RULES GOVERNING NATIONAL EQUESTRIAN CHAMPIONSHIP TENT PEGGING: 2021

Article 401

CATEGORIES

1. **Events:-** will include the nine (09) Competition in the National Equestrian Championship listed below:-

(a)	Individual	-	Lance Tent Pegging
(b)	Pair	-	Lance Tent Pegging

 2. **Layout of Course Plan.**

(a)	Course Length	-	Max 200 mtr - Min 120 mtr
(b)	Course Width	-	Max 25 mtr - Min 20 mtr
(c)	Barrier height	-	Min 1.5 mtr
(d)	Barrier width	-	Max 20 mtr/ equal to width of the track

 3. All Tent Pegging Events in India shall be governed by ITPF rules 01 Apr 2023 as amended from Time to Time. Various categories of events will be clubbed together for individual & team events for the National Tent Pegging.
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- ### **Article 402**
- A. INDIVIDUAL LANCE**
1. This is an individual competition using a lance.
 2. Athletes ride on the track that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
 3. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete for that run.
 4. Time:
 - 4.1. The time permitted is 6.4 seconds.
 - 4.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 4.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
 5. The number of runs is two (2).
 - 5.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
 - 5.2. Run 2: 4cm peg.

6. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
7. The carry distance for the peg is ten (10) meters.
8. The peg is seventy (70) meters from the start line.

Article 403

A. PAIR LANCE

1. This is a pair competition consisting of two (2) athletes using lances, riding abreast.
2. Athletes ride on the track that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
3. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete/s for that run.
4. Time:
 - 4.1. The time permitted is 7 seconds.
 - 4.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 4.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
5. The number of runs is two (2).
 - 5.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
 - 5.2. Run 2 : 4cm peg.
6. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
7. The carry distance for the pegs is ten (10) meters.
8. The pegs are seventy (70) meters from the start line.

Article 404

B. TEAM LANCE

1. This is a team competition consisting of four (4) athletes using lances, riding abreast.
2. Athletes ride on the track that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
3. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete/s for that run.
4. Time:
 - 4.1. The time permitted is 7 seconds.
 - 4.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 4.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
5. The number of runs is three (3).

- 5.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
- 5.2. Run 2: 6cm peg.
- 5.3. Run 3: 4cm peg.
6. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
7. The carry distance for the pegs is ten (10) meters.
8. The pegs are seventy (70) meters from the start line.

Article 405

D. INDIVIDUAL SWORD

1. This is an individual competition using a sword.
2. Athletes ride on the track that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
3. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete for that run.
4. Time:
 - 4.1. The time permitted is 6.4 seconds.
 - 4.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 4.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
5. The number of runs is two (2).
 - 5.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
 - 5.2. Run 2: 4cm peg.
6. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
7. The carry distance for the peg is ten (10) meters.
8. The peg is seventy (70) meters from the start line.

Article 406

PAIR SWORD

1. This is a pairs competition consisting of two (2) athletes using swords, riding abreast.
2. Athletes ride on the track that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
3. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete/s for that run.
4. Time:
 - 4.1. The time permitted is 7 seconds.
 - 4.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 4.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.

5. The number of runs is two (2).
- 5.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
- 5.2. Run 2: 4cm peg.
6. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
7. The carry distance for the pegs is ten (10) meters.
8. The pegs are seventy (70) meters from the start line.

Article 407

TEAM SWORD

9. This is a team competition consisting of four (4) athletes using swords, riding abreast.
10. Athletes ride on the track that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
11. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete/s for that run.
12. Time:
 - 12.1. The time permitted is 7 seconds.
 - 12.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 12.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
13. The number of runs is three (3).
 - 13.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
 - 13.2. Run 2: 6cm peg.
 - 13.3. Run 3: 4cm peg.
14. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
15. The carry distance for the peg is ten (10) meters.
16. The pegs are seventy (70) meters from the start line.

Article 408

RELAY LANCE AND SWORD

17. The relay competition consists of four (4) athletes using lances or swords riding behind each other.
18. Athletes ride on one track in the order that their manager and/or coach entered them into.
19. If an athlete takes the incorrect peg, no score will be awarded to the specific athlete/s for that run.
20. Time:
 - 20.1. The time permitted is 10 Seconds.
 - 20.2. The time starts seventy (70) meters before the first peg.
 - 20.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the first peg.

