport Rules.

In the course of my duties or when representing the FEI I will refrain from making any public statements, including to the media or in social media, that might cause harm to the FEI or to equestrian sport in general. This includes statements that might create a perception of bias.

I will not place bets on Athletes and Horses competing at FEI Events or otherwise receive any financial or other gain as a product of a particular result.

The breach of any obligation assumed under this Code of Conduct and/or any breach of the FEI Rules and Regulations may lead to any of the following sanctions as stipulated in the FEI Rules:

- Warning letter
- Obligation to attend an FEI course and/or to pass an exam
- Fine
- Suspension from officiating duties (provisional or for a stated period of time)
- Removal from the relevant and appropriate FEI lists of Officials
- Any other sanctions as stated in the relevant FEI Rules or Regulations.



FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The FEI requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the Horse must be paramount. Welfare of the horse must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences. The following points must be particularly adhered to:

1. **General Welfare:**

a) Good Horse management

Stabling and feeding must be compatible with the best Horse management practices. Clean and good quality hay, feed and water must always be available.

b) Training methods

Horses must only undergo training that matches their physical capabilities and level of maturity for their respective disciplines. They must not be subjected to methods which are abusive or cause fear.

c) Farriery and tack

Foot care and shoeing must be of a high standard. Tack must be designed and fitted to avoid the risk of pain or injury.

d) Transport

During transportation, Horses must be fully protected against injuries and other health risks. Vehicles must be safe, well ventilated, maintained to a high standard, disinfected regularly and driven by competent personnel. Competent handlers must always be available to manage the Horses.

e) Transit

All journeys must be planned carefully, and Horses allowed regular rest periods with access to food and water in line with current FEI guidelines.

2. **Fitness to compete:**

a) Fitness and competence

Participation in Competition must be restricted to fit Horses and Athletes of proven competence. Horses must be allowed suitable rest period between training and competitions; additional rest periods should be allowed following travelling.

b) Health status

No Horse deemed unfit to compete may compete or continue to compete, veterinary advice must be sought whenever there is any doubt.

c) Doping and Medication

Any action or intent of doping and illicit use of medication constitute a serious welfare issue and will not be tolerated. After any veterinary treatment, sufficient time must be allowed for full recovery before Competition.





d) Surgical procedures

Any surgical procedures that threaten a competing Horse's welfare or the safety of other Horses and/or Athletes must not be allowed.

e) Pregnant/recently foaled mares

Mares must not compete after their fourth month of pregnancy or with foal at foot.

f) Misuse of aids

Abuse of a Horse using natural riding aids or artificial aids (e.g. whips, spurs, etc.) will not be tolerated.

3. Events must not prejudice Horse welfare:

a) Competition areas

Horses must be trained and compete on suitable and safe surfaces. All obstacles and competition conditions must be designed with the safety of the Horse in mind.

b) Ground surfaces

All ground surfaces on which Horses walk, train or compete must be designed and maintained to reduce factors that could lead to injury.

c) Extreme weather

Competitions must not take place in extreme weather conditions that may compromise welfare or safety of the Horse. Provision must be made for cooling conditions and equipment for Horses after competing.

d) Stabling at Events

Stables must be safe, hygienic, comfortable, well ventilated and of sufficient size for the type and disposition of the Horse. Washing-down areas and water must always be available.

4. Humane treatment of horses:

a) Veterinary treatment

Veterinary expertise must always be available at an Event. If a Horse is injured or exhausted during a Competition, the Athlete must stop competing and a veterinary evaluation must be performed.

b) Referral centres

Wherever necessary, Horses should be collected by ambulance and transported to the nearest relevant treatment centre for further assessment and therapy. Injured Horses must be given full supportive treatment before being transported.

c) Competition injuries



The incidence of injuries sustained in Competition should be monitored. Ground surface conditions, frequency of Competitions and any other risk factors should be examined carefully to indicate ways to minimise injuries.

d) Euthanasia

If injuries are sufficiently severe a Horse may need to be euthanised on humane grounds by a veterinarian as soon as possible, with the sole aim of minimising suffering.

e) Retirement

Horses must be treated sympathetically and humanely when they retire from Competition.

