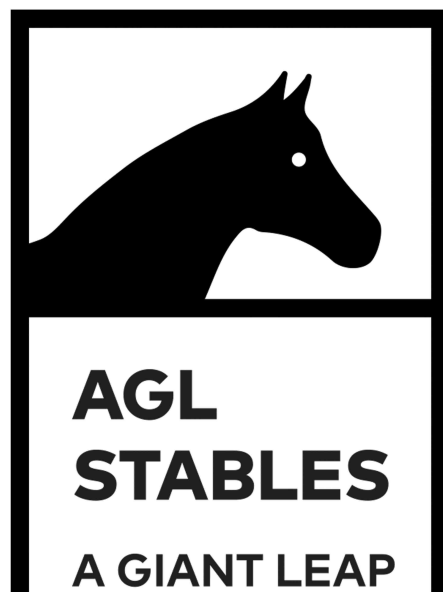

TRIAL SHOW JUMPING / REL JUMPING PROSPECTUS

General

1. The FEI World Jumping Challenge 2017 / YOG Trial 2017 / REL Jumping / 2nd Asian Games Trial Show Jumping will be conducted from December 3rd to 15th 2017 & will be conducted as per the rules of the Equestrian Federation of India at AGL Stables / ARG Stables, Chattarpur, New Delhi

2. EVENTS:

- a. FEI WJC 2017 – Category A, Category B and Category C
- b. YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES TRIAL – Through completion 3 of Category A of FEI WJC 2017 – Visit FEI website for details.
- c. REL JUMPING – Competition 2 round A and B of FEI WJC 2017 (Cat. B – Grade 3 REL and Cat. C – Novice REL)
- d. 2nd ASIAN GAMES TRIAL SHOW JUMPING – Will be organized as a separate competition as per Equestrian Federation Of India Guidelines.

3. ENTRY

- a. **FEI WJC 2017** – Entries for this event are to be submitted to Equestrian Federation Of India office latest by **November 29th 2017**. No entries will be accepted after the due date under any circumstances, as the same has to be entered through FEI IT Platform.
- b. **YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES TRIAL** - Entries for this event are to be

submitted to Equestrian Federation Of India office latest by **November 29th 2017**. No entries will be accepted after the due date under any circumstances, as the same has to be entered through FEI IT Platform.

c. **REL JUMPING** – To be submitted to AGL Stables as per **Appendix 'C'** by **December 1st 2017**.

d. **2nd ASIAN GAMES TRIAL SHOW JUMPING** – To be submitted to AGL Stables as per **Appendix 'C'** by **December 10th 2017**.

4. STABLING CHARGES

Campsite will be made available for setting up of camps. Limited temporary stables are available which will be allotted on first cum first serve basis at a charge of **Rs. 3500/- per stable** and bookings will be taken till **November 20th**.

Venue & stables will be open on **November 30th 2017**. Venue & stabling will close on **December 14th** and only horses participating in the **Asian Games Trial** will be allowed to stay till **December 16th 2017**.

ADMINISTRATION

5. Venue

All events will be held at The AGL Stables, B-7 Farm, Bhatti Kalan, Chhatarpur, New Delhi - 110074. Route chart of the same is attached as **Appendix 'D'**.

Venue & stables will be open on November 29th 2017. Venue & stabling will close on **December 14th** and only horses participating in the **Asian Games Trial** will be allowed to stay till **December 16th 2017**.

6. Camp

All horses will be stabled at The AGL Stables, Chhatarpur. Stables / camp area will be allotted by the organizing committee to all teams depending on the no of horses per team. All horse handlers are permitted to stay along with the horses in temporary accommodation earmarked for the same. All teams are requested to share the number of horses/ handlers per contingent that are likely to come, latest by **25th NOVEMBER 2017** with the show secretary / camp in charge via E-mail.

Temporary Stables Charges – Rs. 3500 per stable.

Venue & stables will be open on November 29th 2017. Venue & stabling will close on **December 14th** and only horses participating in the **Asian Games Trial** will be allowed to stay till **December 16th 2017**.

7. Self-containment

In addition to the above all teams must be self-contained in terms of tentage, equipment for camping and transport in order to be prepared for any unforeseen emergency.