21. The number of runs is two (2).
 - 21.1. The first run will be with a lance on a 4cm peg.
 - 21.2. The second run will be with a sword on a 6cm peg.
22. The pegs are placed in a straight line in the peg-holes in the ground, one and a half (1.5) meters behind each other.
23. The pegs are marked with a number, 1, 2, 3 and 4, on top of the pegs.
24. The pegs are taken in the following order:
 - 24.1. No. 1 athlete takes the first peg,
 - 24.2. No. 2 athlete takes the second peg,
 - 24.3. No. 3 athlete takes the third peg and
 - 24.4. No. 4 athlete takes the fourth peg.
25. The athletes keep a distance of eleven (11) meters between two (2) horses.
26. The points are awarded as follow:
 - 26.1. No score will be awarded when an athlete carries the wrong peg.
 - 26.2. If an athlete's peg is knocked out of the ground by a previous athlete, and the correct athlete manages to score a strike on the peg, he will receive four (4) points, as for a draw,
 - 26.3. and six (6) points if he carries the peg more than ten (10) meters.
 - 26.4. When an athlete draws his/her peg and it falls against the peg of a following athlete and this athlete touches or carries both pegs, the athlete will receive points scored only on his/her peg.
 - 26.5. When an athlete has passed his/her peg, it becomes a "dead peg." If a following athlete strike, draws or carries it, there will be no penalty and no points scored on that peg.
27. The first peg is seventy (70) meters from the start line.
28. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
29. The carry distances for all the pegs are ten (10) meters.
 - 29.1. The carry distances for all the pegs are measured from the position in the peg-holes where the pegs were planted.

Article 409

A. RINGS AND PEG LANCE

1. This is an individual competition using a lance.
2. Time:
 - 2.1. The time permitted is 7 seconds.
 - 2.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 2.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
3. The number of runs is two (2).
 - 3.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.

- 3.2. Run 2: 4cm peg.
4. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
5. The carry distance for the peg is ten (10) meters.
6. The first ring is thirty-five (35) meters from the start line.
7. The second ring is fifty (50) meters from the start line.
8. The distance between the first ring and the second ring is fifteen (15) meters.
9. The peg is seventy (70) meters from the start line.
10. The size of the ring is 6cm internal diameter.
11. The height of the ring is 2.2 meters to the top of the ring.

Article 410

LEMONS AND PEG SWORD

1. This is an individual competition using a sword.
2. Time:
 - 2.1. The time permitted is 7 seconds.
 - 2.2. Time starts seventy (70) meters before the peg.
 - 2.3. Time stops ten (10) meters after the peg.
3. The number of runs is two (2).
 - 3.1. Run 1: 6cm peg.
 - 3.2. Run 2: 4cm peg.
4. The length of the Course is eighty (80) meters from the start line to the finish line.
5. The carry distance for the peg is ten (10) meters.
6. First Lemon is thirty-five (35) meters from the start line.
7. Second Lemon is fifty (50) meters from the start line.
8. The distance between the first lemon and the second lemon is fifteen (15) meters.
9. The peg is seventy (70) meters from the start line.
10. The height of the lemon is 2.2 meters to the top of the lemon.
11. Cut one:
 - 11.1. The first lemon, the sword is horizontally behind the shoulders,
 - 11.2. the hand in line with the shoulder at cheek height,

- 11.3.the elbow below the hand,
- 11.4.cut horizontally from the right to the left.

12. Cut two:

- 12.1.The second lemon, the sword is at the left shoulder,
- 13.2.the hand in line with the shoulder at cheek height,
- 13.3.with the elbow as high as the hand,
- 13.4.cut horizontally from the left to the right.

- 13. A downward cut at a lemon will not be permitted and **NO** points will be awarded.

Article 411

RESTRICTION/ ELIGIBILITY ON RIDERS

All riders of 16 yrs of age and above can participate in NEC Tent Pegging Championships. For Young riders & Juniors refer to JNEC Article-502 whereby junior/young riders participate without compromising their status for JNEC events. A rider can participate in individual events with more than one horse but not more than two horses however he has to nominate one horse for which he will get the rider point. He may be awarded medal for his second horse, in case a rider does not nominate a horse, his first horse will be taken as nominated horse. Team/Pair event cab give name reserve rider and horse in case of change is required if here or rider is unfit to rider.

Article 412

RESTRICTION ON HORSES

- 1. Horses participating in National Tent-Pegging Championships cannot participate in any other discipline in that show.
- 2. Horses below 5 yrs of age cannot participate in National Tent-pegging Championships.
- 3. The events should be so planned that in a day horses are not required to do more than 8 runs excluding additional run (in case of tie).
- 4. The horse must be sufficiently big and strong to carry the competitor. The ground jury with the help of the event vet commission will decide on this matter and their decision will be final.
- 5. The minimum height of a horse shall be 14.2 hands unshod. An allowance of 10mm (3/8inch)will be made for shoes. Horses are to be measured by Veterinary Commission of the Organizing Committee prior to the commencement of the competition on the request of the Judge or his deputy or complaint by a team captain.

