TENT PEGGING: 2013

Article 401

- **EVENTS**
 1. Normal
 - (a) NEC Individual Tent Pegging-Lance
 - (b) NEC Team Tent Pegging- Lance
 - (c) All India Sword- Individual
 - (d) All India Sword- Team
 2. **Special**
 - (a) All India Lance and Sword –Paired
 - (b) All India Indian File (Lance or sword)
 - (c) All India Rings & Pegs- Lance
 - (d) All India Lemon & Pegs- Sword

Article 402

- **INDIVIDUAL TENT PEGGING -LANCE**

This is an individual competition with following stipulations

 1. **Speed:** 800 mts per minute.
 2. **Number of Rounds: Two**
 3. **Number of Runs:** Three, The first round will be 2 runs on 6 cm pegs and 3rd run on 4 cm pegs. In second round the first run will be 6 cm peg and in 2nd & 3rd run on a 4 cm pegs.
 4. **Placing:** Highest scorer in both rounds will be placed first and the next best score will be placed next and so on.

Article 401

- **EVENTS**
 1. **Normal**
 - (a) NEC Tent Pegging-Lance (Individual)
 - (b) NEC Tent Pegging- Lance (Team)
 - (c) NEC Tent Pegging- Sword (Individual)
 - (d) NEC Tent Pegging- Sword (Team)
 2. **Special**
 - (a) NEC Paired Tent Pegging (Lance & Sword)
 - (b) NEC Indian File (Lance & sword)
 - (c) NEC Rings & Peg- Lance
 - (d) NEC Lemons & Peg- Sword

Article 402

- **INDIVIDUAL TENT PEGGING -LANCE**

This is an individual competition with following stipulations

 1. **Speed:** 800 mts per minute (Time allowed is 7.5 secs for 100m course.
 2. **Number of Rounds: Two**
 3. **Number of Runs:** Three per round, the first round will have 2 runs on 6 cm pegs and 3rd run on 4 cm pegs. In second round the first run will be on 6 cm peg and 2nd & 3rd runs will be on 4 cm pegs.
 4. **Placing:** Highest scorer in both rounds will be placed first and the next best score will be placed next and so on.

- 5. **Tie:** Incase of tie for first position, all such competitors will be given a maximum of one additional run on 3 cm pegs. If a tie still exists, then the rider with fastest time will be the winner. Incase no rider scores any point and tie still persists, the combined total time taken by riders on 4 cm pegs in the second round will decide the placing. The placing of other riders not involved in a tie will be placed on combined total time on 4 cm pegs in second.
- 6. **Length of Course:** 100 meters (Start to Finish line).
- 7. **Carry Distance:** 10 meters for Card Board pegs.
- 8. **First Peg:** 70 meters from start line.

Article 403

- TEAM TENT PEGGING – LANCE**

This is team Competition starting with riders

- 1. **Speed:** 800 mts per minute
- 2. **Number of Rounds:** Two
- 3. **Number of Runs:** First round will be 2 runs on 6 cm pegs and the 3rd run 4 cm peg. Second round will be on (first run) on 6 cm peg and 2nd & 3rd run on 4 cm pegs.
- 5. Points scored by all four riders will count.
- 6. **Leangth of Course:** 1000 meters (Start to Finish Line).
- 7. **Carry Distance.** 10 meters for Card Board Peg.
- 8. **First Peg :** 70 meters from Start Line.

Article 404

- SWORD- INDIVIUAL**

This an individual competition and rules laid down for lance individual will apply, except the speed will be reduced to 750 meters per min. Thus time allowed over a 100 meter course will be 8 seconds. There after time penalties apply.

- 5. **Tie:** To avoid undue stress on tent pegging horses, there should be only one additional run on a 2.5 cm peg. Then the classification will be according to the time. If we still have a tie, then the classification will be according to the time of the last run, and if a tie persists, then the time of the run prior to that will be used to determine the winner / positions
- 6. **Length of Course:** 100 meters (Start to Finish line).
- 7. **Carry Distance:** 10 meters for Card Board pegs and 15 meters for wooden pegs.
- 8. **First Peg:** 70 meters from start line.