5. **Education:**

The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the Competition Horse.

This Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse may be modified from time to time and the views of all are welcomed. Particular attention will be paid to new research findings and the FEI encourages further funding and support for welfare studies.

EFI POLICY : RECOGNITION OF STATE/UT EQUESTRIAN ASSOCIATION

1. All State/UT Equestrian Association to be voluntarily affiliated and recognized by EFI should mandatory follow all rules and regulations on the subject issued by EFI.
2. The development of Equestrian Sports is the priority of EFI.
3. The EFI has been from time to time taking various steps and initiatives to promulgate good governance practices in the management of equestrian sport at various levels in pursuance of successive National Sports policies. These policies are based on basic universal principles of good governance of Sports movement and do not in any manner intend to interfere with the autonomy of the State/UT Equestrian Association in discharging their functions and duties.
4. The State/UT Equestrian Association may be registered in different states under the Societies Registration Act or the Companies Act and must be recognised by their State Olympic Association (SOA). Their authority to function as a State/UT Equestrian Association shall be dependent on compliance with EFI Statutes, rules and regulations.

Introduction.

5. The EFI attaches utmost importance to growth and development of Equestrian Sports for excellence in India. It has been endeavor of EFI to lay down procedure for effective coordination among various agencies involved in the promotion of Equestrian Sports and extend required infrastructure, training, other facilities to the sports persons for achieving excellence in the international events.
6. An emphasis on professionalizing and upgrading the administrative and financial management of State/UT Association.
7. Recognition of the role of sports promoters particularly in event management.
8. Each State/UT Association will have minimum 50% district association which are functional. These district association shall be formed through Institution/Club/Unit members who are involved in equestrian activity if any on voluntary basis to enable such State/UT Association to be considered for EFI's annual recognition. These affiliated Institution/Club/Unit members will function directly under EFI for all technical issues. In case the State/UT Association are derecognized by NF or in case where no State/UT Equestrian Association exists, these will function under EFI for all non-technical issues also.

Objective of Guidelines

9. The objectives of these guidelines are threefold: -
10. Firstly to define the area of responsibility of the various agencies involved in the promotion and development of sports.
11. Secondly, to identify State/UT Equestrian Association eligible for coverage under these guidelines, to set principles and to detail the procedures to be followed by State/UT Equestrian Association to avails EFI's assistance and recognition.
12. Thirdly, to state the conditions for eligibility to receive EFI's recognition.

Role and Responsibility of the EFI with reference to the State/UT Equestrian Association.

13. The rules and responsibility of the EFI involved in implementation of the guidelines are as follows:
 - (a) to determine the eligibility condition for recognition of State/UT Association.
 - (b) to determine quantum and scale of assistance to State/UT Equestrian Association.
 - (c) to lay down conditionalities which each State/UT Equestrian Association will have to follow if they wish to avail EFI's support and recognition.



- (d) to provide financial assistance to State/UT Equestrian Association for growth and development of Equestrian Sports in their State/UT respectively.

Recognition of State/UT Equestrian Association

14. The purpose of this is to ensure that State/UT Equestrian Association maintain certain basic standards, norms and procedure with regards to their internal functioning, which conform to the high principles and objectives laid down by the EFI.

15. A new system of recognition is required for all State/UT Equestrian Association wherein they are required to submit detailed documents for grant of recognition attached as **Annexure I** which would get automatically renewed in the subsequent years subject to submission of prerequisite documents as mentioned in **Annexure II**.



ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR RECOGNITION OF STATE/UT EQUESTRIAN ASSOCIATIONS1. Introduction

- (a) It has always been the policy of EFI to support and encourage the voluntary organizations for development of equestrian sports in the country.
- (b) Over the years, a flexible and federal structure of autonomous Institution/Club/Unit and State/UT Association bodies has already emerged for various disciplines of Equestrian sports.
- (c) Generally, sports body at State/UT level (hereinafter referred to as Association) should have volunteer District Association which in turn should have Institution/Club/Unit member with voting rights affiliated to it.
- (d) A few State/UT Association have already been recognised by the EFI for the development of equestrian sport in each case. They are yet to deliver with reference to growth and development of equestrian sport in their State.
- (e) Informally, the criteria for recognition of such Associations were based on experience gained in the process over a period of time to make it successful.
- (f) The present Guidelines are being issued, with a view to codify the requirements for granting recognition at the discretion of the EFI to these State/UT Equestrian Association.

2. Nomenclature and Meaning.

- (a) The Guidelines shall be called "The Guidelines for Recognition of State/UT Equestrian Associations".
- (b) Recognition shall mean recognition of the leadership of the Association in the growth and development of Equestrian sport in the State.

3. Eligibility to apply as State or a Union Territory Association.

- (a) The Association should have a legal status as a voluntary registered body, not being a proprietary concern or partnership firm and should exist and function for the sole purpose of the development of equestrian sports whose name it bears.
- (b) The Association should have an exhaustive written Constitution in unambiguous terms providing for its efficient functioning, in particular, election of office bearers, truly representative character of the General Body, protection of the interest of players, promotion of the sport, maintenance and audit of accounts, moving of no confidence resolutions etc.
- (c) The Association must have actively existed for more than five year on the date of application for recognition. Its various business meetings, as required under its Constitution, should have been duly held.
- (d) At the time of applying for recognition, the Association should have atleast 50% district association affiliated who are involved in equestrian activity and have voluntarily affiliated Institution/Club/Unit members with Voting Rights in quota of its functioning.
- (e) The tenure of office-bearers shall be for one term of four years. Each member of the Executive Committee, shall assume office on the following day of the conclusion of the Annual General Assembly in which the elections were held for the particular appointment and will hold office for a term of 04 years or till the next Annual General Assembly, whichever is earlier. All members of the Executive Committee except the President, Secretary General and Treasurer may serve a maximum of two consecutive terms at a time followed by a cooling off period of 02 years before being elected again to any post in the Executive Committee. Govt employees seeking to hold elective office in the State/UT



Association will comply with the guidelines promulgated by the Central/State Govt on the subject. In case of President, Secretary General and Treasurer the following conditions will apply with regard to re-elections.

- (i) The President can hold the office for a maximum period of twelve years with or without break i.e. three terms.
- (ii) The Secretary General and the Treasurer may serve a maximum of two successive terms of four years each after which a minimum cooling off period of four years will apply to seek fresh election to either post.
- (f) No office bearer of State/UT Equestrian Association shall hold office simultaneously, in any other National Sports Federation or any other State/UT Sports Association.
- (g) The State/UT Association should have the accepted mercantile system of accounting. The accounts should be maintained properly and audited annually by a registered Chartered Accountant.
- (h) The State/UT Association should have conducted, unless exempted for technical reasons, 3 RELs and Local Horse Shows for the three years preceding the year in which recognition is sought. These competitions should be organised as per EFI Rules.
- (j) The voluntary membership of the Association should be confined to the corresponding institution/clubs/units/ district units of their State who shall have the right to vote in any of the Association's meetings. Membership shall also be extended to individual/life members but without voting rights.
- (k) Institution/Club/Unit members affiliated with EFI shall form district association and only these district associations shall be affiliated with respective State/UT Association if they choose to do so.
- (l) At the State/UT level, there will be only one recognised Association for all five disciplines of equestrian sport of EFI. Only the duly recognised State/UT Association would be entitled to assistance as admissible from EFI. Only one State/UT Association from each State/UT shall be admitted as a member of the Federation, provided it has a minimum of 50% district association which are functional and involved in equestrian activities with Institution/Club/Unit members voluntarily affiliated to it while each affiliated Institution/Club/Unit member shall have a right to cast vote in the General Body Meetings of district association, no other class of Member(s) shall have any right to vote, in the Association's meetings. The option of Institution/Club/Unit members to join a District Association to form a State/UT Equestrian Association rest with them. In case they do so, then they cannot vote in EFI's Elections..
- (m) The State/UT Associations are required to intimate EFI well in advance about its General Body Meeting and other Meetings where election of office bearers and other important decisions are to be taken. Wherever considered necessary, the EFI will have the right to send its observer to the above meetings. The election guidelines notified by the EFI will apply. **(Annexure-.....)**
- (n) The State/UT Association shall update their accounts immediately after completion of the financial year and bring out annual report covering salient features of their activities during the year. The Association shall appoint a practicing CAG approved Chartered Accountant to audit their accounts. The records and accounts of the Associations will be accessible to the EFI and these shall have to be produced as and when asked to do so.