6. Official height measurement certificate issued by National Agricultural Associations, Pony Clubs, Breed Societies, the National Equestrian Federations will be accepted as proof of height. Jury can through Veterinary Officer can measure the height of the Horse if required by jury for asserting the height of Horse. That will be final and endorsed on passport by Veterinary Officer.

7. In case the horse develops any veterinary problem through the competition after the elimination stage, the rider would have the choice of using spare horse. However, that horse should not have been used by another rider in the same event in any discipline. The spare horse would have to be declared in the entry form and all veterinary regulations and checks will have to be followed for the said spare horse.

Article 413

SPECIFICATIONS OF EQUIPMENTS

1. **LANCE**:- The length of lance shall be as per ITPF specifications. Grips are permitted. Lances can be of any material. Minimum 2.2m (7ft 2 inch), Maximum 2.75m (9ft).

2. **SWORD**:- The sword shall be as per ITPF specifications. Blades on hilt, slings or barbs not allowed. Minimum 81cm (2ft 8inch), Maximum 90cm (2ft 11.5 cm) in blade length overall not exceeding 110cm.

3. **WOODEN PEGS**:- The dimensions of wooden pegs are 30 cm long, 2.5 cm thick but the width will vary from 6 cm/4 cm/2.5 cm depending on the stage of competition. Standard Pegs shall be provided by EFI for National and International events. The cost of Pegs shall be borne by the OC conducting the event. Similar Pegs will be provided by EFI for all Trials to select National Team also. The Jury will make every effort to select pegs of uniform weight and size as much as possible from the pegs provided by the Organising Committee. However, this provision can't form a point for objection by the teams/competitors. (Notice 4cm Pegs will be 4cm X 4cm)

In order to prevent the pegs from splitting and breaking up, they should be bound with wire 2 cm from the top end and again 13 cm from the bottom point. The wooden pegs will be soaked in water before the competition to prevent them from splitting. The pegs should preferably be made of the wood of a date palm or any other fibrous material and should as far as possible equal in weight and should not break up when pierced by the lance/sword.

4. **CARD BOARD PEGS**:- Card Board Pegs used should be made of 2 layers of corrugated card board glued together with total thickness of 2.5 cm with corrugation running vertically. Sizes will be as specified for wooden pegs. The jury will make every effort to select pegs of uniform size as much as possible. This point however can't form point for objection by the teams/competitors. Color of card board pegs will be as per ground and jury direction.

Note:- Any other synthetic peg of same dimensions can be used provided above principles hold good.

Article 414

AWARD OF POINTS-PEGS

1. **6 Points**:- For wooden pegs carried all the way or falls forward / sideways beyond 15 meters. For cardboard pegs carried all the way or falls forward / sideways beyond 10m measured from the

point at which the peg was placed. In single file same principle holds good. Peg struck with point of lance or sword but breaks and part of it still in the ground, even if no part of it still attached to the weapon (If a peg is broken by a hit the decision of the ground jury will be final).

2. **4 Points**:- Peg removed from the ground, but not carried full distance as stipulated above.
3. **2 Points**:- Peg struck on face, but not removed from its position in the ground.

Note:- (a) **Peg must be struck on the face of the peg by the point of the weapon and must leave a mark on the peg (marks on the side of the pegs are not countable). Doubtful pegs must be handed over to the jury).** If a peg breaks on impact into two pegs 6marks will be awarded by Peg breaks only on one side of the point of impact 4 marks will be awarded. If the Peg breaks on both sides of the point impact with a near centre hit, 6 marks will be awarded. Pegs will not be shaken while judging to avoid expansion of the cut.

(b) Decision of the jury is final.

4. **RINGS & PEG**

Rings carried on lance – 6 each
Carry Peg- 6, Draw of peg – 4
Strike of peg – 2

5. **LEMONS & PEG**

Horizontal slice or cut on lemon– Must be clear and distinct slice and caused due to use of sword - 6 each
Carry Peg - 6, Draw of peg - 4
Strike of peg - 2

Article 415

SADDLERY

1. Saddlery in good condition and of any type may be used. The stirrups or stirrup leather may not be attached to any other part of the horse or saddlery.
2. Running reins and dropped nose bands are permitted. Martingales are optional.

Article 416

SAFETY EQUIPMENT

Crash Helmets/headgear or hard Top Hat must be worn in all Tent Pegging Competitions, with the exception of service personnel. Service personnel must wear appropriate authorized helmet. As per new rules of ITPF, pagri will be worn on helmet for International events.