Article 403

- TEAM TENT PEGGING – LANCE**

This is team Competition starting with 04 (four) riders

- 1. **Speed:** 750 mts per minute (Time allowed is 8.0 sec for 100 m course).
- 2. **Number of Rounds:** Two
- 3. **Number of Runs:** First round will have 2 runs on 6 cm pegs and the 3rd run on 4 cm peg. Second round will have first run on 6 cm peg and 2nd & 3rd runs & on 4 cm pegs.
- 4. Points scored by all four riders will count.
- 5. **Leangth of Course:** 100 meters (Start to Finish Line).
- 6. **Carry Distance.** 10 meters for Card Board Peg and 15 meters for wooden pegs.
- 7. **First Peg :** 70 meters from Start Line.

Article 404

- INDIVIUAL TENT PEGGING - SWORD**

This is an individual competition and rules laid down for lance (individual) will apply with the same speed. Thus time allowed over a 100 meter course will be 7.5 seconds. Thereafter time penalties apply.

Article 405

- **SWORD- TEAM**

This is team competition consisting of 4 riders and rules laid down for lance team will apply, except the speed will be reduced to 750 meters per minute.

Article 406

- **LANCE AND SWORD- PAIRED (HALF SECTION)**

This is paried competition consisting 2 riders, riding abreast and conducted as per following rules:-

1. **Speed:** 750 mts per minute.
2. **Number of Rounds:** One round of 2 runs on 6 cm pegs. Same procedure adopted in second round.
3. **Placing:** The team with maximum points will be placed winner. The next best score second and so on.
4. **Tie:** Incase of tie for first position, one additional run on 3 cm pegs will be given. If a tie persists, the fastest time will decide placing. For other positions, fastest time of 6 cm pegs in previous run will decide the winner.
5. **Lenght of Course:** 100 meters (Start to Finish line).

Article 407

- **INDIAN FILE (LANCE AND SWORD)**

Pegs are embedded in line, one behind the other, 1 meter apart. Competitors must take pegs in the correct order. No 1 rider should take first peg, No 2 riders takes second peg, No 3 rider third peg and No 4 ride fourth peg.

1. **Speed:** 750 meters per minute **between time start and time stop line.**
2. **Time Allowed:** While computing time allowed for Indian File allowance must be catered for the distance between pegs (i.e. 1 meter between each peg)and distance required to be maintained between 2 horses (i.e. 11 meters). Thus the time allowed for Card Board pegs is 7 seconds

Article 405

- **TEAM TENT PEGGING - SWORD**

This is team competition consisting of 4 riders and rules laid down for lance (team) will apply and the speed shall be 750 meters per minute **(Time allowed is 8.0 sec for 100m course).**

Article 406

- **PAIRED TENT PEGGING (LANCE & SWORD)**

This is a paired competition consisting of 2 riders riding abreast and conducted as per following rules:-

1. **Speed:** 750 mts per minute **(Time allowed is 8.0 Sec for 100m course).**
2. **Number of Rounds:** One round of 2 runs. **The first run will be on 6 cm pegs and the second run shall be on 4 Cm pegs**
3. **Placing:** The team with maximum points will be placed winner. The next best score second and so on.
4. **Length of Course:** 100 meters (Start to Finish line).

Article 407

- **INDIAN FILE (LANCE AND SWORD)**

The competition is run over two runs. In the first run all competitors carry lances and in the second run all competitors will carry swords. The total team score of both runs minus time penalties if any would decide the team positions. Each competitor will attempt the peg as per the serial number in the orders of start of the team. Carry of a wrong peg will not qualify the competitor for any score.