8. Ration /Fodder

All teams should bring their own feed, hay, bedding, grass, etc. for their horses and should make their own provision for staff food. AGL stables will not provide any assistance for the above unless special facilities are being provided for all teams.

9. Coggin's and Glanders Test

All rules and instructions issued from the EFI on this subject will be strictly adhered to by all participating teams. All teams must produce a valid negative EIA and Glanders status certificate on arrival with a validity of a minimum of 15 days on arrival.

10. Veterinary commission

The Veterinary Commission detailed by Equestrian Federation Of India will have the right to examine all the horses participating.

12. **Farrier** All teams & riders are responsible to arrange their own farrier. AGL Stables will not provide any assistance.

13. **Medical cover**

The organizing committee will provide first aid and ambulance at the venue, however the organizing committee shall not accept any liability for medical treatment given to a competitor on the venue or the consequences thereof. Each rider participating in the AGL Regional Equestrian League will fill the Indemnity Bond attached as **Appendix 'A'** and submit the same along with entry form.

14. **Insurance**

The organizing committee recommends units/club to take insurance policies for competitors, personnel, grooms & horses for their transportation to AGL Stables & during the conduct of the events. The organizing committee will assume no responsibility for any accident or illness due to fall of any horse, competitors, and groom/ any other member of the team.

15. **Responsibility**

The organizing committee accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury to any animal or any other property or the exhibitors themselves.

16. Clearance Certificate

All horse owners /riders are required to obtain a clearance certificate from the organizing committee during working hours. All concerned accounts need to be cleared before they can obtain the same. No horses/ Person will be allowed to leave the camp by the Camp In charge unless they obtain the clearance certificate.

19. Entries

(a) All entries will be on proper Entry Form as given at **Appendix 'C'** for the AGL Regional Equestrian League and should be completed in all respect.

Entries not on the prescribed entry form will not be considered.

(b) **Entry Fee** Entry fees for AGL REL events and 2nd Asian Trial Show Jumping will be sponsored by AGL Stables.

(c) **Closing date for Entries:** Entries for FEI WJC 2017 and YOG Trials will close on November 29th 2017. AGL Regional Equestrian League entries will be accepted till December 1st 2017 and Asian Games Trial entries will be accepted till December 10th 2017. Entries received thereafter will not be accepted under any circumstances.

(d) **FEI WJC HORSE DECLARATION:** Participants with more than one horse need to fill the FEI horse declaration form and submit to the organizing committee before the VET Check as per **Appendix 'E'**.

(e) **Description and Registration of Horses;** All entries must give description, EFI Registration/Passport/Show Number, name & year of birth of the horse.

20. **EFI Horses Passport**

As per EFI rules all horses participating in the all EFI events must have the new 'H' series valid EFI passport in original. Entries will not be accepted without the EFI Registration/Passport/Show Number of the horse.

21. **EFI Rider Registration**

- (a) All riders participating in any EFI event must have a valid/renewed EFI Rider Identification Number.
- (b) Riders not having renewed EFI rider ID number will not be permitted to participate.

22. **FEI Rider Registration**

All riders competing in FEI WJC 2017 and YOG Trial 2017 must obtain/renew their FEI rider ID to be eligible to participate.

23. **Grading of Horses**

It will be the responsibility of the participant to ensure that their horses are entered in the correct grade as per the latest updated list available on www.efinf.org. Entries of the horses in the wrong grade will lead to elimination from that event and disqualification from the entire horse show.

24. **Withdrawal, Change, Transfer or Substitutions of Entry**

- (a) **Withdrawal;** The entry fee of a horse will not be refunded if the horse does not participate in the class.
- (b) **Transfer and Substitutions;** A horse cannot be transferred from one class to another without paying an additional entry fee for the class to which is transferred. A horse once entered in any event cannot be substituted by another horse for any reason whatsoever.
- (c) **Change of Riders;** Riders cannot be changed unless the Jury accepts that there are sufficient reasons for change of riders. All changes will be treated as Post Entries. Once an event has started, being judged, no change in rider / horse will be accepted.
- (d) **Technical specification of events;** the events will follow broadly the technical guidelines of FEI and EFI as per relevant discipline. However, the organizing committee reserves the right to amend technical specifications for various events keeping in consideration prevalent weather conditions and local merits / climate in consultations with EFI.

