Sub: Minutes of the Meeting with National Sports Federations held on 14th June 2016 at Office of the Secretary (Sports), 1st Floor, NDTL Building, New Delhi

Secretary (Sports) chaired the meeting.

The Chairman expressed concern about the NSF's those who haven't attended the meeting especially from the core/Rio participating sports disciplines. The representatives of 16 National Sports Federations (NSF's) attended the meeting. It was emphasized that MYAS and NADA are committed to promote clean sports, fair play and there will be zero tolerance to doping in sports.

The key issues pertaining to the anti-doping program and the education and awareness campaign were discussed in detail with the representatives of the federations. WADA has made significant changes in the Code 2015, with a four-year ban for doping under aggravating circumstances, increased role of investigations, applicability of role of proportionality and human rights, smart testing plan based on risk analysis, investigation of support personnel including coaches and trainers etc. These changes need to be kept in mind by all stakeholders and should support so that NADA become fully compliant with WADA code and guidelines.

Based on the discussions and inputs from federations, following action points were agreed upon:

National Sports Federations:

- 1) The concerned NSF's shall submit the whereabouts information of all athletes qualified for the Rio Olympics 2016. The NSF's shall coordinate with the athletes, those who are training in abroad to submit whereabouts information and the information should be updated in the ADAMS at the earliest.
- 2) All identified athletes under the Registered Testing Pool (RTP) of NADA should submit/update their whereabouts details immediately. The concerned NSF's should instruct their athletes to update the same.
- 3) The annual performance rating/ranking of the athletes of each sport disciplines may be shared with NADA by the concerned NSF's.

- 4) The NSF's should advise their athletes to cooperate with the NADA officials during the dope sample collection.
- 5) All the NSF's should carry out a mandatory anti-doping awareness program for the athletes/athletes support personnel, who are participating in Rio Olympics 2016. The concerned NSF's may suggest a date for the anti-doping awareness program.
- 6) All NSFs shall conduct anti-doping awareness program in the state headquarters through their state federations/state Olympic association for athletes and athletes support personnel.

Sports Authority of India (SAI):

- 7) The SAI shall send the ACTC information of all sporting disciplines. In case of any change/update of information in the calendar shall be done through the NSF's.

National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA):

- 8) The information on prohibited substances/methods will be sent to all NSF's, SGFI and AIU by NADA and the same will be updated in the NADA website.
- 9) The list of prescription medicines/OTC medicines will be sent to the NSF's by NADA in the next two weeks.
- 10) The information on brand name of prohibited substances will be sent to the NSFs and the same will be updated in the NADA website.
- 11) All information on the anti-doping awareness will be sent through email by NADA.
- 12) The list of potentially dangerous supplements will be provided to all NSFs in the next 15 days.
- 13) NADA may communicate to all states sports secretaries for conducting anti-doping awareness program in their states.
- 14) With regard to the status of supplements, a D.O letter will be sent to FSSAI from Secretary (Sports) flagging issues with regard to the quality of supplements.

School Games Federation of India and Association of Indian Universities:

- 15) The annual event calendar of SGFI and AIU shall be sent to NADA for the dope sample collection and anti-doping awareness campaign during the events.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