1. **Speed:** 750 meters per minute.
2. **Time Allowed:** While computing time allowed for Indian File allowance must be catered for the distance between pegs (i.e. 1 meter between each peg)and distance required to be maintained between 2 horses (i.e. 11 meters). Thus the time allowed for Card Board pegs is 11 seconds

3. **Rider positions:** If a rider’s peg is knocked out of the ground by a previous rider, and the correct rider manages to score a strike on the peg, he will receive 4 points, as for a draw and 6 points if he carried fully. When a rider draws his peg and it falls against the peg of a following rider and this rider touches or carried both pegs, he will receive points on his peg alone.

Article 408

• RING AND PEGS- LANCE

Equipment consists of two gallows with “T” crossbar 2.6 meters height from ground level with a horizontal cross bar of 1.8 meters extending 0.9 meters on either side of vertical having a vertical hanging a strap (light materials) to the ring holder. The ring (6 cm inside measurement) is suspended at a height of 2.130 meters from the ground. The gallows are 15 meters apart, and a peg 20 peg meters beyond 2nd gallow and in line. Speed 750 meters per minute.

Article 409

• LEMONS AND PEG -SWORD

1. The course set up as Rings and Peg. Instead of Rings, Lemons and Peg in a line will be positioned. Speed 750 meters per minute.
2. **SLICE ONE:** With the sword resting horizontally behind the shoulders, hand in line with shoulder at check height, elbow hand, cut horizontally from rear to front.
3. **SLICE TWO:** With sword at left shoulder, cut horizontally from front to rear, at neck height with elbow as high as hand. A downward cut or “Push” at lemon will not be allowed and no points awarded.

3. **Competitor positions:** If a competitor’s peg is knocked out of the ground by a previous rider, and the correct rider manages to score a strike on the peg, he will receive 4 points as for a draw and 6 points if he carried fully.

4. When a competitor draws his peg and it falls against the peg of a following competitor and this rider touches or carries both pegs, he will receive points on his peg alone.

5. No 1 peg will be opposite the peg marked.

6. No 1 rider takes the first peg; No 2 rider takes the second peg, and so on.

7. When a rider has passed his peg, it becomes a “dead peg”. If a following rider strikes it, there will be no penalty and no points are scored for that peg.

Article 408

• RINGS AND PEG- LANCE

Equipment consists of two gallows with “T” crossbar 2.6 meters high from ground level with a horizontal cross bar of 1.8 meters extending 0.9 meters on either side of vertical having a vertical hanging strap (light materials) to the ring holder. The ring (6 cm inside measurement) is suspended at a height of 2.130 meters from the ground. The gallows are 15 meters apart, and a peg 20 meters beyond 2nd gallow and in line. Speed 750 meters per minute. (Time allowed is 8 secs for 100 m course)

Article 409

• LEMONS AND PEG -SWORD

1. The course set up as for Rings and Peg. Instead of Rings, Lemons and Peg in a line will be positioned. Speed 750 meters per minute (Time allowed is 8 secs for 100 m courses)
2. **SLICE ONE:** With the sword resting horizontally behind the shoulders, hand in line with shoulder at check height, elbow below hand, cut horizontally from rear to front.
3. **SLICE TWO:** With sword at left shoulder, cut horizontally from front to rear, at neck height with elbow as high as hand.

Note:- A downward cut or “Push” at lemon will not be allowed and no points shall be awarded for the same.

Article 410

- RESTRICTION/ ELEGIBILITY ON RIDERS**

All riders of 21 yrs of age and above can participate in NEC Tent Pegging Championships. For Young riders & Juniors refer to JNEC Article-502.

Article 411

- RESTRICTION ON HORSES**

- Horses participating in National Tent-Peggin Championships cannot participate in any other discipline.
- Horses below 5 yrs of age cannot participate in National Tent-pegging Championships.
- The events should be so planned that in a day horse are not required todo more than 8 runs excluding additional runs in case of tie.
- The minimum height shal be 14.2 hands unshod. An allowances of 10mm (3/8inch) will be made for shoes. Horses are to be measured by Veterinary Commission of the Organising Committee prior to the commencement of the competition on the request of the Judge or his deputy or complaint by a team captain.
- Official height measurement certificate issued by National Agricultural Associations, Pony Clubs, Breed Societies, the National Equestrian Federations will be accepted as proof of height.