25. **Cancellation or reschedule;** The Organizing committee may cancel or reschedule any class which has less than four entries or for any reason at their discretion. In that case, the entry fee will be refunded. However, depending on the numbers of entries received, the organizing committee may decide against this for any particular event.

26. **Reporting for Each Class;** All horses will report to the collecting ring Steward half an hour before the time of judging of the class. Any entry not reporting in time will be eliminated unless the exhibitor shows good cause for the delay. The Ring Steward has full authority to take disciplinary action.
27. **Show Number.** All horses will display the EFI Registration Number on the bridle during competition and veterinary inspection and whenever taken out of the stable under the saddle.
28. **Abuse/ Cruelty to horses.** Refer to Article 13 of EFI Technical guidelines
29. **Rosettes;** A horse will wear no rosettes during judging.
30. **Elimination / Disqualification;** the judges are empowered to disqualify the competitors at any stage of the competition for rough handling, or any type of cruelty to animals. Rapping will be severely penalized. Refer to FEI Rules for Jumping.
31. **Whips/spurs;** As per EFI and relevant FEI rules per discipline.

32. **Dress code**; when inspecting the course, dress must be neat and tidy. In any case, riding boots, white breeches, white or lightly colored plain shirts, white tie and Jacket must be worn. Service personnel will be in uniform. It is compulsory for anyone jumping a horse to wear a properly fastened hard hat with a three-point retention harness including riders in uniform.

33. **Appeal**; any competitor can lodge an appeal two hours before the commencement of any class and within half an hour after announcement of the result. A fee of Rs 2000/- (Rupees two thousand only) should be deposited with the org secretary along with the objection in writing. Money will be refunded if the objection is upheld.