(o)

The State/UT Associations must hold a General Body Meeting at least once in a year and election whenever due for the functionaries completing their stipulated tenure of four years or in case of demise or resignation will be conducted.

- (p) The State/UT Association shall comply with all conditions laid down in these rules, including anti-doping code, prevention of age fraud code, citizenship criteria for selection of national team, prevention of sexual harassment, etc.

4. Application.

- (a) The Application for recognition should be submitted in duplicate in the prescribed proforma given at Annexure I and Annexure II for subsequent recognition. All the columns of application should be filled up in all respects. Attested/ True copies of all the required documents must be enclosed.
- (b) All other material information relevant to the issue of recognition should be submitted along with the Application. Nothing should be concealed which, if revealed later, would render the Association liable for cancellation or withdrawal of its recognition.

5. Granting of Recognition.

- (a) Recognition of a State/UT Equestrian Association shall not be a matter of right and shall be purely at the discretion of the EFI who may grant recognition subject to such terms and conditions as it deems fit.

6. General.

- (a) All correspondence shall be made at the address of the State/UT Association, as mentioned in the Application. Any change of address shall be promptly notified in writing to the EFI.
- (b) The Association shall abide by all the Rules of EFI as issued from time to time.

GUIDELINES FOR INSTITUTION/CLUB MEMBERS

1. The EFI shall accord membership under the following categories:-
 - (a) **Clubs:** involved in Equestrian activities like training and organizing competitions related to Equestrian sports which could be established by Government or civilian agencies. Government organization wherein horses and related infrastructure are on their strength thereby involving them in Equestrian activity. Form attached as **Appendix A**.
 - (b) **Institution:** Any organisation of an all India standing connected with Equestrian sport like Sport Control Board etc can be accepted as affiliated members with voting rights. Form attached as **Appendix B**.
2. The clubs should have office bearers to include President, Vice President and Secretary. These office bearers will form the managing committee of the club. Each club will have its own by laws which will be exhaustive in all facets and shall be approved by EFI.
3. All clubs prior to their registration with EFI will be visited by a panel of three EFI members to ascertain various parameters of the club which enables them for registration which are enumerated below: -
 - (a) Minimum 10 members registered with it.
 - (b) Minimum 04 horses of the club.
 - (c) They should have a proper office address
 - (d) Should have permanent bank account.
 - (e) Permanent stabling facility for each horse stable in an area of 4m x 3m per horse. The stables for horses should be dry and clean as per horse welfare protocols laid down by EFI.
 - (f) A qualified coach @1 per 20 rider/athletes for Novice & intermediate category of students/athletes
 - (g) Proper grooms @ one per two horses
 - (h) Affiliated with accredited Vet hospital for Vet cover for horses and facility for their hospitalization
 - (j) A Farrier on their payroll
 - (k) Training area should consist of:-
 - (i) An enclosed arena of 60m x 40m for Novice/Intermediate category of riders