Article 417

DRESS

T-Shirts are allowed for civilian competitors. Service personnel must wear appropriate

uniform/T shirts of their respective team only. Changes to this if any can be made with the permission of the President of the Ground Jury in case of exceptional circumstances.

Article 418

BITS:- The following bits are permitted:-

- (a) Pelham
- (b) Double
- (c) Snaffle
- (d) Gags

Article 419

NATIONAL EQUESTRIAN TENT PEGGING CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS & MEDALS

National Tent Pegging will be conducted keeping in view of clubbing of numbers of categories of events by ITPF at International level/World Cup and to give equal opportunity to Individual Indian Tent Pegging riders who are not part of any team to participate at National Level. The National events after clubbing will be held as under:-

1. Individual Events.

(a) Lance

(i)	Individual Lance	-	2 Runs	Max 12 Points
(ii)	Pair Lance	-	2 Runs	Max 12 Points (no Indl score time penalty will count)
(iii)	Individual Lance-Ring & Peg	-	2 Runs	<u>Max 36 Points</u> <u>Max 60 Points</u>

(Note:- Total score of 5 runs to be counted in case of tie ride out one run on 2.5cm peg with Lance. Min score of 32 Points for National Medal)

(b) Sword

(i)	Individual Lance	-	2 Runs	Max 12 Points
(ii)	Pair Lance	-	2 Runs	Max 12 Points (no Indl score time penalty will count)
(iii)	Individual Lance-Ring & Peg	-	2 Runs	<u>Max 36 Points</u> <u>Max 60 Points</u>

(Note:- Total score of 5 runs to be counted in case of tie ride out one run on 2.5cm peg with Sword. Min score of 32 Points for National Medal)

(c) Best Individuals (Sword & Lance).

(i)	Total Score of Sword Event	-	60 Points
(ii)	Total Score of Lance Event	-	<u>60 Points</u> <u>120 Points</u>

(Note:- Min score of 80 Points for National Medal. In case of tie ride out one run on 2.5cm peg with lance)

2. **Team Events (Comprising of 4 Riders).**

(a) **Lance**

(i)	Team Lance	-	3 Runs	72 Points
(ii)	Indian File	-	1 Runs	24 Points
(iii)	Pair (2 teams of 2 Riders)	-	1 Run	<u>24 Points</u> <u>120 Points</u>

(Note:- Total score of 5 runs to be counted in case of tie ride out one run on 2.5cm peg with Lance. Min score of 80 Points for National Medal.

(b) **Sword**

(i)	Team Sword	-	3 Runs	72 Points
(ii)	Indian File	-	1 Runs	24 Points
(iii)	Pair (2teams of 2 Riders)	-	1 Run	<u>24 Points</u> <u>120 Points</u>

(Note:- Total score of 5 runs to be counted in case of tie ride out one run on 2.5cm peg with Sword. Min score of 80 Points for National Medal)

(c) **Best Teams (Sword and Lance)**

(i)	Lance Team Score	-	5 Runs	120 Points
(ii)	Sword Team Score	-	5 Runs	<u>120 Points</u> <u>240 Points</u>

(Note:- Min score of 180 Points for National Medal. In case of tie ride out one run on 2.5cm peg with Lance)

(d) Best riders points in all 9 events for 1st, 2nd, 3rd places for medals at NEC

6. **Guidelines for Medals.** Minimum standard is required for award of medals for the National Equestrian Championship as mentioned above.

Article 420

LAYOUT OF PEGS

The pegs are driven into the ground at an angle of 60 degrees from horizontal, with exactly 17 cm of the peg showing above the ground level. The face of the peg must be painted white or sprinkled with pure white chalk/lime. For safety purposes peg hole with dimension length 750mm x width 300mm x depth 300mm must be loosened and dug and filled with sand. The peg must be placed at the centre of the hole.

Article 421

1. Electronic Timers are mandatory for conduct of NEC. However, a backup of two timers will be kept in case of failure of electronic timer the average of the two backup timers will be taken. Electric timers must be catered for all REL as well to avoid any time disputes.

2. **Time Penalty Ready Reckoners**:- Ready reckoners for time penalties at various speeds for all the events are attached at **Appendix 'A', Appendix 'B' & Appendix 'C'**.

(In view of Tent Pegging now being a part of FEI recognized Regional discipline, these rules have been revised to meet the FEI guidelines and to include other International events as practiced in other Tent Pegging countries).