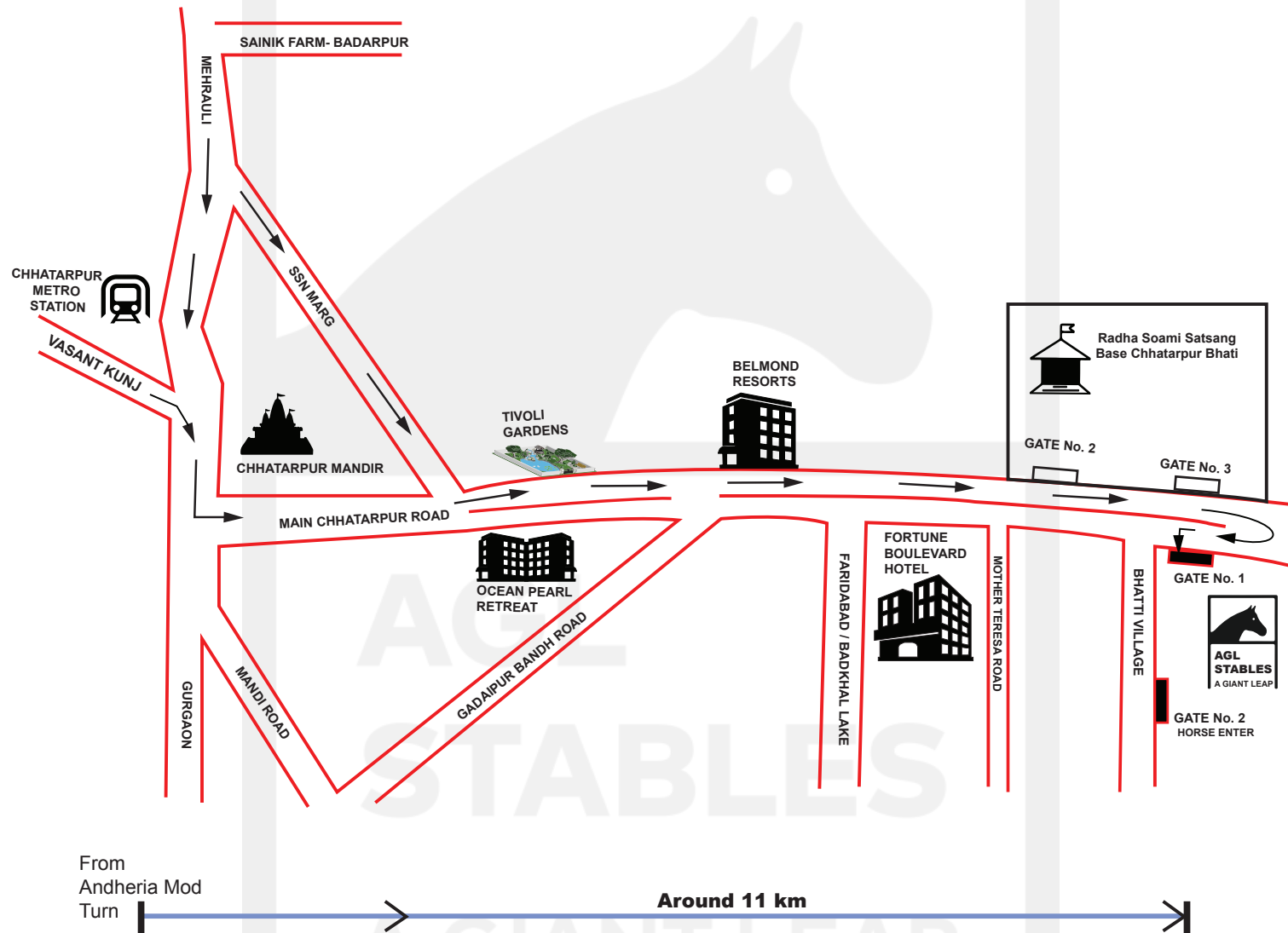

2017 FEI WORLD JUMPING CHALLENGE

Rules for Categories A, B & C

ARTICLE 1 - PRINCIPLES

- 1.1 The FEI World Jumping Challenge may be organised by any member NF of the FEI, except USA, Canada and Western Europe.
- 1.2 There are three categories, Cat. A (1.20-1.30 m); Cat. B (1.10-1.20 m) and Cat. C (1.00-1.10 m).
- 1.3 Category A, B and C each consist of **3 Competitions which will run under Table A, Art. 273.3.3.2, over two rounds either on the same day or over two days maximum.**
 - First round: Not against the clock.
 - Second round: Against the clock. Starting order in 2nd round: reverse order of penalties in the 1st round; Athletes retain their drawn order in case of equality of penalties - No jump-off.

There will be **two** different course plans (Round 1 and Round 2) per Competition run at 3 different heights. All courses will be designed by a Course Designer appointed by the FEI.

- 1.4 There will be an INDIVIDUAL ranking per Country, per Region and for the World for all 3 Categories.

In order to be in the rankings, an Athlete/Horse combination must compete in a minimum of two Competitions and in any case not more than three Competitions per Category. Only the results of the best TWO Competitions per Category will count for the rankings.

- 1.5 Placing: Athletes will be placed according to aggregate Penalties over both rounds and the time incurred in the second round of each Competition.
- 1.6 The size of the arena for all Categories (A, B and C) is **65 x 45 meters**.
- 1.7 The Category A qualifies for the World Final.
- 1.8 The Category A, B and C must be organised at outdoor Competitions between the 1st January and the 31st December.
- 1.9 National classes may be organised in the framework of the Challenge. All Athletes wishing to compete in both the Challenge and National classes organised on the same day, **may only do so if they FIRST start in the Challenge**.

ARTICLE 2 - HORSE INSPECTION

- 2.1 Horse Inspection: Any horse participating, must prior to participating pass a horse inspection carried out by an FEI Veterinary Delegate to be appointed by the OC in accordance with Article 280.2, FEI Rules for Jumping Events, 25th Edition, updates effective 1 January 2017 (refer to www.inside.fei.org > Jumping > Rules).
- 2.2 FEI GR Art. 137.2: As an exception to the FEI General Regulations, horses taking part in the FEI World Jumping Challenge competitions in their own country do **NOT** need to be registered with the FEI and therefore are **NOT** required to have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a mean of identification and to establish ownership.

All such horses must be properly registered within their National Federation and identifiable

by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

- 2.3 The Inspection must take place on a firm, level and clean but not slippery surface (VR Article 1033).