- (ii) Show Jumping arena with soft footing min 60mx75m. Jumping Set/Practice Jump with safety cups as per FEI specification.
- (iii) Tent Pegging area minimum length of open ground 150m. Tent Pegging equipment to conduct Tent Pegging classes.
- (iv) Watering and Sanitation facilities for animals.
- (v) Lighting and security for training grounds
- (vi) Availability of animal feed/fodder at the club site and their storage
- (vii) Unloading and loading facility of horses at the club site
- (viii) Toilet facilities and parking area & traffic control at the club premises
- (ix) Medical Doctors on call
- (x) Notice Boards at club office for display of important information

4. Defense, Para military & Police units must have at least two horses on its strength (posted or attached) to be affiliated to EFI as Club member.

5. All clubs operated by Government organization, School Boards are not required to be registered with any agency. Other to be registered legal entity.

6. EFI will carry out a check prior to registration of clubs to ensure all parameters laid down in para 2, 3 & 4 above are complied with.

7. Each of these Institution/Club members shall have voting rights and can nominate candidate for election as mentioned in election by laws issued by EFI from time to time for election of NF functionaries.

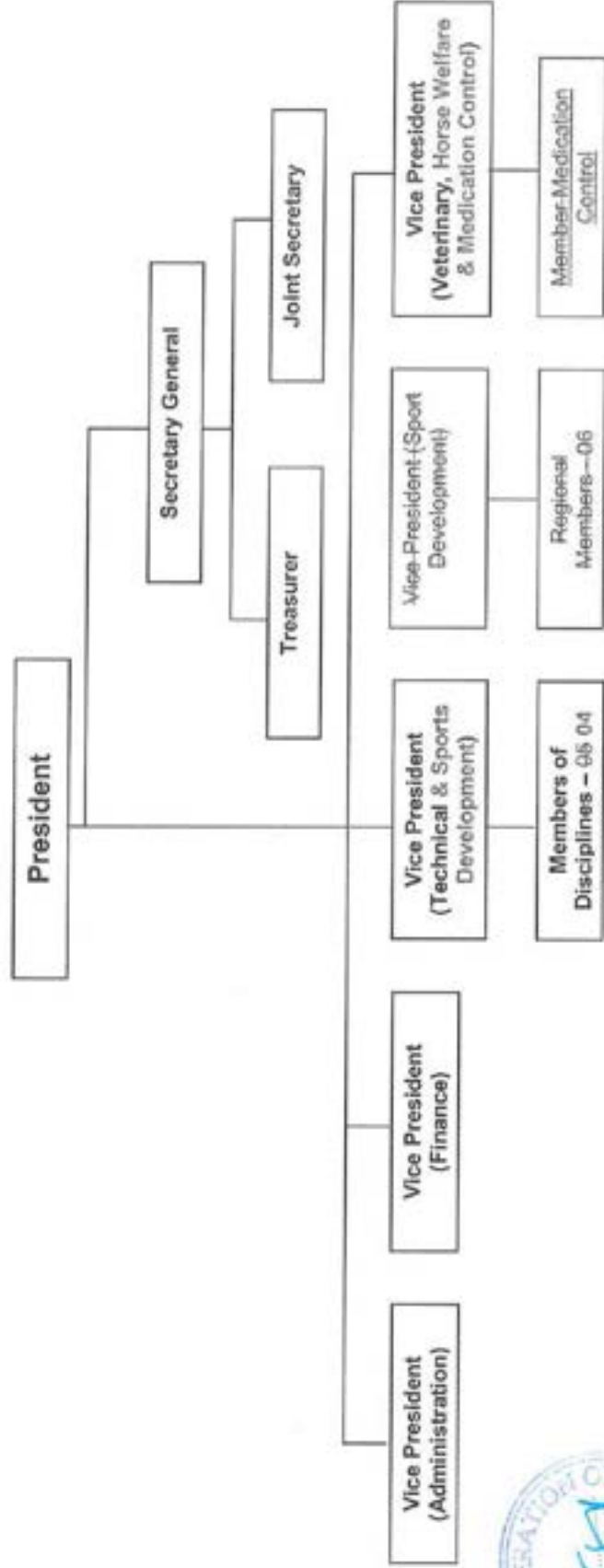

ELECTION OF OFFICE BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF MANAGING COMMITTEE OF THE EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION OF INDIA