3. In case of fall of a rider a medical check is required for his fitness to continue participation and injury will be recorded. This will be final. Also for horse by veterinary officer.

Note:-

1. For selection of Indian Team, rider points secured as mentioned above in the National Tent Pegging Championship will be taken into account for selection of probables who will undergo a selection trial on borrowed horses for final selection of team. All probable will get their own horses for final selection trial.

2. In addition to above probables based on Rider Points, all Tent Peggers securing First 3 positions in Lance (Individual), Sword (Individual) Best Individuals (Lance & Sword) first three riders and also with best score in all nine(09) events will also be shortlisted in addition to the probables selected based on riders points.

3. Selection trials will be conducted as per schedule attached at Appendix 'D'.

Article 423

FEI Rules will be referred for welfare of horses and athletes and ITPF Rules for safety requirements and cruelty to animals apply.

Article 424

RULES GOVERNING ALL EVENTS – GENERAL

1. Electronic Timers are mandatory to hold any event under the aegis of EFI including two backup timers.
2. An independent Jury as per EFI empanelled officials comprising of the following is mandatory for all NEC events:-

(a)	President Ground Jury	-	1
(b)	Lane Judges	-	4 (One per Track/Lane)
(c)	Scorer	-	1
(d)	Timers at Finish (Manual)	-	2 timers with watch
(e)	Marshalls / Stewards	-	4 (1 for Start, 1 for Collecting ring, 2 for practice area/ exercise)
(f)	Track and Track party	-	6

3. The rider shall start his run from a start box and finish his run in the finish box which should be duly marked and fenced. Score shall be announced only after the rider reports physically crosses the finish box.
4. During NEC **NO** member of Jury shall be from the org conducting the event to ensure transparency and independence of Judgment including Timing.
5. **Tie**. In case more than one riders are tied for any of the first three places the tie shall be resolved as per Tie rules i.e a run on 2.5cm peg.
6. It shall be mandatory to have min 4 teams for Team events during NEC and any EFI approved event. Each team will consist of 4 riders.
7. **Video Recording**. If possible video recording of all the events of Tent Pegging should be done to be viewed in case of an appeal/dispute. No video recorded time will be accepted in appeal other than official timer in use (Decision of jury will be final). It is mandatory that Lemon & Peg, Ring & Peg event is video recorded.
8. **Finish Barricade**. To be placed as per ITPF rules i.e maximum 20 mtrs or the barrier must be the same size as the width at the course. A opening at the end to be placed for exit of the horses.