The horse must be walked and trotted on a loose rein.

- 2.4 The FEI Judge must be present and the Horse Inspection must take place, in principle, on the day preceding the Competition to allow for an eventual re-inspection.
- 2.5 It is the responsibility of the NF and/or OC to award a special prize to the best presented horse based on the Ground Jury & FEI Veterinary Delegate's decision.
- 2.6 Horses must be six years old or over.

ARTICLE 3 – PARTICIPATION

- 3.1 The three categories are open to all athletes from the beginning of the year in which they reach their 14th birthday for Categories A, B, & C.
- 3.2 A horse may compete with only ONE Athlete, in only ONE Category throughout the FEI World Jumping Challenge during the same year.
- 3.3 An athlete may ride in all 3 Categories with 3 different horses. In addition to his Individual results, if an athlete competes in more than one Category only the results of the highest Category will count for the Team ranking (see Art. 8.4).
- 3.4 Horses cannot be ridden by more than one athlete in one Category throughout the FEI World Jumping Challenge during the same year. Athletes may ride more than one horse in a category but the results of only one horse will count. This horse must be declared before the first round of the first Competition in which the athlete takes part. The athlete must complete the official FEI Declaration Form (available to download on the FEI Website, i.e. <http://inside.fei.org/fei/events/fei-world-challenge/jumping/downloads>) sign it and submit it to the OC. The OC must in turn submit this to the PGJ – all forms must be signed and submitted before the start of the competition. A copy of the form (with both signatures) must be submitted to the FEI with the results. The declared horse must be ridden first in all rounds of all Competitions. The results obtained with the other horses will not count towards the final standings.
- 3.5 Athletes having participated at CSI events (this includes Senior Regional/Continental Games & Championships/WEG/OG) in classes at 1.35m and higher are not allowed to compete.

An athlete that has NOT competed at the above mentioned level since more than 3 years is allowed to compete in the FEI World Jumping Challenge again.

This restriction does not apply to Juniors and Young Riders.

Other restrictions may apply based on National Federation's participation criteria. Athletes must consult the National regulations for such restrictions.

- 3.6 Any athlete that has competed in the Youth Olympic Games is eligible to compete in the FEI World Jumping Challenge.
- 3.7 The NF of the organising country may enter as many athletes as it wishes for each of the 3 competitions.
- 3.8 **As an exception to the FEI General Regulations**, in the World Jumping Challenge "Athletes Living outside their country of nationality" (as defined in the FEI General

Regulations) may compete for their country of residence. **They may also be members of their host country's team.**

Foreign Athletes from another Challenge NF or from a 'non-Challenge' NF may compete in the World Jumping Challenge under the conditions of Art. 101.2, FEI General Regulations. **Foreign Athletes may only compete for their country of sport nationality, and cannot be a member of the host country's team.**

3.9 Athletes and Horses participating in the FEI World Jumping Challenge do **NOT** need to be registered with the FEI.

3.10 **Category A, B and C:**

An athlete/horse combination eliminated in one competition of the Category A, B or C may start in the other competitions of the same Category.

3.11 **Category A, B and C: Draw & Starting order**

A draw for each of the 3 competitions will take place to decide the starting order.

The order of starting for all horses and athletes in the second round of each competition will follow the reverse order of penalties in the first round, whether horses are competing for FEI placing or not. In the event of equal penalties, athletes will start in the same order as in the first round of each competition.

In case an athlete is riding more than one horse, the declared horse must be ridden first in all rounds.

3.12 **Ponies:**

A pony or small horse NOT registered as a pony may compete in any FEI event as a horse. The rules for the category of event then apply as per the age of the equine and the athlete.

A pony registered as a PONY, can participate in Pony classes and in other FEI events at the discretion of the OC, however in such cases the age of the athlete must comply with the FEI Pony riders rules (no adults).

ARTICLE 4 - ORGANISATION

4.1 Each NF is directly responsible for the organisation and judging of the three Competitions.

4.2 Countries may organise Categories A, B and/or C. The Competitions may be held at different periods and places or simultaneously. However, a maximum of 2 out of the 3 Competitions may be organised consecutively over two days; the 3rd Competition must be organised separately – minimum one week apart

4.3 Countries may make a special request to the FEI in order to host one or more Challenge Competitions in separate locations. This will only be granted due to geographical locations, if the country is too large to have the whole competition in one venue.