ELECTION BYE-LAWS

1. Short Title & Definitions.

- 1.1 These Bye-laws shall be called the 'Election Bye-laws' and shall govern the conduct of Election of Office Bearers and other elected Members of Executive Committee of EFI.
- 1.2 In these Bye-laws, unless the context otherwise requires: -
- 1.2.1 'clause' and 'sub-clause' mean the clause and sub-clause of these Bye-laws.
- 1.2.2 'Managing members' means Member of Executive Committee of EFI.
- 1.2.3 'Form' means the Form appended to these Bye-laws.
- 1.2.4 EFI means Name of the Federation.
- 1.2.5 'Post' includes the office of President, Secretary General, Treasurer, Vice President, Joint Secretary and Member of Executive Committee of EFI.
- 1.2.6 'Rule' means the rule of Rules and Regulations of EFI.

2. Managing Committee.

- 2.1 The 08 (Eight) Officer Bearers (in addition to 04 (Four) Executive Committee members) shall be as follows: -

3. Manner of Election.

- 3.1 Office Bearers and members of Managing Committee of EFI shall be elected only by way of a secret ballot.
- 3.2 Election shall be held in accordance as per EFI Statutes with the procedure prescribed hereinafter, from amongst the authorised representatives of the State/UT Association, Institution / club members.

4. Electoral College.

- 4.1 Each State/Union Territory Equestrian Association recognised by EFI as its permanent member will have two Votes and the Institution/Club duly affiliated with EFI as its Permanent Member shall have one vote at the elections of the Office Bearers and Managing Committee Members. Individual Members or Honorary Members of the EFI shall not have any voting rights at the General Body Meetings of the EFI.
- 4.2 For the purposes of sub-clause (1), each permanent member State / Union Territory shall be represented by two members authorised by the President or Secretary General/Secretary of the affiliated Permanent Member State/Union Territory. Each permanent member Institution / Club/ shall be represented by only one member authorised by the President or Secretary General / Secretary or authorised signatory of the affiliated Institution/Club; however, in case President/Secretary General / Secretary nominates different person(s), the person(s) authorised by the President / authorised signatory shall be deemed to be the duly authorised person(s) irrespective of the date of authorisation. In case the nomination of the authorised representative has been duly approved by the Executive Council or the General Body of that affiliated member, the same shall be accepted as the duly authorised representative of the member unit.
- 4.3 Each Permanent Member State / Union Territory and each Permanent Member / Institution shall intimate the name(s) of their representative(s) mentioned in sub-clauses (4.2) and (4.3), latest by **14 days before the election**, and such intimation shall be addressed to the President / Secretary General of EFI on their letter head duly signed by President / Secretary General / authorised signatory of that member unit, so as to reach him on or before the aforesaid date; any change in the name of any authorized representative after **14 days** or any intimation received thereafter shall be permitted only with the approval of the President of EFI.
- 4.4 The Secretary General of EFI shall prepare the list of the authorised representatives of the Member States / Union Territories / Institutions / Club in **Form 1**, and circulate a copy of the list so prepared by him to all Member States / Union Territories / Institutions / Club, latest by (Day - 2 - e.g. 14th December), by display, on the official website of EFI.



4.5 The Secretary General shall also furnish a duly authenticated copy of the list mentioned in sub-clause (4.4) to the Returning Officer as soon as may be after his appointment by the President of EFI under clause (5) below.