Diagram No. 1: Course Layout Plan for Team / Pair / Individual

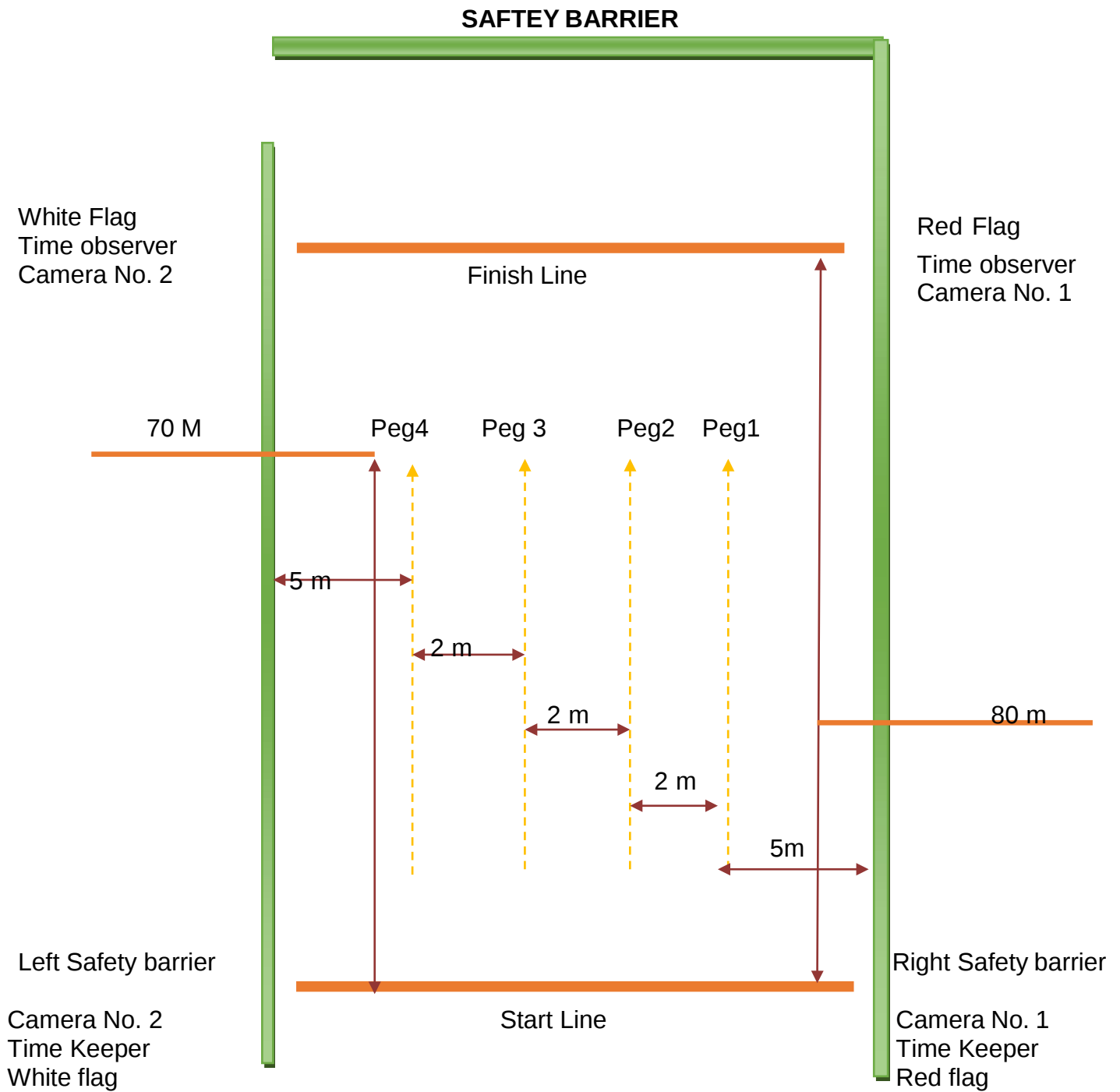


Diagram No. 2: Design for The