See Annex I for example of Calendar Options.

4.4 **Category A:** The Ground Jury must be composed of a President who must be an FEI Judge for Competitions 1 and 2. For Competition 3, the Ground Jury must be composed of a President (FEI Judge) plus an FEI Foreign Judge (minimum 2* Level - for Youth Olympic Games qualifiers, see article 9.2). If there is no FEI Judge in the country, the FEI Foreign Judge will act as the President of the Ground Jury with a panel of national judges.

4.5 **Category B & C:** The Ground Jury must be composed of a President who must be an FEI Judge for all 3 Competitions. An FEI Foreign Judge is not required for these categories.

- 4.6 The Judge's Report must be completed and signed (an electronic signature is acceptable) by the FEI Foreign Judge for Competition 3 for Category A and by the FEI Judge President of the Ground Jury for Competitions 1 and 2 for Category A and for all 3 Competitions for Category B & C.
- 4.7 All Judges, both National and Foreign, must be jumping judges.
- 4.8 The FEI Foreign Judge must act as FEI Technical Delegate at the same time and make sure that all details in the course are in accordance with the published course plans.

ARTICLE 5 - THE COURSE

- 5.1 The penalties will be calculated according to the FEI Jumping Rules, 25th Edition (updates effective 1 January 2017).
- 5.2 The courses will consist of between nine and twelve obstacles including one or two doubles and at least two upright and two spread obstacles. **There will be no wall and no triple combination.** There will be no water jump, but obstacles which include a water ditch (called Liverpools) may be used.
- 5.3 The FEI World Jumping Challenge Course Plans are designed each year by an experienced FEI Course Designer appointed by the FEI.
- 5.4 The following maximum dimensions apply in the three categories. The width of obstacles must not exceed the height by more than 10 cm:

- 5.6 The competition arena must be enclosed (FEI Rules for Jumping Event, Art. 201 and Memorandum for Jumping Events, Section 3). The size of the arena for the World Jumping Challenge Cat. A, B and C is **65 x 45 m**. If built inside a larger arena, it must be either marked out on the ground or railed off
- 5.7 FEI Certified Safety cups must be used for all oxers, and all other obstacles wherever possible, including within the warm-up area.

ARTICLE 6 - PRIZES

The Organising Committee within each country is responsible for the distribution of prizes in the normal way (at least one prize per four athletes).

ARTICLE 7 – EVENT REGISTRATION

It is the responsibility of the NFs to inform the FEI on their intention of participation before December 1st the year prior to the competition by sending to the FEI, the "Application Form" posted on the FEI website (www.inside.fei.org > Events > FEI World Challenges > FEI World Jumping Challenge > Downloads). Dates must fit between 1st January – 31st December.

ARTICLE 8 - RESULTS

- 8.1 There will be an INDIVIDUAL ranking per Country, per Region and for the World for all 3 Categories.

In order to be in the rankings, an Athlete/Horse combination must compete in a minimum of two Competitions and in any case not more than three Competitions per Category. Only the results of the best TWO Competitions per Category will count for the rankings.

An athlete can only be in the rankings per Category once with the Horse Declared before the 1st Competition.

- 8.2 Results, horse declaration forms, judge's reports, FEI World Challenge Participation Lists, one copy of the competition programme, and some photographs and video of the competition if any, together with press clippings must be sent to the FEI immediately after the competition. Please use only the Excel sheet specifically designed for the results of the FEI Challenge. This can be downloaded from the "Downloads" section of the FEI World Jumping Challenge web page. Please submit the results fully completed in their original format (Excel) in order to facilitate result processing.

We then ask you to send, either by email, fax or by post, a copy of the results signed off by the Judges responsible.

- 8.3 Results for each Competition will be available on the FEI World Challenges IT Platform and the FEI will establish the final standings which will be published on the web site (www.inside.fei.org > Events > FEI World Challenges > FEI World Jumping Challenge > Results).