Article 412

- SPECIFICATIONS OF EQUIPMENTS**

- LANCE:** The lance shall not be shorter than 2.5 meters (8 feet 2 inch) and shall not exceed 2.75 meters (9 feet) with a smooth metal point without serration or sharp edges. Grips are permitted. Lances can be of any material

Article 410

- RESTRICTION/ ELIGIBILITY ON RIDERS**

All riders of 16 yrs of age and above can participate in NEC Tent Pegging Championships. For Young riders & Juniors refer to JNEC Article-502 whereby junior/young riders participate without compromising their status for JNEC events.

Article 411

- RESTRICTION ON HORSES**

- Horses participating in National Tent-Pegging Championships cannot participate in any other discipline in that show.
- Horses below 5 yrs of age cannot participate in National Tent-pegging Championships.
- The events should be so planned that in a day horses are not required to do more than 8 runs excluding additional runs (in case of tie).
- The minimum height of a horse shall be 14.2 hands unshod. An allowance of 10mm (3/8inch)will be made for shoes. Horses are to be measured by Veterinary Commission of the Organising Committee prior to the commencement of the competition on the request of the Judge or his deputy or complaint by a team captain.
- Official height measurement certificate issued by National Agricultural Associations, Pony Clubs, Breed Societies, the National Equestrian Federations will be accepted as proof of height.

Article 412

- SPECIFICATIONS OF EQUIPMENTS**

- LANCE:** The lance shall not be shorter than 2.5 meters (8 feet 2 inch) and shall not exceed 2.75 meters (9 feet) with a smooth metal point without serrated or sharp edges. Grips are permitted. Lances can be of any material

2. SWORD: The sword shall not be shorter than (2 feet 8 inch) & shall not exceed 90cm (2 feet 11.5 inch) in blade length, with an overall length, not exceeding 110 cm. Blades on hilt, slings or barbs not allowed. • CARD BOARD PEGS: 1. Card Board Pegs can be used and should be made of 2 layers of corrugated card board glued together with total thickness of 2.5 cm with corrugation running vertically. Sizes will be as specified for wooden pegs. 2. Any other synthetic peg of same dimensions can be used provided above principles hold good. Article 413 • AWARD OF POINTS-PEGS Carry 6 Points : Peg carried/fall beyond 10 meters (in case of Card Board Pegs) measured from the point at which the peg was placed. In single file same principle hold good. Draw 4 Points : Peg removed from the ground, but not carried full distance as stipulated above. Strike 2 Points: Peg struck on face, but not removed from its position in the ground.	
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2. SWORD: The sword shall not be shorter than 81 cms (2 feet 8 inch) & shall not exceed 90cm (2 feet 11.5 inch) in blade length, with an overall length, not exceeding 110 cm. Blades on hilt, slings or barbs not allowed. 3. PEGS:- WOODEN PEGS Soft wood should be used for wooden pegs.The pegs shall be 30 cms long and 2.5 cms thick. The width shall be 6cms, 4cms,3cms and 2.5cms. To avoid splitting of pegs , the pegs shall be secured with a wire two inches from top and bottom. CARD BOARD PEGS: Card Board Pegs used should be made of 2 layers of corrugated card board glued together with total thickness of 2.5 cm with corrugation running vertically. Sizes will be as specified for wooden pegs. Note:- Any other synthetic peg of same dimensions can be used provided above principles hold good. Article 413 • AWARD OF POINTS-PEGS 6 Points: For wooden pegs carried all the way or falls forward / sideways beyond 15 meters. For cardboard pegs carried all the way or falls forward / sideways beyond 10m measured from the point at which the peg was placed. In single file same principle holds good. Peg struck with point of lance or sword but breaks and part of it still in the ground , even if no part of it still attached to the weapon. 4 Points: Peg removed from the ground, but not carried full distance as stipulated above. 2 Points: Peg struck on face, but not removed from its position in the ground. Note: Peg must be struck on the face of the peg by the point of the weapon and must leave a mark on the peg (marks on the side of the pegs are not countable). Doubtful pegs must be handed over to the jury.	
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- **RINGS & PEGS**

Rings carried on lance – 6 each

Carry Peg- 6 Draw- 4 Strike- 2

- **LEMON PEGS**

Horizontal slice or cut on lemon – 6 each.