Height of Lemons and Rings/Peg

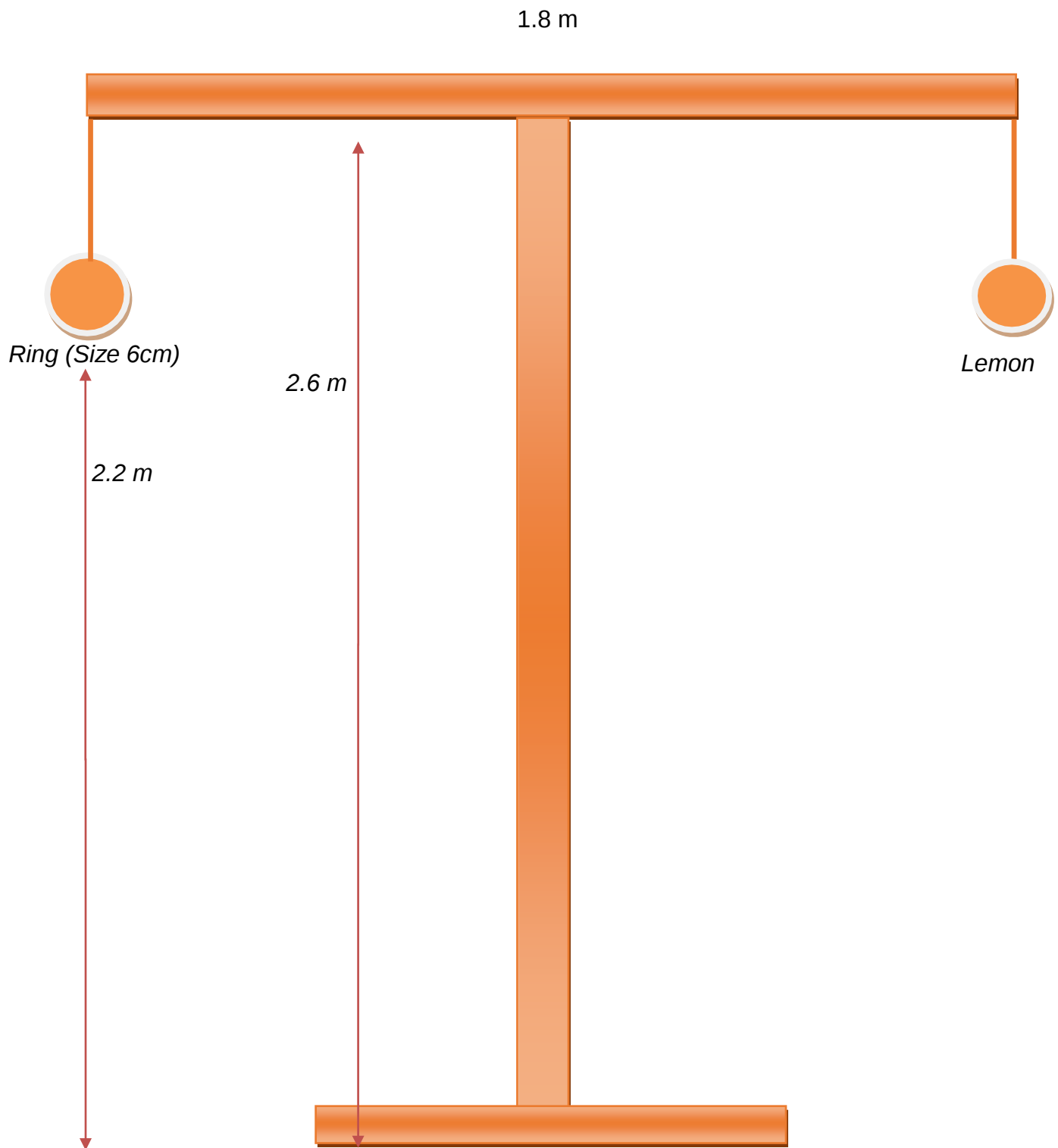


Diagram No. 3: Course Layout Plan for Rings and Peg and lemonsand Peg