- 8.4 There will be a TEAM ranking per REGIONAL Zone. Each Team is composed of the 1st athlete per Category (A, B and C) in the NF. If a NF does not organize all 3 Categories, then it will not have a team.

Team composition:

A team must be composed of 3 different athletes.

The 1st athlete per Category (A, B and C) per NF will be part of the team unless the same athlete wins more than one Category. In this case only the results of the highest Category will count for this athlete. In all other Categories, the results of the follow up athlete in the placings will be taken into account:

If there are no other Athletes in the placings to ensure the Team is composed of three different athletes, then there will be no team.

8.5 There will be a WORLD TEAM ranking. Each Team is composed of the 1st athlete per Category (A, B and C) in each Regional Zone. If a Regional Zone does not organize all 3 Categories, then it will not have a team.

8.6 Only Category A qualifies for the World Final.

ARTICLE 9 – YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES (YOG)

9.1 The FEI World Jumping Challenge Category A will count as qualification for the 2018 YOG. NFs concerned wishing to host YOG qualifiers have to refer to the appropriate Qualification Rules and Procedures published on the FEI website, i.e.:

9.2 NFs wishing to host a YOG Qualifier must inform the FEI when sending in the Participation Form (see art. 7).

FEI Foreign Judges for the Cat A of all YOG Qualification Competitions will be appointed by the FEI.

9.3 Athletes will qualify their NOC through **COMPETITION 3** of Category A (the FEI approved course plans for Competition 3 must be used in order for the results to be valid). A special ranking will be published after all YOG Qualification competitions have taken place.

ARTICLE 10 - INFORMATION TO BE SENT TO THE FEI

10.1 **TWO MONTHS prior to the competition:**

A. CONFIRMATION OF COMPETITIONS DATES – before December 1st the year prior to the competitions.

B. NAME & STATUS OF PGJ (FEI JUDGE) FOR CATEGORY A, B & C (+ e-mail & mobile)

C. NAME & STATUS OF FEI FOREIGN JUDGE FOR CATEGORY A, Competition 3 only (+ e-mail & mobile)

Last minute changes are not allowed!!

BEFORE THE COMPETITION:

NFs/OC must if necessary **create** the athletes and horses' profiles in the FEI World Challenges IT Platform (<http://worldchallenges.inside.fei.org/login>) and then **enter** them in the corresponding Category.

Entries will be **open** two weeks prior to the Event and will **close** one day prior to the Event.

10.2 **Immediately after the competition:** Results to be entered on the official FEI World Challenges IT Platform (<http://worldchallenges.inside.fei.org/login>); Individual results of each athlete that has started must be provided.

10.3 **No later than 14 days after the competition:**

- One copy of the competition programme, including start lists.
- Copy of the results signed by the official FEI Judges
- Copies of all forms used to declare the official horse when an athlete rides more than one horse. These forms must be signed by the athlete and the Foreign Judge (or President of the Ground Jury). It must be remembered that only one horse can count for the standings and that **this horse must be declared before the start of the first round of the first Competition and must be ridden first in each first round.**

- The FEI Judge's report.
- Photographs of the competition **with names of all the people figuring on them clearly written in English, either on the back of the photographs, or on a separate list.**
- Press clippings relating to the competition.

ARTICLE 11 – DRESS & SADDLERY

Please refer to Articles 256 and 257 of the FEI Rules for Jumping Events, 25th Edition, updates effective 1 January 2017, for all rules on dress and saddlery.

ARTICLE 12 – MISCELLANEOUS

12.1 FEI Brand

The FEI logo being a registered trademark we ask that while preparing publications for the competition (programmes, flyers, etc.) the OC strictly follows the FEI Brand Guidelines whenever using the FEI Logo, which you will find on the FEI website under:

12.2 General

The FEI World Jumping Challenge must be organised strictly according to FEI General Rules & Regulations, 23rd edition, FEI Rules for Jumping Events, 25th Edition, updates effective 1 January 2017, the 2017 FEI World Jumping Challenge Rules and the Guidelines for Course Builder.

The FEI is entitled to make reasonable amendments to the present rules.

It is the responsibility of the NFs to make sure that the athletes and horses take part in the appropriate Category according to their age and experience.