5. Returning Officer. As soon as may be before / after the issue of the Notice for election alongwith the Annual General Meeting (AGM) / Extra Ordinary General Assembly (EOGM), the President or the Executive Committee of EFI through its Secretary General shall nominate a person as Returning Officer cum Election Commissioner for conduct of Election of Office Bearers and members of Managing Committee EFI, in accordance with the provisions of these Bye-laws.

6. Nomination of Candidates.

6.1 The nomination of a candidate for election as Office Bearer or Member of the Managing Committee shall be made in **Form 2**.

6.2 The nomination of a candidate for election as Office Bearer or a Member of Managing Committee shall be proposed by one of the representatives of Member States / Union Territories / Institutions / Club whose name is included in the Electoral College list in Form 1, and also subscribed by 01 (one) such representative as seconder.

6.3 Each candidate shall be entitled to be nominated by not more than 2 (two) nomination papers.

6.4 Each Nomination Paper shall be delivered personally to the Returning Officer in person by the candidate himself / herself or by registered post before due date from (Day — 3 e.g. 15th December to (Day-6 e.g. 17th December) between 11.00 AM and 1.00 PM.

6.5 No person shall be eligible to be nominated for more than one candidate for the same post, either as proposer or seconder; and, if he so does, his / her signature on the nomination papers delivered second in point of time to the Returning Officer shall be deemed to be inoperative.

6.6 No person shall be permitted to withdraw his / her name as proposer / seconder, once the nomination paper subscribed by him / her has been delivered to Returning Officer.

6.7 As soon as may be after 1:00 P.M. on (Day — 7 e.g. 19th December), the Returning Officer shall prepare a list of all nominations received by him, post wise, in **Form 3**; and publish the same in a conspicuous place in his office.

7. Scrutiny of Nominations.

7.1 On (Day-8 e.g. 20th December), at 11:00 A.M., the Returning Officer shall scrutinize each nomination paper, one by one, received by him, and determine its validity or otherwise.

7.2 As soon as it may be after the scrutiny of all nomination papers has been completed by him, the Returning Officer shall prepare a list of valid nominated candidates in **Form 4**.



8. Withdrawal of candidatures.

- 8.1 Each candidate whose nomination has been found valid on scrutiny shall be entitled to withdraw his / her candidature, from (Day – 8 e.g. 20th December) to upto 1:00 P.M. of (Day-10 e.g. 22nd December).
- 8.2 Notice of withdrawal of candidature shall be submitted in **Form 5**, either by the candidate himself / herself or by a person duly authorised by him / her in writing.
- 8.3 Notice of withdrawal of candidature shall be final and shall not be allowed to be cancelled.
- 8.4 The Returning Officer shall accept the notice of withdrawal if he is satisfied as to the genuineness of the notice.
- 8.5 As soon as may be after **11:00 AM** on the (Day 11 e.g. 23rd December), the Returning Officer shall prepare the final list of contesting candidates in **Form 6**, display a copy of the said list in conspicuous place and on Federation's Website.
- 8.6 The names of the contesting candidates in **Form 6** shall be arranged, for each post, in alphabetical order according to English alphabets.

9. Uncontested Returns; and Contested Elections.

- 9.1 Where the number of contesting candidates for any post or category of post, in **Form 6** is equal to the number of posts to be filled, all such contesting candidates shall be deemed to be duly elected unopposed to those posts, and it shall not be necessary to take a poll for election to such post.
- 9.2 Where the number of contesting candidates for any post or category of post, in **Form 6** is more than the number of posts to be filled, a poll shall be taken by secret ballot for those posts remaining unfilled.
- 9.3 The ballot papers for these posts remaining unfilled shall be in **Form 7** to **Form 13** to be made individually for each post.
- 9.4 The names of contesting candidates on the ballot papers shall appear in the same order as in **Form 6**.