Carry Peg- 6 Draw- 4 Strike- 2

Article 414

- **SADDLERY**

1. Saddlery in good condition and of any type may be used. The stirrups or stirrup leather may not be attached to any other part of the horse or saddlery.

2. Running reins and dropped nose bands are permitted. Martingales are optional.

Article 415

- **SAFETY EQUIPMENT**

Crash helmets or hard Top Hat must be worn in all Tent Pegging Competition, with the exception of service personal. Service personnel must wear appropriate authorised helmet.

Article 416

- **DRESS**

T-Shirts are allowed for civilian competitors only. Serving service personnel must wear appropriate uniform. Changes to this if any, can be made with the permission of the President of the Ground Jury in case of exceptional circumstances.

Article 417

- **RINGS & PEG**

Rings carried on lance – 6 each

Carry Peg- 6, Draw of peg – 4

Strike of peg – 2

- **LEMONS & PEG**

Horizontal slice or cut on lemon – Must be clear and distinct and caused due to use of sword - 6 each.

Carry Peg- 6

Draw of peg- 4

Strike of peg – 2

Article 414

- **SADDLERY**

1. Saddlery in good condition and of any type may be used. The stirrups or stirrup leather may not be attached to any other part of the horse or saddlery.

2. Running reins and dropped nose bands are permitted. Martingales are optional.

Article 415

- **SAFETY EQUIPMENT**

Crash helmets or hard Top Hat must be worn in all Tent Pegging Competitions, with the exception of service personal. Service personnel must wear appropriate authorised helmet.

Article 416

- **DRESS**

T-Shirts are allowed for civilian competitors only. Serving service personnel must wear appropriate uniform. Changes to this if any can be made with the permission of the President of the Ground Jury in case of exceptional circumstances.

Article 417

- **BITS**

The following bits are permitted:-

- a. Pelham
- b. Double
- c. Snaffle

Article 418

- **MINIMUM STANDARD GUIDELINES FOR MEDALS**

The National Federation may however from time to time may lay down minimum standard for entitlement awarding of medals in the National Equestrian Championships. These however will vary from year to year and must meet the approval of the executive committee. In absence, of any specific guidelines intimated well in advance, these restrictions will not apply. For the NEC these will have to be included in the prospectus. This has been incorporated to avoid awarding of medals to undeserving participants and in order to ensure that minimum standards are maintained in NEC.

Article 419

LAYOUT OF PEGS

The pegs are driven into the ground at an angle of 60 degrees from horizontal, with exactly 17 cm of the peg showing above the ground level. The face of the peg must be painted white or sprinkled with pure white chalk/lime.

Article 420 - 500

In view of tent- Pegging now being a part of FEI recognized Regional discipline, these rules have been revised to meet the FEI guidelines and to include other International events as practiced in other Tent- pegging countries.

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- **MINIMUM STANDARD GUIDELINES FOR MEDALS**

The National Federation may from time to time lay down minimum standards for awarding of medals in the National Equestrian Championships. These however will vary from year to year and must meet the approval of the executive committee. In absence, of any specific guidelines intimated well in advance, these restrictions will not apply. For the NEC these will have to be included in the prospectus. This has been incorporated to avoid awarding of medals to undeserving participants and in order to ensure that minimum standards are maintained in NEC.

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LAYOUT OF PEGS

The pegs are driven into the ground at an angle of 60 degrees from horizontal, with exactly 17 cm of the peg showing above the ground level. The face of the peg must be painted white or sprinkled with pure white chalk/lime.