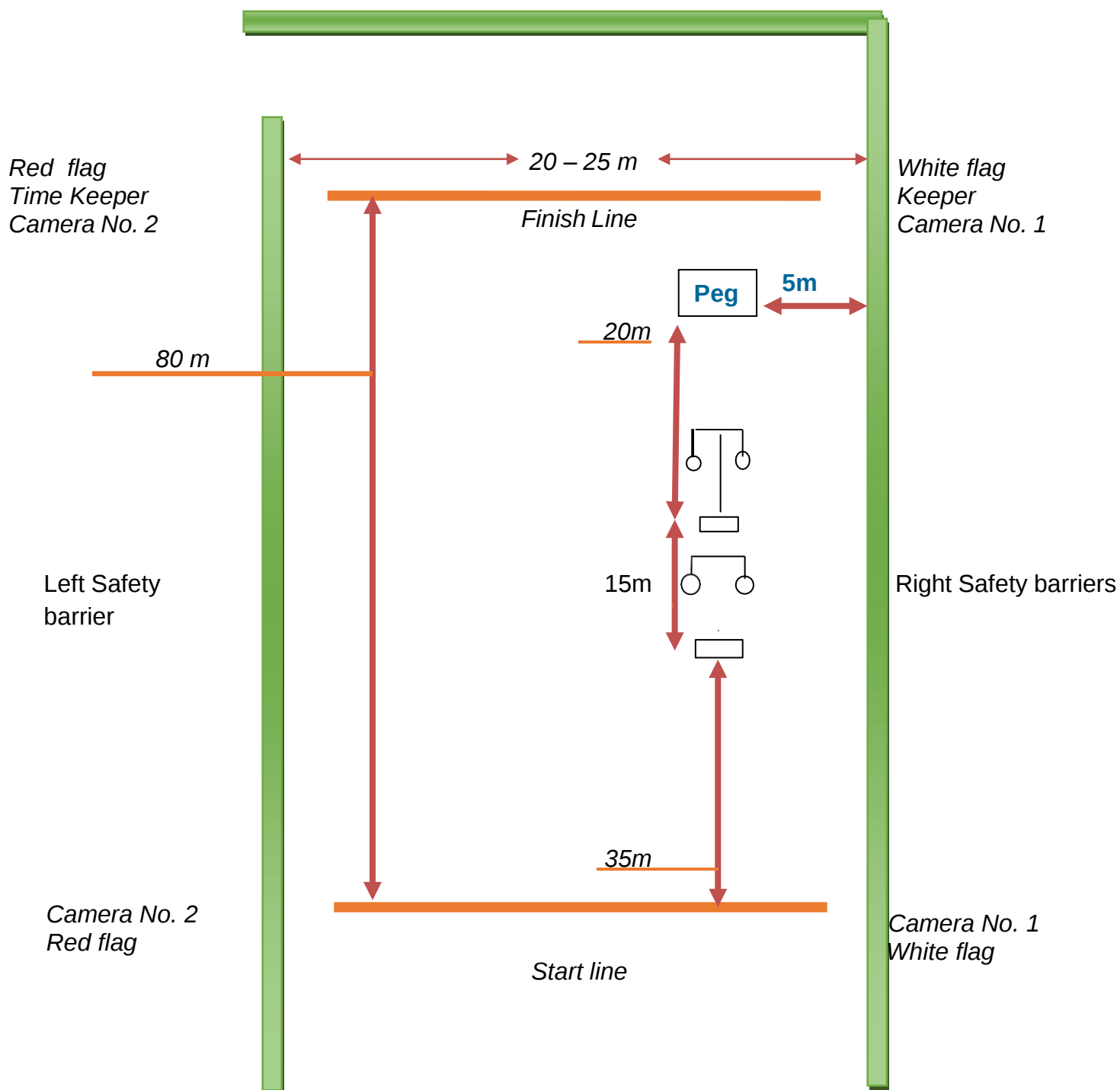
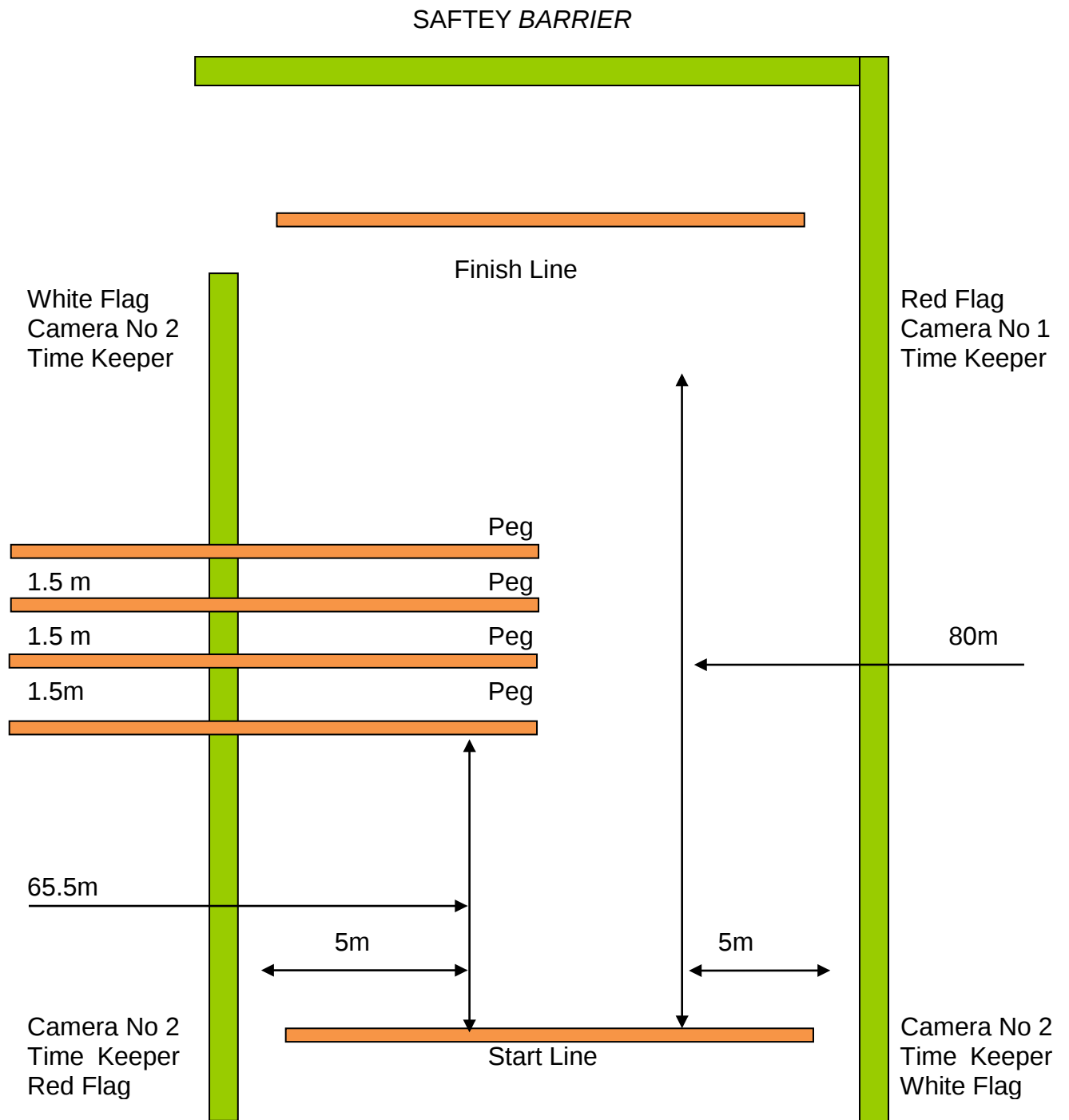


Diagram No.4: Course Layout Plan for Relay