10. Poll.

- 10.1 The Poll for the Posts remaining unfilled under clause 9.2 above shall be taken post-wise, on (**Day 16 – e.g 28th December**) and shall commence after the AGM / EOGM at the Agenda item Elections, at (**Venue of the Elections**).
- 10.2 At the Poll, each authorised representative of Member States / Union Territories / Institutions / Clubs, whose name is included in the Electoral College list **Form 1**, shall be entitled to :-

- 10.2.1 cast one vote for each of the post remaining unfilled, where only one such seat is to be filled.



- 10.2.2 cast as many votes as are the no. of seats to be filled for any post, where more than one seat is to be filled.

Explanation: It is hereby clarified that for the purpose of filling three seats of Vice-Presidents, each voter can cast upto three votes, and, like-wise, for two seats of Members of Executive Committee, he / she can cast two votes respectively for the above mentioned and two seats of Members of Executive Committee.

- 10.3 In case any voter casts his / her vote for more than one candidate, or for more than four or five candidates, as the case may be, his / her vote for that post shall be invalid.
- 10.4 Each voter shall be required, before he is supplied with a Ballot paper, to give his / her signature on the authenticated copy of the Electoral College list in Form 1 used by the Returning Officer for taking the poll.
- 10.5 The voter shall record his / her vote on the ballot paper in secrecy in a voting compartment specially provided for the purpose at the polling station.
- 10.6 The voter shall record his / her vote on the ballot paper by placing a tick mark () against the name of the candidate of his / her choice, and any other mark, like (x) etc. or word, placed on the ballot paper by him / her shall render the ballot paper liable to rejection.
- 10.7 The tick mark (✓) to indicate the vote shall be placed by the voter only by means of article specifically provided for the purpose by the Returning Officer, and a ballot paper marked otherwise by means of any pen, ball point pen, etc. by the voter shall render the ballot paper liable to rejection.
- 10.8 The ballot paper marked by a voter shall be deposited by him/her in a ballot box specially prepared and sealed by the Returning Officer and placed at such a conspicuous place in the polling station that it shall be constantly visible to all present in the polling station.
- 10.9 The Returning Officer shall close the poll at the appointed hour; however, all those voters who are present at the polling station at the appointed closing hour shall be entitled to vote even if the poll proceedings have to be continued for some more time.
- 10.10 After all the voters referred to in sub-clause (9) have voted, the Returning Officer shall close the ballot box and shall not permit thereafter any person to vote.
- 10.11 Polling will be done in below order: -

11. Counting of Votes.

- 11.1 The Returning Officer shall take up the counting of votes as soon as may be after the polling for any post is complete.
- 11.2 The Returning Officer shall take up the counting of votes, post-wise and category wise, where applicable.
- 11.3 Each ballot paper on which vote has been recorded in accordance with sub-clauses (10.3) to (10.8) of clause (10) shall be treated as one vote for the candidate for whom it has been validly marked; and if any ballot paper has been marked in violation of any of the aforesaid provisions of sub-clauses (10.3) to (10.8) of clause (10) shall be rejected by the Returning Officer.
- 11.4 The votes validly cast for each of the contesting candidates shall be counted post-wise, and category-wise where applicable, and recorded in the descending order of the votes so cast for each candidate in **Form 14**.
- 11.5 The Returning Officer shall thereafter ascertain the result of counting and, subject to the provisions of Rule 4 (a) (II) of the Rules, the candidates who have secured the maximum no. of votes in the said descending order, post-wise and category wise, where applicable, equal to the no. of seats to be filled for each post or category of posts, where applicable, shall be deemed to have been duly elected to those posts.

12. **Declaration of Results.** The names of contesting candidates who shall be deemed to have been elected at the election in accordance with sub-clause (11.5) of clause (11) shall be declared as having been duly elected to their respective posts, by the Returning Officer at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) / Extra Ordinary General Assembly (EOGM) in the **Form 15**.
